

TODAY'S VISITORS - LOCHGELLY ALBERT

Albert are the first ever Fife Junior side to play a competitive fixture on The Canniepairt.

Manager CHARLES WILSON is a kenspeckle figure in the Fife Juniors, having made over 600 appearances for Oakley United and being a member of the Hill O'Beath squad the season they won the Scottish Junior Cup.

Charlie is two seasons into a rebuilding programme at Gardiner's Park and the signs are there that his hard work and perseverance is starting to pay off. He brings with him a compact and versatile squad which is starting to make its mark in the Fife

COLIN CRABB and JOHN McBRIDE vie for the keeper's jersey. McBride, signed from Newburgh last season, is the more experienced of the two but Crabb, a recent signing from the amateur ranks, is the man in possession with two clean sheets in his last two outings.

Defender MARK MONTAGUE is in his fourth season at the club having previously played with Burntisland Shipyard. GRAHAM SOUTAR, also a defender, signed from Leslie Under 21's and is in his second season at Gardiner's Park.

Seasoned junior campaigner STEVE BARRY a key player in defence, was a big signing this year from rivals Dundonald Bluebell. MARK JORDAN, a recent signing from the amateurs, also plays in defence.

ROBIN COOK is a talented striker who was formerly with Dunfermline Athletic although Albert signed him from Rosyth Recreation three seasons ago. MARK JAMES, a striker, is another of the Lochgelly squad who has been at Hill O'Beath. He picked up a cup winners medal there before moving to Albert four seasons ago.

The Lochgelly squad is completed by two players with Tayside connections. Young midfielder CHRIS BRUCE stays in Dundee and was signed from Dundee Juvenile football this season. Striker ANDREW JOHNSTONE, in his second season with the club, formerly turned out for Luncarty.





THE BAKER'S BIT

Lochgelly Albert provide our Scottish Cup 2nd round opposition this afternoon. I'd like to welcome their players and officials to The Canniepairt.

Once again we managed to grab another couple of league points. Last week it was at the expense of Forfar Albion. And, although . I'm pleased with the 5-1 scoreline, it must be said that I was a bit disappointed with our overall application, especially in that first hour or so.

The only highlight in that period was of course the leading up work and the finishing at the goal. DR finished it off well but, for me, the goal belonged to Grant Miller whose run and final ball was, quite simply, a treat. It's something we work on often on the training ground. So it's even more pleasing when these moves come off. But, as I said, that was the only really bright spot of the first half.





LOCHCELLY IS STEEPED IN FOOTBALL HISTORY

Since the latter part of the nineteenth century , following an influx of miners from West Lothian to the area to sink the Melund Pit in 1884, there has been organised football in Lochgelly. The boom in football saw the game take over from cricket and quoiting as the principal sport in the area. Lochgelly Athletic was formed as early as 1887/88 and played in the Edinburgh FA. A year or so later a group of local Irishmen formed a new club, Fifeshire Hibernians, but within a

couple of years the two clubs had merged to form Lochgelly United.

Lochgelly United was to play Senior football for the next 38 years with a number of local Junior clubs acting as feeders to the Senior side. The club's history is littered with tales of money problems, riots at matches, pitch invasions etc.. At one game in 1894 the opposition, despite having two players carried off and three hirpling by half-time, were winning 4-1 with ten minutes to play. It was too much for the locals - the crowd invaded the park and the game was abandoned as the players, spectators, officials and Police all became embroiled in the ensuing melee. Derby matches against teams from the other mining communities weren't for the faint hearted. A Fife Cup-tie against Dunfermline in 1895 was abandoned after an Athletic player, who had formerly played with Lochgelly, was chased off the field by a howling mob and the Athletic players were stoned and divoted as they made their escape. Incidentally the player chased off chose not to return and headed instead for the Klondyke. In a match v Cowdenbeath in 1899, two players sent off for fighting continued their feud on the sideline and were charged and fined 10/- with an alternative of 7 days in the jail. The next season, with United now playing in the Northern League against the likes of Forfar, Brechin and Dundee 'A', one of their star players took exception to being dropped and was fined 2/6d for bashing a committe member in the Bay Horse Tavern. Today's hooliganism all sounds a bit tame compared with 100 years ago !

Lochgelly's biggest game to date was a 2nd round Scottish Cup-tie against Celtic in Glasgow in 1905 but they went down 3-0. In 1912 Lochgelly had two Senior teams, Lochgelly Juniors turning Senior as Lochgelly FC. United, though, had the mainthrust of the local support but raising funds was always a problem. Everything was tried, even a friendly against a touring team of midgets,

'Uno's Midgets' - the origin of the saying "Your ba' wee man" ?

The Great War saw football close down but Lochgelly United were revived in 1919. That season 10,000 saw United lose 0-3 at home to Third Lanark in the Scottish Cup 3rd round. In 1923 9,000 saw them go down narrowly to Celtic in the Scottish Cup. Despite a cup visit to Ibrox, United were struggling financially because of poor form in the league and went down to Division 3. Although the club had an overdraft at the bank, it struggled on but the General Strike and Coal Strike had a devastating effect. The club decided to play only cup-ties in 1927/28 and played their last ever game, at Glebe Park, Brechin in January 1928, a Scottish Cup-tie which was lost

Another Senior team, Lochgelly Amateurs , was formed but they didn't make much of things. Their gate takings in 1932/33 being only £68 and the establishment of a new Junior side in the town in 1933/34 was not a welcome move for the Seniors and, with their Recreation Park Ground already earmarked for housing, Senior football in Lochgelly died for ever in April 1934 when Lochgelly Amateurs played their last game, losing to Dunfermline in cup-tie.

The Junior club established that season was Lochgelly Albert, our visitors today, who, incidentally play in the same colours, black and gold, as did Lochgelly United. Albert are the only survivors of a plethora of Lochgelly based junior clubs, most of which played in the early part of the century. Two years after Albert went Junior, Lochgelly Violet followed them into the Junior ranks but in 1949 went into abeyance for two years to allow ground repairs to be made. The repairs must have been fairly substantial because the club is still in abeyance today. Why do we mention Lochgelly Violet? Because the person who probably sold you this programme, present Tayport committee member Alex Spence is a former player with Lochgelly Violet.

Lochgelly Albert have had their ups and downs in the last sixty odd years, but they can claim to hold the Fife junior crowd record. 11,645 squeezed into Gardiner's Park to see Bo'ness win a 6th Round Scottish Junior Cup-tie in 1948. Albert came close to extinction during the 1980's but hard graft by the committee pulled things round and the club from a town with such a rich football history can look forward with confidence to the new century.


