TODAY'S GAME

Last Saturday's tremendous goalscoring performance is already history and the only thing in the Tayport players' minds this afternoon is the job in hand - winning two league points.

Forfar Albion were promoted as runners-up last May but they have looked the most accomplished of the three promoted sides - certainly until they crashed at Whitburn in the OVD Cup three weeks ago. Prior to that result Albion had strung together an impressive run of five wins and a draw, results which saw them zoom up the table.

In the close season Albion not only recruited a new chairman in former Forfar Athletic supremo Gordon Webster, but made several astute signings to ensure that their step upstairs was to be no fleeting visit.

Since that OVD defeat things haven't gone too well for our visitors. A last minute goal cost them a point against Lochee United and then last week they were held to a draw by Jeanfield in the Taycar Trophy and lost the tie in a penalty shootout.

Manager Ian Simpson will see this as a fine opportunity to get his lads back on the rails. Tayport have shaken off most of the lingering short term injuries but there is no guarantee that there will be any changes from last week's line-up.

Only once this season have Albion failed to find their opponents' net on the road - at Whitburn - and the Tayport defence will be tested by a side which has averaged two goals per game on their travels.

SCOTTISH CUP ACTION ON THE CANNIEPAIRT NEXT WEEK

The home matches are coming thick and fast. Next Saturday's OVD tie will be our seventh home game in eight fixtures. Opponents are Lochgelly Albert and it promises to be a cracking tie with the Fife League side on a bit of a roll at present.

We've actually met Albert before, in a friendly match here on The Canniepairt in August 1992 when we ran out comfortable winners. However it will be only our second competitive match against a Fife League side (mind you, if Downfield had their way we'd be playing Fife League sides every week!), the previous occasion being a third round OVD tie against St Andrews United in 1990.

After that lengthy gap of five years, we've only a fortnight to wait for our next tilt at a Fife outfit - Newburgh are down here on the 25th for a Taycars Cup-tie which, incidentally, kicks off at 1.30pm.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS FORFAR ALBION

Today's visitors emerged 21 years ago from the amalgamation of Forfar East End and Forfar Celtic and Albion will, of course always feature in any history of Tayport FC, providing us with our first ever Junior opponents here on the Canniepairt.

Since then our respective fortunes have differed. Albion have been promoted on a couple of occasions in the past five years and on each occasion, they have made their mark in their first season after promotion.

The Guthrie Park side finished fourth top in 1993 before slipping out of the top division at the end of the following season.

Early season form suggests that they are again on target for a top half finish, a position from where they will be hoping to consolidate rather than fall away as they did on the last occasion.

Albion carry a 19 strong pool of players, several of whom have been around the Junior game for a while and will be familiar faces to 'Port fans. Others have been shrewdly selected from under-age and amateur football. It is these youngsters in which the Albion management have placed their faith and who have played their part in the club's impressive start to the season.

Kevin Taylor is an experienced last line of defence, counting Glenrothes, Newburgh and Carnoustie amongst his former clubs, but had to carry the can for losing the late goal which gave Lochee United the points two weeks back. Gangly Davie Scott always enjoyed his jousts with Tayport whilst with Forfar West End and, having been reinstated from Arbroath only last season, will bring his experience to bear in the Albion midfield.

Up front is one of the Region's most promising youngsters, Derek Guthrie, who is farmed out to the club from Forfar Athletic with whom he has already played in the first team. Others on delayed transfers to the Seniors are Gary Balfour (Arbroath) and Scott Reid (Brechtin City). Reid, in fact, is the team's top scorer this season.

Midfielder or forward Eddie Winks, who is in his first season at Guthrie Park, was with Forfar Athletic and another who has come down from the Seniors is central defender Scott Easton who was with Arbroath.

Four of the squad, including player/manager Ian Simpson, were formerly with Kirrie Thistle. The other three are new recruits this season, Jon Durie (midfield), John Mackie (defender) and sweeper Tam Gauld.

Recruited from the local amateur leagues were Neil Scott (Lowson United), the long serving Alfie Simpson (Letham LC), Craig Traill (Portcullis), Wayne Lawson (Letham LC), Scott Brewster (Sunday Football).

Versatile defender Kerr Byars is in his second season at Guthrie Park, having previously been with Carnoustie & Elmwood. Striker Mike Thomson arrived from neighbours West End while Clive Massie (ex-West End & Kinnoull) is another experienced front man. Barry Smith, not listed in the pool, but included in the team photo is a striker who played his football down south.

THE BAKER'S BIT

Good afternoon to the Port Support and a warm welcome to the players and officials of our A.T. & T. League opponents Forfar Albion.

I spoke last week about the amount of scoring opportunities which we were letting go by but wasn't over-worried by that fact because of the chances which we were creating. Well, it looks as though we managed to solve that problem last weekend. It was quite simple really. We just sent the manager away to watch our future opposition!

Of course we've got to be pleased with last week's 10-0 scoreline. I've stressed continually in the past the importance of killing the opposition off. I've always felt that there is a breaking point we should aim to trigger when your opposition - it may only be two or three players - take a mental decision to throw in the towel. We obviously reached that point at some stage last Saturday.

But, just as it's important to score goals, it's vital that you don't concede them and, when I look at our statistics for this season, they show that we've lost goals in only three games. Eleven of our fourteen games have been shutouts. As an opposition manager, that would worry me a great deal because when I'm looking at our opponents the first thing I ask myself is 'do they concede goals?' The Goals Against column tells you a great deal about an opposition.

Make no mistake about it, although we may be reasonably pleased with our progress to date, this is the time to get down and work harder at our game. Our players must take this on board. It's vital that we don't rest on our laurels but continue to get better.

I'm not talking about fitness. Anybody can get themselves fit. I'm talking about technical awareness, improving their individual game and organisational awareness. In other words we must never stop striving for improvement. If we can continue to raise our standards, coupled with showing respect for each other and, most importantly, respect for our opposition, then we'll do all right.

Forfar Albion come here on the back of three reversals. We can't in any way allow that to affect our attitude this afternoon. It's important to maintain our standards. Do so and I'm confident that we can gain two points today.



Hampden heroes humbled

TAYPORT 2
STAR HEARTS (Holders) 0

The current Scottish champions, Star Hearts, fell at the first hurdle in their attempt to retain the Scottish Cup which they won at Hampden Park last May. They were beaten by Tayport Amateurs on the East Common last Saturday. A vociferous crowd of several hundred braved the blustery, unsettled weather conditions to see the home side record one of their most notable victories.

Hearts knew that they were on dangerous ground after two close encounters between the sides on the Common in the last two seasons. A first-half penalty converted by Dandie and a second-half header from Scott put Tayport into the second round and a home tie with Leven Hibs on Saturday, November 1.

Midfield man Dave Henderson (wedding) and goalkeeper Phil Callander (injured) were absentees from the Tayport line-up. K. Ritchie replaced I. Howe. Tayport had Scott at right back and McLaren in midfield but after only 10 minutes' play the home side resorted to their more usual pattern - R. Callander; F. Leslie, I. Mathers, G. McLaren, R. Fleming; Doug Henderson, J. Scott, L. Ancell; K. Ritchie, G. Dandie, G. Hughes; subs - G. Taylor and S. Ritchie.

Tayport opened very cautiously, allowing Star to make the play. Neither goalkeeper was much troubled, during this period while the respective midfields vied for superiority. Tayport's striking trio were, at this stage, seeing little of the ball.

Goalkeeper Callander, despite being called into the team as a late replacement for his elder brother, showed confidence in his early handling of the ball, but it was the other end that provided the nearest thing to date.

Tayport were awarded a free kick 30 yards from goal. Henderson struck the ball superbly and the ball was streaking towards the roof of the net until Braid in the Star goal leapt high to push the ball against the bar - a magnificent save.

Tayport were coming more into the game as an attacking force and Dandie did well to get in a shot which went past the post. With 35 minutes gone Tayport delighted the crowd by taking the lead.

Henderson worked his way into the box from the right and evaded one tackle before being brought down by centre-half McAlister.

Dandie was entrusted with the kick and the centre made no mistake to put the home side ahead.

Szaraneck had Star's best chance before the break but put his shot well wide. Half-time came with the home side still holding on to their single goal lead.

CHANCE LOST

In the second-half ex-East Fife and Rangers outside-left, Martin, had a good chance for Star, when he dispossessed Leslie but, under pressure, put his shot past the post. Callander was forced to kick clear for a corner as Star pressed for an equaliser.

The Tayport forwards were finding more space now and Hughes, who had had a quiet first-half, was giving Marshall, at right-back a troublesome time.

With 60 minutes played, Tayport increased their lead. Hughes won a corner on the left and took the kick himself.

The headed clearance was headed back into the goal area by McLaren where Scott knocked the ball into the air. The Tayport captain, showing great determination, reached the loose ball first to float a header over Braid and into the net.

Star hit back with renewed urgency but Tayport's defence coped capably. Star brought on a substitute in an effort to help breach the home defence. The Tayport forwards were really finding their feet now and giving the Star defence a rough time.

A superb pass from Henderson put Ritchie clear with just the keeper to beat but the winger's shot scraped past the wrong side of the post. Hughes, Dandie and Ritchie were, on different occasions, brought down most unceremoniously as Tayport threatened to increase their lead.

HEADER 'SAVE'

Leslie performed his now regular 'party-piece' when he popped up from nowhere to head a netbound header off the line and so prevent a certain goal as the cup-holders strived to keep their interest in the competition alive.

Their efforts were to no avail and Tayport comfortably played out time to chalk up an impressive victory, much to the delight of their support.

This Saturday, Tayport have a difficult League match when they visited Elliot Road to meet Harris.

Full-back George Taylor will sit out the next three Saturdays because of a suspension imposed after being ordered off versus Grove.

Tayport 2nd have a home League match against Harris Reserves, at 3 p.m.

Twenty years ago the existing pavilion (phase one) had just been completed but the Canniepairt wasn't yet ready for play. The *Fife Herald News* cost 5p. A bag of sugar was 19½p, a jar of Hartley's jam was 20½p and a half pan loaf would have set you back 14½p. If you had been looking for a three piece suite at Arnotts in Dundee, one of the 'Allander' range came in at £299. Anyone who was thinking of buying a car could have got a 2yrs old Cortina 2000 GLX for £1,370 or a Hillman Avenger (3 yrs old) for £920. Fife Regional Council's Cupar office was looking for a shorthand typist at an annual salary of £1,215/£2,529.

The La Scala in Cupar was showing *Love Story* with Ali McGraw and Ryan O'Neal. The Norwegian vessel, the *Siralyn* was discharging a cargo of timber at Tayport Harbour. The local news reported that there had been a chimney fire at 4 Banknowe Terrace and a small fire at *The Crossroads Restaurant* in Cross Street. And some things, it would appear, never change. One of the headlines twenty years ago read "*Drug Menace On Our Doorstep*".






