TODAY'S GAME

Kelty Hearts pay their second visit to the Canniepairt for this quarter final tie in the Taycars Cup. Their first visit was just over a year ago in a second round tie in the same competition when a Hamish Mackay hat-trick gave the 'Port a 3-1 victory.

Kelty arrive here this afternoon as current Fife League leaders having dropped only one point in 14 games - a magnificent record and one which sees the Central Park side firmly on course for their first title since 1993. Hearts have a special reason for wanting to wrest the title from current champions Hill O' Beath. Several clubs, including Kelty, have won the title three times on the trot. No team has won it four times in a row but Haws are going for a fourth in succession this season and our visitors today look like being the only side that can stop them.

It's another tough game, then, for the 'Port who will be looking to put last week's result behind them against potentially more testing opposition.

Goals haven't been a problem for Kelty. They are top scorers in the Fife, having failed to find their opponents' net on only two occasions this season. They can also boast the best defence, losing only eight goals in the league to date.

Kelty have recently recruited ex-Hibs, Dundee United and Luton Town central defender Dave Beaumont to add to the colony of ex-Seniors at Central Park. With ex-St Johnstone and Forfar Athletic defender Alan McKillop joining Beaumont in central defence, the Tayport strike force is in for a competitive afternoon.

Although Calum Graham is Hearts' top scorer, ex-Dundee and Raith striker Colin Harris has been on the mark in three of Kelty's last four games, so he will be one to watch.

Steve Hutcheon has only played a game and a bit since his transfer from East Fife but, even in that short period has made a favourable impression on the home support. With two goals in those games Steve has set his own standard.

Paul Reilly missed last week's game through injury and will likely be out again this week. The absence of Sean Wilkie who is attending a wedding in Eire further reduces manager Dave Baikie's selection options.

Despite being well quoted by the bookies for the OVD Scottish and Fife & Lothians Cups, Kelty have disappointed their followers in these tournaments, losing out to Sunnybank and Bonnybridge. Consequently they will be determined to improve on that record this afternoon.

The tie must be completed today with extra time and penalties being used if necessary.



TODAY'S VISITORS KELTY HEARTS

Kelty Hearts have been one of the most consistently successful sides in domestic football since stepping up from the amateurs to the juniors in 1980 under the stewardship of Jim Leishman. There's only been a couple of seasons in the intervening period during which the Jam Tarts haven't picked up at least one piece of silverware.

Success on the bigger stage has eluded the Central Park side to date with them being unable to emulate their neighbours, Hill O'Beath's, exploits in the Scottish and Fife & Lothians Cups. However the Kelty committee are ambitious and it's surely only a matter of time before that record is improved upon.

Ex-Forfar Athletic stalwart Rab Morris lost his assistant Billy Bennett earlier this season when he moved to his old club Forfar to team up with Ian McPhee. Morris'current right hand man is Brian Marr who is a well known face in Fife football.

Morris has recruited well, using his contacts to entice several experienced players to the club. The new face in goal this season is Jock Lister, a fixture for many seasons at St Andrews United until he fell out with the management at Recreation Park.

The defence was strengthened by the signing of Alan McKillop from Forfar and the acquisition of ex-Premier Leaguer Dave Beaumont (pictured right) who packed up Senior football to join the Police. Beaumont played at Dundee United, Hibs and Luton Town.

Although a dozen or so of the Kelty squad from last season are still in the pool for today, one of the other additions is also an experienced ex-Senior. Colin Harris, the former Raith, Hibs and Dundee warhorse, is proving to be an influential member of the team. As well as being a consistent marksman, Harris provides his manager with versatility and is also has a key role at set pieces.



Calum Graham is the side's top scorer this season but the team can rely on any position for goals. Fifteen of the squad have managed to get their name on the scoresheet this season.

Influential midfielder Adam Moffat and Dave Beaumont aren't available every week through work commitments but it's a safe bet that they'll be in position this week.

IN THE SKY ?

It's Saturday, and we're off to an away game. We've only had a couple of pints before embarking because there is no toilet on the bus and we're in a hurry anyway.

No time for a pub lunch and even less time to prepare sannies, but we are confident that in an hour's time we'll reach the park and soon luxuriate in the celebrated Scots football supporters repast - the pie and a cuppa. Tea being of doubtful quality, many of our itinerant epicures opt for the Bovvy or something else under another name but always listed as Bovril.

Alas, unless one is quick off the mark, there is very little left by the time it's your turn, there are only crisps and Mars Bars left.

It happens more frequently where the pies are good; but many of the more parsimonious clubs never seem to stock a sufficient quantity to supply more than a minibus load of rapacious Tayport fans.

A case in point is Scone where, on one occasion there was a pie famine and one of our supporters ran all the way to a local pub, the Aeroflot Hotel or some name like that, and was served with a microwaved pie which resembled the recent visiting comet: it had a frozen centre!

Another time when we visited an east coast team, not Arbroath but it was north of East Haven and south of Aberdeen, I was served with what must have been the oldest pie in Scotland. The shell consisted of reinforced pastry which must have been reheated in every museum in the Britsih Isles. I am convinced that it was one of the pies that King Alfred burned!

I have only highlighted a few of the problems confronted by the wayfaring gourmet, but there are others which we hope to expolre in future columns of the Port Prog, such as the quality of the refection under question and the quantity of the filling against the price.

With these thoughts in mind, I would like some response from the travelling support to see if we can organise something on the lines of CAMRA - the Campaign for Real and Sufficient Pies, CARPS.

Finally, next time you meet a baker, ask yourself two questions,

FROM THE ARCHIVES APRIL 1973

24 YEARS ago this week a Williamson's of Gauldry coach rolled out of Tayport at the start of a great adventure. It was Tayport FC's first trip abroad and the destination was Ougree, Liege Belgium to play in an International Football Tournament. To quote the club minutes, the trip to Belgium proved to be an unqualified success. So successful, that there have been around a dozen or so subsequent trips.

A couple of teams, Bett Bros FC and Dens Star had turned down the invitation to play in AC Ougree's Easter Tournament but, despite the short notice, eight weeks, Tayport took up the challenge.

Funding the trip at such short notice was an obvious problem but the Tayport Town Council stepped in to help out and the cost per head was £16. (Jings, you'd be lucky to get a round of drinks in for £16 these days never mind a four day trip to Belgium!)

A sound investment by the Town Council of the day when one considers that links between the communities remain strong a quarter of a century on.

The Town Council weren't daft, though. To protect their investment they sent Councillor Walter Goodwin with the party.

The rest of the 24 strong party was Davie Hughes, Abby Oswald, Eddie Stewart, Ian Mathers, Walter Kemp, who were the committee representatives, players Lindsay Ancell, Gordon Brankin, Eddie Gilmour, Ronnie Fleming, Andy Johnstone, Frank Leslie, Jim Mathers, Ian White, Raymond White, Murray Anderson, Bobby Jackson, Alastair Oswald, Andy Robertson, Ian Rae, Alex Houston, George Caldow (the sprogger of the party at age 15) the late Bruce Ross and the late Jimmy Herd. Doug Henderson, at that time teaching in France, met up with the party when the hovercraft beached at Calais.

Tayport didn't have the best of seasons back in 1973. Prior to leaving for Belgium the team had recorded only one win since the previous December. A 1-6 home defeat by Grove in the last league match before departure wasn't exactly the best of send-offs. The team that day was - Raymond White; Walter Kemp, Jim Mathers; Ian Rae, Graham McLaren, Lindsay Ancell; Abby Oswald, Eddie Gilmour, Ian Howe, Ian White, Frank Leslie, Ronnie Fleming and Brian Burchell.

In Belgium it was an 8.20am Sunday morning kick-off against the host team and Tayport, obviously not used to playing at such an unearthly hour, went down 2-3. R.White & Ancell scored.

Later that day Tayport recorded their first win on foreign soil when goals from Oswald and Gilmour gave them a 2-1 win over German side SC Fuchtorf. The third game on the Monday morning against French side ASO Calais finished goalless but Tayport won 5-4 in a penalty shootout.

In all the visits Tayport has only recorded one Tournament win but, with another visit scheduled for next month, there's still the chance of another.
