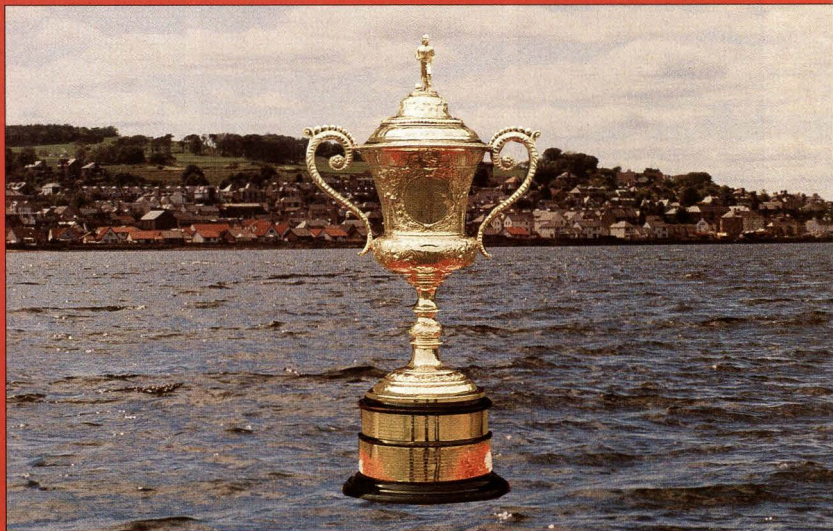

THIS AFTERNOON'S MATCH

A warm welcome to the Canniepairt to Scone Thistle for this afternoon's NCR League match.

Scone survived their first season in the first division by finishing five points clear of the relegation mark. Indeed they would have finished as Perthshire's best placed team last season had they not had an inferior goal difference to Kinnoull. Any suggestion of that a few years ago would have caused a few raised eyebrows.

However the appointment of Dutchman Tom Van Der Ham, as manager three years ago has brought a change in fortune for Thistle. Tom has recruited wisely and led the side to its first ever promotion in season 1994/95.

Bar a couple of hiccups, at home to Carnoustie and away to North End, Scone's scorelines have all been close. The best result in the league to date was their 3-0 win over Lochee United.

With the first division having developed into two distinct halves, the top half with designs on the title and the bottom half struggling to avoid the drop, Scone, being firmly in the latter, are desperate for points.

The Jags showed last Saturday in winning their Scottish Cup tie at Oakley United, presently 3rd top of the Fife League, that they are no pushover.

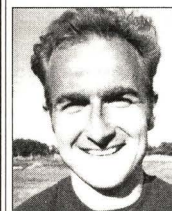
Top scorer Rab Nicoll gave them a great start with a goal in only 90 seconds following a spirited run and cross from fullback Davie Hughes. Within 10 minutes it was 2-0 when recent signing Dave Ruthven headed a goal from Flaherty's cross.

After dominating the first half, Scone let Oakley back into the game by conceding an early goal. It could have been worse when the Fifers got a penalty but young keeper Dave Martin pulled off a tremendous save. The keeper continued to defy the home side and Scone held out for a famous victory.

It's an experienced Scone line-up which will run out this afternoon against a Tayport team, the composition of which will not be determined until nearer kick-off time. Mark Spalding, missing through injury last week, and Paul Reilly, taken off injured, are both facing fitness tests.

For those who are interested in statistics, this afternoon could be somewhat notable. Scone are looking for a single strike to give them 50 first division goals, Tayport are looking for two goals to bring up 500 league goals and a Dave Reilly hat-trick would be nice. It would give him 250 goals for the Port.

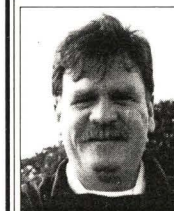

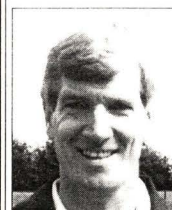

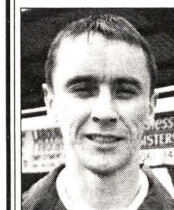

FROM THE ARCHIVES

OCTOBER 1991

The corresponding weekend in 1991 Tayport were experiencing life in Division One for the first time and were tucked in just behind Downfield in their quest for the title. The Spiders were favourites and led Tayport by 3 points with half the league season already gone.

There were only two league games that afternoon. Downfield dropped a vital point at home to Kirrie Thistle in a goalless draw while we were entertaining East Craigie on The Canniepairt for the first time ever.

The following report shows that seven of the Tayport team that day are, 126 league games later, in line for a game this afternoon.

The club records noted that the crowd was 150 and commented that there had been a couple of defensive lapses but, had it not been for Craigie 'keeper Lindsay, then it could have been 8.

Tayport's late clinch

Tayport collected another brace of vital championship points, but were made to work for them by a lively East Craigie side.

The home side were once more without midfielders Cushnie and Hunter, and early in the match Coventry hurred from the field to be replaced by Lamont, who was still nursing a back injury from the previous Saturday.

Tayport had started this match as hot favourites to collect both points, and after Kevin Thoms had put them two up after half an hour with a couple of well taken goals, it looked as though it was in the bag. However, within five minutes Craigie had pulled one back when Brian Christie punished slackness in the home defence and ran through to fire past the helpless Mann. One the hour mark Spalding and Irons combined well to set up Dave Reilly whose well struck shot could only be parried by Craigie 'keeper Lindsay as it entered the net.

Tayport continued to enjoy most of the play and it is down to the bravery of Lind-

say that the score was not added to.

The visitor's persistence paid off with ten minutes remaining when Christie again, fired home a second after Mann could only parry a shot from the impressive Craik. The second goal, in fact, established Craigie as fourth top scorer in the first division despite their lowly league position.

Jackie Devine, who was a constant threat to the visitors defence, completed the scoring when he coolly finished off a fine through ball from Lamont. Tayport: Mann, Malone, Paterson, Wilkie, Sommerville, Irons, Devine, Spalding, Thoms, D. Reilly, Coventry. Subs: Lamont, Dolan

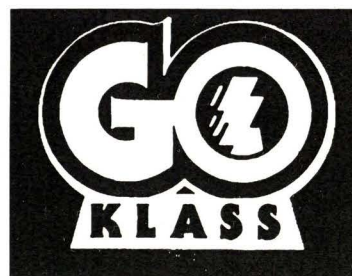

COMMENT

'The Luck of the Draw' & 'The Romance of the Cup' are time honoured cliches but is it not time the SJFA had a look at the format for the OVD Cup and play a Preliminary Round?

No disrespect meant, but should there not be a seeded draw at the preliminary stage to bring the original entry down to 128 clubs and make tomorrow's draw the first round proper?

The 74 clubs which would compete in the preliminary round could be drawn from the bottom leagues of the respective regions and the bottom half of those regions with just one division.

What's the point?

Well, two points spring to mind immediately. (1) Big guns like Camelon and Kilwinning (one of which will make their exit today) wouldn't be absent from the competition while the likes of Fochabers haven't yet kicked a ball in the competition. (2) Top division clubs are likely to have longer seasons, so this way they might have one or two games less while the bottom division clubs can comfortably accommodate another one or two games.

It would appear to be a good enough system for the European Champions League, the Scottish FA Cup and the English Cup so maybe it's worth a try here.
