TODAY'S GAME

East Craigie, our visitors this afternoon, haven't been at the Canniepairt since August 1992. Craigie were relegated that season but came within a hairsbreadth of getting a point that day when only a flying header from Jackie Devine two minutes from time denied them as we scraped a 2-1 win. Earlier this season an injury time strike from Barrie Gray gave us the points in an equally close match at Craigie

When the Shipbuilders edged into the promotion frame last season in third place, few gave them much chance of survival. Particularly when the management duo of Steve Kell and Bobby Glennie jumped ship to Violet earlier this season.

However new boss Mark Bennett has taken his charges to a comfortable mid table position and looks like fulfilling his committee's primary aim this season of staying in the top division.

Craigie's stability on the field has been mirrored off the field. Our visit to Craigie Park in November showed just what a marked improvement there was both in the accomodation and the commercial operation within the club.

Although idle on five of the last ten Saturdays, the Shipbuilders, are unbeaten in their last three outings. A good 2-1 win at Downfield two weeks ago was followed up with a point from Kinnoull last Saturday.

Top scorer Paul Barron has recently been transferred to Downfield and, in keeping with the club's policy, another player who expressed a wish to leave, Craig McNaughton, has been made available.

The loss of those players puts more pressure on the likes of Graham Tonner and ex-Dundee United player Gregor Benvie to come up with the goals.

Defensively, long serving goalkeeper Scott Lindsay and central defender Peter Fraser, recruited in the close season from Riverside Athletic amateurs, are two of the rocks on which boss Bennett depends.

It's unlikely we'll see an all out attacking game from Craigie, if the game earlier this season is anything to go by, so it will be up to us to find a way through. Goals haven't been plentiful these last two weeks, although we had a less productful spell in early November after which we hit a rich vein into the new year.

Six goals in a Monday evening friendly dispelled any gloom which might have been hanging over the lads following last Saturday's record ending defeat. There were changes in last Saturday's team from that of the previous week and it's likely that there will be another wee shuffle this week.

Referee today is Mr Steve Kaney from Perth whom the most eagle eyed of you will have spotted regularly running the line on televised Premier League games.



FROM THE ARCHIVES

This week we've uncovered a couple of snippets from the Tele and the $Sporting\ Post\ from\ 1979$.

Remember the *Monday Page?* When the *Tele* was a decent size there was a fair bit of football reading matter on that page back in 1979? Used to take you all three courses of your tea to get through the sports pages then. These days you've read all the football by the time you've finished your soup!

It was an extreme rarity if amateur football got a mention on the ${\it Monday\ Page}$ and that's probably why there was a cutting taken for the Archives.

Tayport won the Bremner Cup that season, and it was, incidentally, the last time the club won a Midlands Cup competition.

The regular thirteen that season was Ian Lyall; Alan Hart, Ian Dobie, Peter Wilson, Doug Henderson; Dougie Paterson, Stuart Davie, Ronnie Fleming; Micky Hall, Kenny Smith, Gordon Hughes, Ian Howe and Alan Paterson.

18 years on and some of the squad still haven't found a permanent peg for their boots. Hart and Hall have turned out in the Midlands Premier Division this season and Hughes plays for Cupar Hearts in the Kingdom League.



A T Tayport another red-jersey team was having things very much their own way. One of this season's top teams in Midlands Amateur circles, Tayport reached the final of the Bremner Cup, beating Harris FP 2-0. The players concentration can't have been helped by the blaring radio on the touchline, giving commentary on the international. "Blow by blow" is the popular expression, and it was painfully appropriate, as Scotland went further and further behind.

THEY'VE every reason to be proud of their team at Tayport. Junior clubs are eyeing these players, but on Saturday's showing the team's strength lies in teamwork rather than individual skills. Well organised off the field as on it, "sweepie" tickets for the correct score were on sale. The well prepared pitch and smart goal nets spoke of thorough preparation.
