TODAY'S GAME

Last season's third round OVD Scottish Cup tie between today's combatants proved to be a watershed for Linlithgow Rose. After their 3-0 third round defeat on the Canniepairt, Rose boss Colin Sinclair staetd the "he had never been so embarrassed by a performance.....but perhaps the result at Tayport was one of the best things that could have happened to us". The upshot of that defeat was that he and his coach, ex-Tayport Amateurs Manager Eric Sinclair, decided to give the young players on their books their chance. And it paid off. Rose went on to lift the East Region Championship and they arrive back in Tayport just over a year later thirsting for revenge.

A healthy support followed Linlithgow to Tayside last season and another big gate is anticipated today for what should be an excellent contest.

Neither team was at its best last Saturday, with Rose going down by the odd goal in three at home to Armadale Thistle and Tayport needing an injury time winner from Dave Reilly to see off the challenge of the North Region's Turriff United.

Both teams had regulars missing last Saturday. Rose were without central defenders lan MacMillan and Steve Richardson while 'Port had Sean Wilkie, Mark Spalding, Allan Ramsay and Grant Buist absent from their line-up against Turriff. Midweek training will determine if they will be fit and available for selection.

Both team have strikers in the mood at present. Veteran front man Derek Halcrow (pictured) is the man in form for Rose and showed his mettle by bagging all four goals in the last round v Vale of Leven. Halcrow's strike partner Steve Dickov is credited with supplying most of the ammunition for the 35 year old.

Hibs legend of the 1950's Lawrie Reilly was tagged 'Last Minute Reilly' after his knack of hitting late goals to win matches and it looks as if namesake Dave is also blessed with the habit. As well as last week, there have been several occasions this season when DR has notched a crucial late goal, notably v Joeys.

RECONSTRUCTION MOVEMENT GATHERING MOMENTUM

When all round good guy and darling of the media Ally McCoist takes up the cudgels, there must be a groundswell for change in the Scottish game. In his News of the World column last Sunday Ally was beating the drum for the Juniors entering the Tennents Scottish Cup and cites the addition of Tayport amongst others to the competition as an opportunity to bring a bit of romance to the cup.

In a week that the top ten got the green light, there's gathering support for a pyramid system in Scotland. Port supporters may recall that this club was castigated and described as upstarts, amongst other things, for having the temerity to suggest such a system back in 1992. We reproduce that article which appeared in *The Courier*.

Tayport's Super League plans

A TOP Tayside outfit has drawn up a plan to revolutionise Scottish junior football.

Tayport are calling for the introduction of a 10-team national Super League which would remove giants of the junior game such as Auchinleck Talbot and Pollok from their local divisions and pitch them into competition with the best clubs from the rest of the country.

Tayport secretary Albert Oswald anticipates opposition from some quarters but insists his blueprint would be of huge benefit to the game.

"The junior game has a great

tradition and I understand people wanting to maintain that heritage," he commented.

"But the Super League would complement the existing set-ups and—via a pyramid promotion system—would be open to all clubs.

"The competition would improve the standard, and for those with ambition it would be a godsend."

Tayport, crowned Division One champions last year in only their third season in the juniors, certainly fit the bill of potential Super League members.

"Of course we would be keen to take part," said Mr Oswald, "but there are plenty of other clubs, like Downfield and St Joseph's, who also have the potential for involvement.

"The top clubs in the west attract crowds of over 2000 for their biggest games and I am sure they would be a tremendous draw."

The Tayport secretary revealed that under the terms of their proposal, Super League clubs would only play a short season and so could keep their links with neighbours through the Scottish and regional cups.

And the difference in strength of the regions would also be accounted for

Mr Oswald said, "It is a fact of life that the standard varies between areas, North clubs, for instance, have to compete with the Highland League for players, and that would be reflected with Ayrshire probably taking three places say to the East's one.

"Obviously this would be changed if the form didn't hold true."


Tayport came up with their plan following a trip to England to play Diadora oufit Wivenhoe Town.

"It really gave us ideas," admitted Mr Oswald. "Down south, there is literally no limit to how far you can go, but up here there is more of a stranglehold."

"At the moment, this is just a plan but we have done a fair bit of work on it and would like to hear what other clubs think."

Last season Ronnie was travelling every week from Fort William but he's since moved to the Lothians and his form has been good enough to keep longserving ex Whitehill Welfare goalie Ian McLaren on the sidelines.

Kevin Gibson (32) key defender signed from Berwick Rangers in 1993 and skippered Rose's Carlsberg East Junior Cup winning side in 1996.

Alan Middleton (26) defender signed from Bathgate Thistle this season but was previously with Arbroath FC.

Steve Richardson (36) experienced central defender signed from Whitburn and skippered Rose to victory over his former teammates earlier in the competition. Played at the Canniepairt in 1994 for Whitburn. Won a Scottish Junior Cup medal with Newtongrange Star. Senior experience with a number of clubs.

Ian McMillan (21) 6' central defender signed from Armadale this season. Lot of experience for one relatively young. Was previously with Raith Rovers and was in the squad which played v Bayern Munich.

Mark Whyte (24) ex-Alloa midfielder in his second season at Prestonfield. Hit a double v Tranent earlier this season.

Mark Robertson (23) midfielder signed from Musselburgh and was previously with Meadowbank Thistle. Good scoring record from midfield, he hit both goals against Whitburn earlier in the Cup and netted the two penalties which put paid to Newburgh's chances in the Fife & Lothians Cup.

Danny Smith (20) midfielder signed from Queen's Park this season and has staked a regular place.

Dougie Hope (26) midfielder, signed as recently as January after being out in the cold at Arbroath 1 following his celebrated dust-up with the Gayfield club's assistant manager during the club's pre-season tour.

Derek Halcrow (33) striker and top scorer at Prestonfield with 14 goals this season. Sparks into life in the Scottish Cup, according to his manager. Threatening to retire at the end of the season.


DOUGIE'S NO HOPE WITH BAIKER

Linlithgow's most recent recruit is 26 year old midfielder Dougie Hope whom they signed from Arbroath FC on a free transfer last month. - exactly 12 months after they had paid East Fife £7,000 for his transfer.

Hope was signed for the Red Lichties by former Arbroath boss Tommy Campbell but played only 13 games for the Gayfield side scoring one goal.

A pre-season tour bust-up between Dougie and Baiker's right hand man, ex-Tayport player and coach Mel Irons, effectively ended Hope's career at Gayfield. He never returned to the ground after being blackballed by the ex-Tayport boss.

Berwick and Alloa both made enquiries during the five months he was out of the game, but no business was done until Linlithgow stepped in to end the player's isolation.



THE OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP 5th ROUND

When football first started in these parts, teams played in friendlies or cup competitions before the advent of league championships. Over a century later cup competition still has the recipe for excitement, and none moreso than the Scottish Junior Cup. The name of the competition may now be prefixed by the name of the sponsor, but it's still the same competition as 112 years ago It's got a certain kind of magic that has spawned tales which are handed down from generation to generation and it's a competition which will draw thousands of fans to eight junior grounds throughout the country this afternoon.

Only seven miles north of here, cup holders Pollok face a tough task when they go in against St Josephs at Fairfield Park. One advantage the Central League side have is the fact that they've been there before so they'll know what to expect at the tight wee Joeys ground. This is definitely the test of the competition so far for Pollok and victory here would confirm the bookies' faith in their ability to retain the

Maryhill fans will see this as their season for the cup. They've shown what they can do in local competition but it's the OVD Cup by which their improvement will be measured. It's a long, long time since Maryhill appeared in the last 16, never mind the last 8, but they'll have no better chance of winning that quarter final place than today. Johnstone Burgh's halcyon days were the mid 1960's when they twice won the cup but they look as if they could just be on the way back to better days. Not today, however, I fear.

Dunterlie Park will be bulging for the meeting of Arthurlie and Petershill. Despite 'Lie being the most consistently successful side in the cup in recent years, they haven't had a final appearance since 1981. It will be a surprise, however, if Petershill halt their progress to the last eight.

Hill O' Beath will be quietly confident going down to Kilbirnie Ladeside. A victory against a team which has lost seven of their 12 league games is certainly not beyond the Haws.

Larkhall look to be having too good a season to be unduly troubled by Beith but the Avrshire team do have the better Cup record of recent years, having reached the semi-finals in 1992.

Shettleston and Kilwinning Rangers are well matched but, although they struggled in both games v Kirrie Thistle, Rangers look the better bet. Shettleston's confidence will not have been harmed, however, by their 5-0 win at Wishaw last week.

Auchinleck, or the 'Mighty Talbot' as they are described when they are drawn against Tayport, continue to grind out the results but could find that they will have to replay after their visit to Neilston.





17 YEARS AGO FEBRUARY 1981

Tayport Amateurs led the Midlands League by an amazing 11 points with only nine games left to play but incredibly were to be pipped for the title by Harris FP. By concidence 17 years ago today Tayport opened up that gap of 11 points by beating Harris FP 2-1 at Elliot Road. The Fife Herald said "Level at a goal apiece at the break, Tayport took the points by scoring the only goal of the second half - and what a goal! Tayport captain Peter Cuthill set up the goal with a dazzling run and cross, As the ball flew across goal Alex Reid dived full length to bullet a header into the roof of the net." The Tayport line-up that day was Ian Lyall, Ian Noble, Alan Gray, Alan Hart, Ian Brown, Stewart Gibson, Abe Watson, Peter Cuthill, Ian Howe, Alex Reid, Barry Toner and Brian Simpson. Substitute was Bobby Wilson. The other goal was scored by Gibson. Three of that side Lyall, Wilson and Cuthill are presently playing for Newport Amateurs.

The FifeXI was in splendid form in the East Fife Division Two. The previous week they had rattled in 14 goals against Crail Amateurs and this week it was 9-1 along the coast v Pittenweem Rovers. The team was Richard Callander, Ronnie Stewart, Willie Gardiner, Jimmy Robb, Doug Henderson, Lindsay Clark, Richard Rennie, Bobby Waddell, Alan Paterson, Sandy Hamilton and Bruce Burnett. Subs were Dean Anderson and Jimmy Shields. Burnett and Paterson had hat-tricks, Bobby Waddell, a member of Dundee FC's Championship winning side 20 years earlier, had a double and the other came from Rennie. 11 points ahead of the pack at this stage Tayport won the title.

It was a good day for the 'Port, that Saturday in February '81, because the 3rd XI also won, beating Broughty United 2-1. Veteran keeper Derek White was the 'Port hero according to the press report. Tayport went behind to a penalty but levelled through Jimmy Anderson and then went ahead with a 35 yard free kick from Frank Feechan. Team was Derek White, John Aitken, Frank Feechan, Rab Burns, Colin Gray, Neil Downie, Jimmy Anderson, Rab Downie, Colin Doherty, Roy Lessels, Ian Ness, Ian Ness, Rod Davie and Jackie Tannock. Of that squad of '81 only Neil Downie, who went on to play for the Juniors, is still playing. Neil is one of seven or so ex-Tayport players in the Newport Amateurs team looking good for a league and cup double this season.



In the music charts of the day, following his tragic death the previous December, John Lennon was dominating with the first two No.1's of the year. *Imagine* was knocked off the top perch this week by *Woman* and after two weeks *Shaddup You Face* by Joe Dolce took over.


