SEETHING Rose gaffer Colin Sinclair blasted his bad boys after seeing two players redcarded in a stormy OVD Cup èclash.

Sinclair couldn't believe his eyes when defender Paul Taylor was sent off for kicking Tayport winger Barrie Gray after a late challenge in 51 minutes. Gray, booked earlier, also went.

And Rose finished with nine men when Derek Halcrow was dismissed for elbowing Allan Ramsay late on.

Sinclair said: "Getting sent off for things like kicking and elbowing people is just silly and they are no use to us standing on the

sidelines suspended. I'm very disappointed with the discipline."

The Rose boss added: "We didn't play well and they were the better side.

"They won without having to go full out which tells how disappointing we were."


Crocked

The holders coasted into the fourth round with goals from Billy Coventry, Keith Nicolson and Stevie Ross.

Coventry's first goal of the season couldn't have come at a better time for the 29-year-old midfielder. who was crocked for two years with horrendous knee problems, and was just returning to action as the Tayside aces lifted the OVD

Cup in May. He said: "It was a nightmare last season having to watch from the sidelines. But I always believed that I would be back and these are the kind of games you are desperate to play in. It was great to get my first goal of the season in such an important match.

"I was a good bet for at least 15 a season before my injury so it would be nice to get back to that again. After I damaged the medial



regular place again.

"As holders we have a big reputation to live up to and it's very hard to get into this side at the moment.'

Former St Johnstone stopper Nicolson – in only HIS second game back after a knee op – bundled home the second just before half-time. And though Halcrow headed against the bar

for Rose in the second half, Ross sealed the win with a close range back-post effort in 75 minutes.



THE margin of Linlithgow Rose's defeat at the Canniepairt last Saturday was not only their biggest of the season but was also their heaviest Scottish Cup defeat during the 1990's. Despite the defeat being only their third of the season (the others were odd goal defeats), the mutterings could be heard from certain factions of the 21 strong Rose committee.

According to a member of the Port Support who attended St Josephs recent Dinner, the MC, in his introduction to proceedings, described Carnoustie Panmure, Joeys' opponents the previous day, as being their nearest league challengers. Must have been talking about the challenge for second place!

WHEN Tranent were awarded their penalty kick against St Josephs two weeks ago, the writing was on the wall for our Tayside rivals. Penalty taker supreme Mike Wojtowycz was stepping forward, looking to successfully convert a 23rd successive penalty in two seasons. Said Mike "I had scored two v Dunbar the previous week and I knew St Josephs were watching but I put the penalty in the same place as usual, only with a bit more power. If I'd missed they'd never been able to find the ball"

AFTER the good win over Linlithgow, one wondered what the headline might be in Monday's Courier Junior notes. It was one of the ties of the round after all, attracting over 500 to The Canniepairt. Would it be something like 'Rose Wither At Tayport' or 'Rose Pruned By Port' or 'Tayport Only Tayside Team Through' or maybe 'Linlith-gow Out At Tayport?' What do we get? 'North End Forced To Settle For Draw'. Well, I suppose it was to be expected. After all Blantyre only lost their previous match by 6-0 and they did, after all, win the cup in 1982!

Old adversaries Downfield are our opponents this afternoon in our first meeting of the season. The present Spiders may not be quite the force they once were but it should be remembered that last Saturday's shock defeat from Bankfoot was only their second league defeat in 13 games this season.

Downfield have not had things easy this season. The waygoing of the legendary Grier brothers left a huge gap - clearly a gap which wasn't going to be easy to fill. Brian Kenyon, who worked closely with the Griers, was persuaded to step into the breach. However work commitments made it very difficult for Brian to give the job the time it required and he recently handed the reins over to Rab McLaren.

The loss of several experienced players in the close season, to St Josephs in particular, may have given a substantial boost to the coffers but it meant a rebuilding job was required. In have come the likes of keeper Barry Goodwin, Norrie Reilly and Paul McGinlay but the familiar old warhorses - Roy Price, Charlie Adam and Derek Mitchell - are still there - although Charlie could be an absentee. Hooked by new manager Rab McLaren last week v. Bankfoot, Charlie slapped in a transfer request which the Spiders' committee have agreed to.

Boss McLaren won't be dwelling on the past, however. As far as he's concerned the Griers, Jones, McIllvenny, Cameron, Clark etc. are history and he'll be looking to build his own team to get the club back into a challenging position.

Tayport's arrival on the scene effectively ended Downfield's era of supremacy in the Tayside Juniors and there's nothing the Spiders' fans would like better than to put one over the 'Port.

An exciting game should be the result this afternoon with Downfield hopefully coming to the Canniepairt to play attacking football as opposed to the tactics which have been employed by many of our opponents here this season.

Tayport fans will not have forgotten that it was Downfield in June this year that ended their team's proud unbeaten league record on the Canniepairt which had stretched to four years and exactly 50 games.

Gary Maher will be missing - he's off on holiday - and it's possible that work commitments could rule Allan Kennedy out but there could be starting places for Paul Reilly and Grant Miller as we look to close the gap at the top.

Apart from the result, last week's game v Linlithgow had several plusses. Virtually written off by the critics following two years of continuous injury problems, Billy Coventry repaid Dave Baikie's faith in selecting him for a crucial tie by turning in a sound performance. Keith Nicolson, too, showed that he was back to his best. Keith, in only his third match back after injury, ran Sean close for United Distillers' Man of the Match award - and that took some doing.



MEMORIES.....

The end of 1996 will see the end of a year in which History was made; not only in Tayport but in Scottish Football itself.

This was the year in which long but well deserved dominance of the west over the east of Scotland ended. This end was finally sealed by Tayport winning the Tennent's Sevens Trophy for the first time and the first three places won by teams from the Tayside League.

Like many Tayport fans, I take for granted that we are going to do well in local competitions. We have been spoiled to the extent that we arrogantly take such successes as a matter of course. We are inclined to take for granted that the sterling work and effort put in by our players, committee and management will continue to produce the kind of results we have come to expect; at least at local level, but when one considers that, at national level, we have been in about 46 OVD Cup-ties in our six years, one has to come to terms with the idea that we have arrived on the national scene and look set to continue.

I'm sure that for all of us - supporters, players, management and committee the most rewarding, albeit nerve wracking, experience was the long, hard-fought road to the OVD Final at Fir Park.

There were ten games in our Cup campaign last season and, like every other fan (I use this as an abbreviation of the word 'fanatic') I felt, at every stage, some degree of worry. The first worry being "will lee there?" Supporters came ashore from the oil rigs; from as far apart as Dubai and Canada – from Australia came a group of holiday makers who became so enamoured with Tayport as to attend the final. We even had supporters from deepest Englandshire!

Then came the financial worries. "Will I have enough money in my pocket?" I remember when we played Arthurie in 1993 and no pubs would take cheques and I was only saved by the presence at the match of Dave Paterson from the Bell, who, as he has often done, gave a positive response to my request - "Will ye cash a cheque, Dave?" Another time I had to walk around the streets of Milnathort on a homeward stop because no one would cash a cheque from marauding caterans from Tayport.

One worry always in one's mind is "Will they play their usual game?" Another concerns injury and availability of players

After all these considerations, there's the nailbiting when you go to bed, the sleeplessness and the resulting worry of sleeping in! Friday nights were torture, but when one awoke on Saturday morning, it was the exhilaration of a small child arising on Christmas morning, saying "He's been!"

In the long haul to the Final, it must be remembered that we had two replays and only one goal in each home match saved us from defeat and gave us breathing space; one from Hamish Mackay against Baillieston and one from Dave Reilly against Stoneywood. Both goals were as important to us winning the Cup as Steve Ross' magnificent double in the Final after 90 minutes had elapsed.

All of us remember the feeling when the final whistle blew at Fir Park. In spite of the condition of the park - the pies were even worse - we played a professional game and achieved that pinnacle in Scottish Football. We'd won the Cup! Exhilaration, ecstasy, euphoria and other feelings I cannot spell swept through the crowd. Shouting, dancing, weeping, cheering, singing and congratulations, with fans from the opposing sides in the Old Firm cuddling each other!

Once back in Tayport, one was amazed at the enthusiasm of the townspeople when they waited in their droves to welcome their team back for the celebrations. People decked in red and white favours; painted faces and auld wifies, who had probably never seen a match, wearing their best red coats, skirts and hats. The players' bus led by the Tayport Instrumental Band, passing the Bellrock, Cobbies and the Auld Hoose on their triumphal way to the Pondy.

The team gave the town something to celebrate which was only equalled by the festivities at the end of World War Two.

The scenes in the Bellrock will stay in my mind forever, especially holding the Scottish Junior Football Association Challenge Trophy in my hands.

Through it all, sadly, my thoughts kept going to Hamish Mackay who was denied a place in the Cup-winning team due to injury. It would have been a very satisfying end to his career. Some of us from the Bell clubbed together to present Hamish with a commemorative decanter.

A great year with the promise of more to come.

FROM LITTLE ACORNS.....

As 1996 draws to a close we can look back on what has been the most successful year in the history of Tayport Football Club. While all those connected with the club look forward to further success in 1997 – which will be the club's 50th Anniversary – I could not help but reflect back on the years which have seen Tayport FC rise from humble origins in 1947 to the memorable day last May when the Scottish Junior Cup was brought back to the town.

From the era when the changing accommodation was a small green hut on The Common to the fine pavilion and football ground there is today.

Success came fairly quickly to Tayport when they won the Alliance Cup in the season 1949/50 by a walkover when opponents Smedleys were disqualified. It was nearly ten years later until they won another honour, when they defeated Morgan FP by 2-1 to win the Bremmer Cup in 1958/59. These early years produced such fine players (or so they tell me) as Andy Phin, Bert Aitken, Jim Rae, Ronnie Moyes, Billy McKay, Davie Ross , Abby Walker etc., many of whom of whom can still be seen supporting the 'Port from the terracing.

The next cup victory was 1963/64 when a piper escorted the team from the railway station to the pub to celebrate the 1-0 defeat of Grays United to win the Carne Trophy. It was round about this time that I started to watch Tayport, my own football career having come to an end at the ripe old age of fourteen. I, along with my teammates, came to an agreement that football, for me at least, was a spectator sport.

During the 60's I was privileged to watch such luminaries as Jim'Peem' Rodger with his famous double shuffle putting pinpoint crosses on the head of Andy 'Acker' Fraser and Kenny 'Toast' Thomson. Jim 'Dosher' Mathers strutting his stuff alongside Jim 'The Fox' Rae. Ross 'Jonah' MacMillan putting a goal kick out for a corner at the same end. Kenny Gorham playing in wellie boots and Bill 'Rocky' Jellye playing in stocking soles, his boots having split. The aforementioned 'Toast' standing in the Bellrock wearing jersey, shorts, socks and boots under his overcoat getting 'match fit' by drinking six pints of lager.

Towards the end of the sixties saw an influx of younger players such as Abby Oswald, Ian Bell & Ronnie Redpath who were to play a big part in the reshaping of the club to what it is today. A Coffee Morning was held which raised enough funds to purchase new strips for the Midlands and Alliance teams. Resplendent in these new jerseys of red & white, Tayport won the Carne Trophy for a second time defeating St James 3-2 in season 1966/67 with no little thanks due to the heroics of goalkeeper Jim Paterson and the shooting power of Richard Redpath.

Season 1968/69 saw Tayport finish as Division Two Champions and, although it would be 1977 before the club won another trophy (4-3) against Grove in the Alliance Cup), the years in between saw many changes.

The club had embarked on a rebuilding programme. The committee assembled at the local Scout Hall where Ian Mathers had chalked out a plan on the floor of what was to become the new pavilion.

Team changes came about around this time as Tayport, in search of more success on the pitch, brought in players from outwith the town. Players such as Kenny Smith, Dougie and Alan Paterson, Graham McLaren and Ian Howe along with locals like Jim Scott and Gordon Hughes gave the club its most successful period in its amateur history winning the Alliance Cup(twice), the Gray Trophy, the Bremner Cup and the Division One Championship between 1976 and 1982. It would be another ten years until Tayport would win another Midlands Trophy (The Alliance Division Two Championship) but by this time the pavilion had been extended and the Canniepairt enclosed as the club embarked on its biggest project, the formation of a Junior side. The rest, as they say, is history but; as the club approaches the millenium, it is hoped that further success for both junior and amateur sides will follow and give the town a football club of which they can continue to be proud of for the next 50 years and beyond.





1996 - A MOMENTOUS YEAR

It's been a momentous year, one for which Sunday 12 May will long be remembered in Tayport. The wee community of 3000 or so souls, previously only famous for being the place where the 'Unknown Bairn' was washed ashore or the place where the railway stopped prior to the Tay Bridge being built over 100 years ago, suddenly became big news. And all because of the exploits of the town's football team.

For a week the name TAYPORT was splashed across the page of every Scottish newspaper and for a couple of hours that week it occupied every ITV screen in Scotland.

Like football or loathe it, what cannot be denied is that the Scottish Junior Cup win, to date, is the biggest thing to happen to the town during the course of the entire 20th century. And we were lucky - we, the supporters, were part of it and how the occasion was enjoyed by everyone involved.

For those directly involved , it made the effort which has gone into the club over the years well worthwhile. Traipsing to away game at some God forsaken venue, soaking wet and chilled to the bone and well thumped into the bargain. How many times has a player/committee member/supporter during the past 50 years said "Is this all worth it?". Well, on May 12 it was all worth it - and thousands would agree.

Those who kept the club going in the dark days - and there were several especially during the 50's and 60's - also deserve recognition. Scraping funds together, scraping a team together, marking the pitch on the Common on a wild Saturday morning. Indeed had Tayport not been such a strong community then the club might well have folded a couple of times during these 50 years.

For the players and committee of that era - and those of later years - it must have been a proud day. There's little doubt that, without the energies of those lads, now in their late fifties, sixties and beyond who kept the club alive in those darkest of days, we might never have won the Cup.

Present club treasurer Ross MacMillan was one of those who experienced life at the bottom of Alliance Division Two in his early days with the club during the 60's. What a contrast it must have been for Ross to be part of the squad – as sponge man – when Tayport FC lifted the Scottish Junior Cup – the first Tayside based club to do so in 67 years.

NEWTONGRANGE, ORMISTON, TRANENT and WHITBURN.


From the Fife Region, GLENROTHES, HILL o'BEATH and KELTY.
