

### TODAY'S GAME

This Whyte & Mackay Cup 2nd round tie brings together Tayport and St Josephs for the second time this season. The first occasion was back in September when we were held to a goalless draw at Fairfield Park. Since then both teams have played around 25 games and neither has given much away.

Tayport, already with three trophy successes under their belts this season, still retain an interest in all the game's prizes. St Josephs are out of contention for the biggest of those prizes, the OVD Scottish Junior Cup, but otherwise are having their best season to

It's a run built on the foundation of a strong defence which has given the rest of the side a confidence which was perhaps not so evident in Last close season's recruitment concentrated on signings which would provide defensive strength. 'Keeper Fraser Fitzpatrick (Lochee United) , Kenny Jones (Downfield), Jim McMulkin (Downfield) were three of the key signings. Downfield was further pillaged with the signing of strikers Mike McIlvannie and Kenny Cameron. The latter has found a rich vein of goalscoring form, particularly in recent weeks, under his father's tutelage. Old Kenny, the team manager, was of course a canny wee striker in his day many moons ago.

St Josephs noted in their recent newsletter that Tayport's heavy schedule might have a debilitating effect. However it's a situation which we've been well used to for seven years. It was also noted that the key to our success, particularly against today's opponents, has been our unrelenting professional approach. This is the attitude which no doubt former Port players Sommerville and Hunter have brought to Fairfield this season and it's been reflected in the team's results.

Counting vice president Peter Marr, St Joseph's have eight players/backroom staff who have been involved with the Tayport club at one time. Add Paul Bruce who lives in the town, one can see that there is no lack of interest for the Port Support in today's game which will be played to a finish.

Despite a comfortable win over Formartine last Saturday, Tayport will ring the changes again to keep everyone on their toes for the tough schedule which the next two months will bring.

Referee for this afternoon's tie is Mr Alan Thurston from Cupar. In the event of the scores being level after 90 minutes then thirty minutes extra time will be played and thereafter penalty kicks will determine matters if the teams cannot be separated. Interestingly this is the method which has been used to determine Tayport's fate in this competition in each of the last three seasons.

Today is also Grand National Day and we have 'on course' betting at the Canniepairt. Saltire Racing provide this facility and you are reminded that all bets are tax free. (see elsewhere in the programme for a quide today's match and Grand National odds.





### FROM THE ARCHIVES

1928/29

The 'Archive' photo of the Tayport School X1 circa. 1931 reproduced in a recent Port Prog caused a fair degree of interest. Tayport exile Douglas Mackay, now living in Monifieth, caught sight of the prog. and forwarded it to another exile Jack Galloway, now staying in Cults, Aberdeenshire. Jack replied by saying that the photo was 'of tremendous interest - it brought back many lovely memories'.

# Glory for Glory?

Talk of the season in the National Soccer League in Australia is the performance and drawing power of new club Perth Glory. This is the first season that a team from Western Australia has been accepted into the national league and at the beginning of February they were well placed to qualify for the top six play-offs when they lay third in the league. However a disastrous run in the next six matches saw the Glory boys pick up only two points to slump to eighth by early March. More recently a scintillating performance against runaway league leaders Sydney United resulted in a 3 - 1 win on March 15th and a return to the top six.

An average crowd in excess of 11,700 has been attracted to Glory's home matches including an early January attendance of 17,582 for the visit of last year's runners-up Marconi Fairfield. Reportedly a record for a regular season league match. The average attendance for the league is below 6,000 per match.

The performance of Glory is even more amazing when you consider that there is no proper soccer stadium in Perth with the two main stadia, the WACA and Subiaco being dedicated to cricket and Aussie Rules. Undeterred the forward thinking Glory owners hired one of the local Aussie Rules grounds (East Perth) for the season. An Aussie Rules pitch is huge. About 200 vards by 100 yards. However in an effort to create a better atmosphere temporary stands have been erected along one side and at one end of the Aussie Rules pitch to create an oblong soccer pitch. The re-jigged ground supposedly has a capacity of 14,000 (the 17,582 mentioned earlier was not a misprint).

At one end of the revamped ground an old covered enclosure on a grass hill is occupied by mainly British punters and while a great effort has been made to provide pre-match and halftime entertainment 'the boys on the hill' provide continuous entertainment throughout the match with traditional British style singing and chanting. The fact that 'the hill' is one of the areas licensed for alcoholic refreshments does help!

There is a lot of American type razzamatazz at Glory's matches with the crowd being led by a professional singer and a troupe of female dancers prancing about before the match and at halftime. The dancers form a guard of honour as the Glory are welcomed onto the pitch by their anthem blaring out of a multitude of speakers located strategically around the edge of the pitch. The Australian national anthem is sung before every match. Glory goals are welcomed by their anthem again blaring out while the deafening silence which greets goals scored by away teams (invariably the total 'away' contingent officials, players and fans will number less than 30) is covered by more music. Gaps in the play due to injuries again encourages more music. A little imp-like person with flags dashes around the edge of the pitch throughout the match like a demented demon while a human ball does continuous somersaults around the perimeter of the pitch.

To the soccer purist these distractions are not well received but the large mixed ethnic family crowd speaks for itself. One of the theories put forward for the success of Glory is that they are a mixed ethnic club. This is unusual in Australia with clubs invariably being linked to their ethnic origins, eg. Marconi Fairfield (Italian), Sydney United (Croatian), UTS Olympic (Greek), Melbourne Knights (Croatian). Perth Glory have no such affiliations with a great mix of ethnic origins. There are two Scots in the squad with Alan Mackenzie perhaps being a name known by the Raith Rovers fan.

The longest distance travelled by Scottish League Premier League teams is roughly from Glasgow to Aberdeen. The closest away match for Glory is the short hop to Adelaide. A mere 2,712 kilometres plus a two and a half hour time difference! The trip to Brisbane is 4,357 kilometres plus a two hour time difference while Sydney is 4,217 kilometres plus a three hour time difference.

Similar to Aussie Rules the team which tops the league table after completion of the regular 26 league matches are not the Champions! Instead the top six play-off for the Championship. Not in a simple fashion! The top two play each other with the winner proceeding directly to the Grand Final. The team placed 3rd plays the 6th placed team with the 4th playing the 5th. The winners of the latter two matches play each other to decide which team plays the loser of the top two match in a Preliminary Final. The winner of the Preliminary Final then plays the winner of the first mentioned match in the Grand Final to decide the Championship. CONFUSED ? I AM! A couple of scenarios are - a team finishing sixth in the league can be Champions. A team finishing first or second can lose their first play-off match but get a second chance to reach the Grand Final and win the title (Melbourne Knights did this last season).

The soccer sceptics in Western Australia expected Perth Glory's entrance to the national scene to be a total disaster. After their first two matches these expectations looked well founded following two defeats. The team however has responded in tremendous fashion to the support they have received from the Western Australia public and a play-off place looks likely. This would be a superb achievement in their first year and who knows what may happen in the play-offs.

As the National League reaches a climax the various State Leagues kick-off throughout Australia. The teams in these leagues appear on the British pools during the summer. Hopefully Glory have raised the profile of the game in Western Australia and crowds will increase for the local clubs.

Last season's Premier winners, Inglewood, are well placed to repeat their success while Stirling Macedonia, despite management and playing personnel disruptions, remain strong. Both have progressed to the semi-final of the pre-season Night Series. Other teams to look out for are Floreat Athena and Western Knights both of whom have added to stable squads from last season and have also reached the semis of the Night Series. My favourites for the title are Western Knights, although I admit a bias as young Portile (or should it be Portilic in view of the Knights Croatian origins) will be pulling on one of their jerseys again this season.

The State League in Western Australia has been restructured reducing to two leagues from three. The Premier League has been increased from ten to fourteen teams. This will undoubtedly lead to a fall in standards and teams such as Morley Windmills, Olympic Kingsway, Dianella White Eagles and Joondalup City (including Ted McMinn) will likely be on the wrong end of some high scores although all performed reasonably well in the Night Series.

The others, Swan, Bayswater City, Sorrento, Spearwood Dalmatinac, Fremantle City and Perth SC will probably battle it out for the mid table spots.


### THE WHYTE & MACKAY CUP
