

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS ARNISTON RANGERS' SQUAD

In goal this afternoon will be GAVIN KIRKWOOD who has conceded only one goal in the Cup to date. Kirkwood, 34 next week, signed from Armadale just over a year ago.

Full-back TOMMY CUNNINGHAM is in his fourth season at the club and he will be partnered by RITCHIE McCAUL who is the club's longest serving player.

Inspirational player/boss JACKIE MYLES calls most of the shots on the park and his all action style belies his 36 years. 22 years old central defender MARK FRASER had two seasons at Ibrox playing for the big Rangers before being reinstated to Arniston 2½ years ago. Defender PETER THOMSON has been virtually an ever present since signing from Newtogrange Star during the summer.

Midfielder GORDON IRELAND is in his fifth season at Newbyres since joining up from near neighbours Dalkeith Thistle. ROGER CARR was signed a couple of years ago from Cowdenbeath and has notched two goals from midfield in his last five outings.

PAUL SIMPSON is one of two members of today's visitors8 squad to have played on The Canniepairt previously. Paul who is Arniston's top scorer this season, was a member of the Camelon squad which played here in 1993.

JOHN TAIT is another who can take goals from midfield and has found the net in three of his last five games. PAUL RAMSAY, a regular in the No.11 jersey, is in his first season with the club having signed from Newtongrange Star. Paul grabbed the goal which eliminated Kilbirnie in the last round.

30 yrs old striker RODDY MACDONALD doesn't have happy memories of his last visit to the Canniepairt. Roddy was in the Blackburn United team which crashed 7-1 in the OVD Cup exactly six years ago. This was the game, you might recall which ended in Blackburn being fined £250 for the conduct of their spectators.

Midfielder ROSS MIDDLEMASS, a recruit from the Juvenile ranks this season, has had to be content with a place on the bench for most games and that situation is unlikely to change today.

Assistant to team boss Myles is player/coach ROBIN RAE. A goalkeeper for several seasons with Hibernian, Rae plays outfield these days—when the boss gives him a game!

Defender STEPHEN LOCKE, Arniston's most recent acquisition, has made only two starts since signing from Rosyth at the back end of the year. Midfielder DONALD STOUT, signed from Cowdenbeath in 1995, hasn't featured in the team in recent games. Reserve goalkeeper is KEVIN BROWN who joined Arniston from Gala Fairydean in 1995.

TODAY'S GAME TAYPORT V ARNISTON RANGERS

This afternoon we welcome Arniston Rangers to the Canniepairt for the first time. Previous visitors to Tayport this season, Larkhall Thistle, claim to be Scotland's oldest Junior club but Arniston Rangers were also founded in 1878.

Based at Newbyres Park in Gorebridge, about three miles or so south of Dalkeith, Rangers' best season in the Scottish was 74 years ago when a crowd of 20,000 at Tynecastle watched Musselburgh win 3-0 in the final tie.

After six seasons in Division Two following relegation in 1989, the appointment of Jackie Myles, signed from Bonnyrigg Rose, as player/manager signalled a change in fortune for the Gorebridge club. Runners-up spot in 1995 brought a return to the top division last season.

To say that Arniston took Division One by storm would be an understatement. They went to the top of the table in November and stayed there until June. Their lead looked unassailable as they waited for the other teams to catch up on their fixtures. However Whitburn embarked on a sensational run which took them from the foot of the table to the title inside three months, pipping Arniston by a point for the championship on the final day of the season.

It seemed to take a while to get the disappointment out of the system and Rangers had a stuttering start to this season. But they got their act together following a single goal defeat at Dunbar on November 2nd and are unbeaten since.

The run started with their opening tie in the OVD Cup when Saltcoats Vics were eliminated by a 3-0 scoreline at Newbyres Park. Player boss Myles has had a settled side in recent months and the team's capabilities were apparent when they hit six goals for the second time in four games recently in defeating Armadale.

The only decision the manager appears to have to make from what has been a fairly settled line-up is whether to choose Paul Simpson or Roddy MacDonald to play up front.

With an age profile of around 29, Arniston's experience is in no doubt. They are certain to be tough and resolute opponents who have got their act together in good time for a determined assault on the cup.

Their run to the fifth round, which is the club's best run for many years, has brought a buzz to the Gorebridge area and the team looks certain to be well supported this afternoon.

Although nobody could pretend that the team's form in recent week's has been earthshattering, a feature of Tayport's play these past two weeks has been the quality of the goals. Three crackers against Craigie were followed up by another three toppers at Jeanfield. More of the same, please.



The tag of being rank outsiders won't weigh heavy on the Aberdeen lads. They'll give it their best shot, I've no doubt, but, alas, it's unlikely to be good enough.





O.V.D. Scottish Junior Cup

GLENS ARE OVD TEAM OF THE 90'S - SO FAR

If confirmation is required of the strength of EAST REGION clubs in the SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP during the 1990's it is the fact that three of their sides make the top ten appearance table. 
