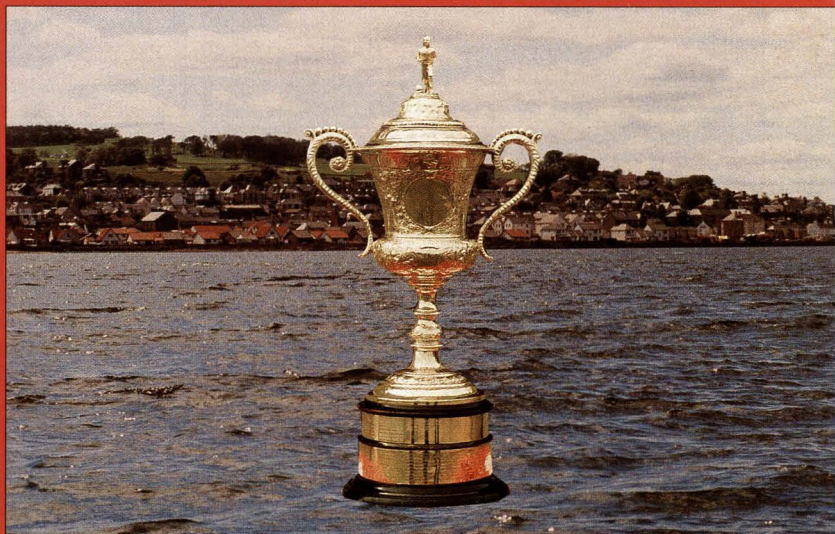

THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME

TAYCARS TROPHY - TAYPORT v LOCHEE HARP

A warm welcome to Lochee Harp, sure to be in buoyant mood following their stirring Scottish Cup victory at Lochgelly last Saturday.

Harp certainly have a habit of upsetting the form book when it comes to the Scottish Cup. I seem to recall back in 1980 or thereabouts Harp returned from Ayrshire having crushed Cumnock 6-0 in Cumnock's first game in defence of their Scottish Cup win earlier that year. In 1993 Harp returned from a tie in Glasgow having stunned Junior followers with a 2-1 win over the then defending Central League champions Petershill.

Lochgelly might not be quite in that category but it does serve to illustrate that, regardless of their league standing, Harp have that knack of producing the goods when it's least expected of them.

It's a warning, then, that today's game is far from a foregone conclusion. Harp have plenty experience in their ranks, players for whom a visit to The Canniepairt holds no fears. Keeper Kenny McLeod, the hero that afternoon at Petershill, defender Mike Kelly, whose passion for the game has meant, on occasion, that he's had first use of the showers.

Stevie Higgins has been a regular marksman over the years for the Beechwood Park side and he has support from Graeme Lundberg, a young striker whose displays have earned him a place in the Tayside Under 23 squad. Also turning in consistent performances is Ian McLeod, a keep fit addict who is attracting the attention of the Seniors.

Tayport will be without the transfer-listed Jim Henry and the suspended Barrie Gray, neither of whom were in the starting line-up at Larkhall. Despite that excellent win, it's likely that there will still be changes in the team this afternoon. Keith Nicolson, although not quite back to full fitness, could find a place on the bench.

The preliminary round of the Taycars Trophy featured only Tayside clubs. This tie is in the first round proper and is unique in that it is the only one of the sixteen ties which isn't a Tayside v Fife affair. That's because there are only fifteen entries from Fife.

Kick-off is again at the early time of 1.15pm to allow for extra time and penalties if necessary.

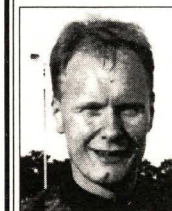

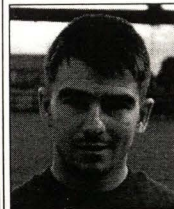

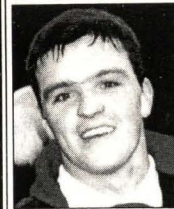

Both the Forfar teams have home ties and this advantage could well be the decisive factor. Albion meet early season surprise packet league cup winners Thornton Hibs while West End await Lochgelly Albert.

Jeanfield will have to find some kind of form when they meet Crossgates Primrose and Bankfoot will have their work cut out to return from Tulliallan with any spoils. North End have Oakley United at North End Park and, although the visitors will provide spirited opponents a home victory looks the likely outcome.

HURLFORD—THE ONLY WAY IS UP

Birthplace of Jimmy Knapp; earmarked as the site of Scotland's first private prison; home of Ayrshire Juniors' legendary duffers. Hurlford — how can you resist it?

Think you know a bit about football? Fancy yourself as being rather tasty in the old quiz department? Right, answer me this one. What do Glasgow Rangers, Hurlford United, and Manchester United have in common? The answer is, they all did the double in Season 95/96. Now, before all you McStatto's out there get hot under the collar and point out that the Ayrshire Junior League was in fact, won by Cumnock, (who, incidentally clinched the title by beating Glenafton 4-2, coming back from being 2-0 down in a relatively good tempered match which saw only one dismissal and no involvement from the United Nations) let me inform you that Hurlford's "double" was much more unique than simply winning a league title and a cup. Hurlford went through the entire season without winning a point for the second year running. In a revival that puts Albion Rovers' "achievements" firmly in their place, Hurlford have already broken their duck this season with a 1-0 cup victory over Rob Roy, but this is all the more reason to marvel at the utter litany of incompetence that preceded it (see also Duncan Mackay's article in TAG 49 for more loving details). Between 2nd April 1994 when Lugal Boswell were put to the sword by two goals to one, and this season Hurlford went without taste victory. There was nothing to suggest, that sunny April day, as the massed ranks of Hurlford supporters made their way out of Lugal's picturesque Rosebank Park, that 29 months later, they would not have seen their heroes claim another point. Indeed, that victory put them into third place in the Ayrshire Junior 2nd Division, and the talk on the bus back home was of promotion. The next season, the Ayrshire Juniors introduced 3 points for a win. The pressure to achieve victory was simply too much for the players, and two years after its introduction, Hurlford have yet to claim three points for a win. And just to prove they're not quite out of the woods yet, recent setbacks have included a 1-12 defeat by Glenafton.

'Ford Go Knapp

Looking beyond the team for a moment, Hurlford is a quiet village a couple of miles east of Kilmarnock. Arguably its most famous son is Jimmy Knapp, self-styled "dinosaur" of the trade union movement. In the post-Thatcher industrial relations of the 1990's, where just about the only thing you can negotiate on is whether you say "aye" or "yes" to your employers demands, it is a minor miracle that Jimmy still exists. And so it is with the local team. Without a league point in 2 years, without even a social club to bring some money in, and with Premier League football on offer a mere 7 minutes drive away at Rugby Park, it is a constant struggle for Hurlford to survive.

This has not always been the case. In the early 70's the 'Ford were one of Ayrshire's top junior outfits. Indeed in season 72/73, they did the "real" Ayrshire double, winning the Division 1 title and the Ayrshire Junior Cup. For good measure, the Ayrshire Regional League Cup was captured that year as well. Incidentally, this is the trophy which provided Hurlford with their most recent regional success, in 1975/76. Other honours include the Kilmarnock & Loudoun District Cup, which was won on no fewer than five occasions. This trophy was fiercely fought for by all the Junior teams in Kilmarnock & Loudoun District. In other words, Hurlford, Darvel, and err, well, that's it really. Kilmarnock & Loudoun District was abolished in the recent gerrymandering, sorry, streamlining, of local government, and so another window of cup winning opportunity was slammed shut on Hurlford's knuckles.

Singing in the Cowshed

Moving on to the playing staff. As far as I can establish, the only ex-Hurlford player to be capped for Scotland was William Dunlop. (v England 1906) who played for the village between 1891 and 1893, before moving to Kilmarnock, and then to Liverpool, where he won two English 1st Division championship medals. In recent years for some strange reason the Scottish Junior selectors have consistently overlooked the Hurlford heroes when picking the national team, but one or two local celebrities have worn the hallowed red & white jersey. At national level, probably the most famous recent ex-Hurlford player is Tommy Steel. No, not the one that sang Little White Bull. The one that hit the two goals for Stenhousemuir that knocked Aberdeen out of the cup a couple of years back. Sadly for young Tommy, while with Stenhousemuir his celebrity status went to his head. His life became one constant whirl of young farmers dances, stock judging competitions and appearances on the Womens Rural after-dinner speaking circuit. When last heard of, he had quit football and was on the books of Ayr United. (yes, that old joke again)

At a more parochial level we have Colin "Rusty" Harkness, who on leaving the 'Ford, terrorised lower league defences while playing for Kilmarnock, Queen of the South, and Stranraer, before reverting back to the junior scene with Cumnock, and most recently, Kilwinning Rangers. Possibly Rusty's finest moment came during a Kilmarnock player of the year dance, when, despite drinking most of the supporters under the table, he was still compus mentus enough at 6a.m. to nip round to the local baker's shop and fetch some rolls and sausage for those still at the function. Of such stuff are local legends made. Blair Park: New Manager, New Hurlford?

And so to this season. One thing is for certain. Promotion is not on the cards. Finishing off the bottom is unlikely. The appointment of a new manager, the fourth in as many years, is the most immediate priority. At one point, Hurlford approached the manager of Stewarton United, an amateur team currently not even in the top amateur league, but even he turned them down, the main reason being the lack of facilities at Blair Park.

Ah yes, the "facilities". The changing room has recently been the target of much vandalism, although why anyone would want to break in is unclear. Its not as if the European Cup is stashed away inside, standing proud on a table groaning under the weight of accumulated silverware. The perpetrators no doubt do it because they have nothing to do, but if they carry on much longer, a few more people in Hurlford will have "nothing to do", at least on a Saturday. This is no Chick Young style overstatement. A club official is on record in the local press voicing concern that the SJFA may consider the clubs facilities inadequate, and possibly suspend their membership. However, help may be at hand from an unlikely, and ironic, source. Step forward, the National Lottery. Yes, the same National Lottery that has cut the income from the pools so badly, and may yet jeopardise some of the smaller League clubs, could prove to be the saviour of Hurlford, via a grant to upgrade the changing rooms. An application has been made but a final decision is still awaited.

In for the Kill

Another possibility much talked about locally is that Kilmarnock could "take over" Hurlford and perhaps play their reserve games there. This again is not without irony, as, after World War 2 when Rugby Park was used as an oil storage terminal (no jokes about Rab Reilly's hair, please) Killie used Blair Park to fulfil some of their fixtures. On a more upbeat note, Hurlford has recently been chosen as the site of Scotland's first privatised prison. Given your average Scottish footballers penchant for flouting the law, perhaps in a couple of years time Hurlford could be fielding some illustrious names. Mo Johnston & big Duncan up front. Now they would soon have Darvel on the run.

This may seem frivolous but a sense of humour is all most Hurlford fans have left right now. It might not seem much, but if the name of Hurlford United simply appears in the fixture list for season 97-98, many of the locals will consider season 96-97 to have been a success.
