TODAY'S GAME

CARNOUSTIE PANMURE make their first visit of the season to the Canniepairt this afternoon and no Port supporter needs reminding that it was the Gowfers who inflicted that stunning 6 - 3 opening day league defeat over us at Westfield Park in August.

The critics had a field day. Tayport, post-Baikie, were finished , the bubble had burst etc. It was to herald a new era in which Carnoustie and others would blossom. But here we are six months on and nothing much has changed. Tayport sit top of the league, albeit with North End in hot pursuit, and Carnoustie, bedevilled by injury and inconsistency, slipping after a bright start.

Both teams have something to demonstrate today. Tayport, that they can exorcise the memory of the defeat at Westfield and Panmure, that their recent results are not warranted and they are capable of re-launching their season.

It is, therefore, a crucial game for both teams with the result that the supporters today should be well entertained. Ex-Carnoustie favourite Allan Ramsay and Sean Wilkie both managed to get back into action last week. In the latter's case, despite fitness doubts right up to an hour before kick-off. Mark Spalding, Barrie Gray and Billy Coventry are all improving by the week and the latter looks to be the only player definitely unavailable for selection today.

For Carnoustie a bad injury to Brian Craik sustained v Hill O'Beath a month ago was a blow and the lanky goalscorer could be out for a long, long time. Keeper Grant Clark is winning his battle for fitness and is not too far from a return. A knock sustained last week at Jeanfield is unlikely to keep Keith Galbraith out of action today.

1998 OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP



No shocks in the five ties which were played last Saturday. Three games were off because of waterlogged parks. With conditions at the Canniepairt and Fairfield Park being near perfect, it was hard to believe that elsewhere in the country the rain was lashing down.

Maybe not a shock but a mild surprise, perhaps, at **Larkhall** where the conquerors of North End failed at home to **Beith** where Gary Grenfell's own goal two minutes from time took the Ayrshire team through by the odd goal in three. Denis Connachan put Beith ahead and there could have been another but Larkhall keeper Danny Hanley saved Mark Sweeney's spot kick. Doug Brownlie took full advantage of the let-off by firing in Thistle's equaliser but it was no avail thanks to the late og.

St Josephs supremo David Young was quoted as saying he had no complaints over his side's exit at the hands of **Pollok**, Joeys just couldn't get it together on the day. Pollok dominated the first half and deservedly led through a Davie Elliot penalty but were stunned by Kenny Cameron's leveller against the run of play before the break. Despite starting the second half well, Saints fell away and Dougie Fontana's winner for Pollok was no more than the cup holders deserved.

Johnstone Burgh were always going to be underdogs at home to **Maryhill** and they didn't help their chances by finishing the game with nine men as 'Hill ran out 4 - 2 winners. Chris McFadyen hit the only hat-trick of the round, the other Maryhill goal came from Richie McCusker. Ryan Connachan and Steve Frater scored for Burgh.

An error by **Shettleston** keeper Mark Laing who missed Alan McTurk's curling corner kick ten minutes into the second half, proved crucial as it was the only goal of the game and took **Kilwinning Rangers** through to the last eight.

The other ties go on this week. **Hill O' Beath** squeezed in a league game against Lochgelly Albert after their tie at **Kilbirnie** became a victim of the weather and this action will stand them in good stead for today's tie. **Auchinleck Talbot** will be favourites to go through at **Neilston** but a second game could well be required to separate **Arthurlie** and **Petershill** when they clash at Barrhead.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS

It's a familiar pool which crosses the estuary this afternoon to represent **Carnoustie Panmure**. Former Tayport goalie **Brian Anderson** is the man in possession between the sticks at present but ex-Downfield and Lochee United favourite **Grant Clark** will soon be back challenging for the No.1 jersey.

Keith Galbraith, a former player with Tayport Amateurs had an outstanding season last year for Blairgowrie and he was snapped up to play in the Carnoustie back four. Full back **Neil Cargill** may only be a teenager but he's had experience with Dundee, Arbroath and Montrose. **Jon Durie**, a stuffy full-back always impressed when he played with Forfar Albion before he moved this season to Westfield.

Sweeper **Kenny Fox** first played with the club several seasons ago but moved to Arbroath Vics, was then out injured and slipped back to amateur football before returning to Panmure in 1995. The versatile defender **Kenny Laing** is a Newport lad who was signed a couple of years ago from St Andrews United.

Player/coach **Stewart Forsyth** and **Jim Smith** are both ex-Dundee FC defenders and both are also officers with Tayside Police. Midfielder **Wayne Morrison**, a signing from Kinnoull, brings the total boys in blue in the Panmure squad to three.

Defender or midfielder **Jamie Tosh**, signed from Montrose, is a brother of the players of the same name who play for Arbroath SC and Hibs. **Kevin Longmuir**, a left sided midfield player, previously at Arbroath SC was signed last season from Arbroath FC. Another of the many who turned out for Arbroath in the pre-Baikie days is midfielder **Glen Knox** who also saw service with Broughty Athletic.

Alan Sturrock, on the mark against North End in a recent cup tie, signed this year from Lochee United but apparently turned out for the now defunct Osborne FC, so he can hardly be a spring chicken. Play anywhere **Bobby Skelligan**, often even in the same game, has, in recent years been with Riverside Athletic, East Fife, St Josephs and Arbroath SC as well as having an earlier stint at Westfield. **Scott Ferguson**, a youngster with a talented left foot, was fixed up from Brechin City.

Midfielder **Gary Christie** was at Montrose but also had a stint at Tayport before being transferred back to East Craigie during our first season in the Juniors. Tayport showed their intent from the kick off, forcing two corners. But it was midfielder Allan Ramsay, later to be named man of the match, who carved the opener. After Dougie Hope had lost possession in midfield, Ramsay threaded a perfectly weighted

pass forward to REILLY who raced through to score. Tayport were two up after 25 minutes. Full back, Alan Middleton, was left stranded by Steve Stewart who hit the by-line and fired in a low cross. It was missed by everyone except HUTCHEON who had a

simple tap in. It was the last piece of action for goal keeper Ronnie McPherson who hobbled off injured to be replaced by veteran, Ian McLaren. The half ended in controversy when a downward header by Halcrow was cleared off the line by a Tayport hand but

referee Hunter was deaf to the visitor's claims for a penalty. HT: Tayport 2, Linlithgow 0. Linlithgow started strongly after the interval. But they almost went three down when Dave Reilly brought out a great save from McLaren with an overhead kick. Substitute,

John Boyack, replied with a stinging left foot shot which was blocked in the huddle of Tayport defenders. Tayport were forced to adopt an even more defensive strategy when Nicolson was sent off but Linlithgow boss, Colin Sinclair, must be asking serious

Well, Carnoustie's Doug Mitchell got his fifteen minutes the other week when *The Sun* sent reporter Bill Leckie down to Westfield after Doug had taken exception to comments made in the newspaper regarding Panmure. Here we reproduce Leckie's report on his day at Carnoustie

Carnoustie Panmure 1 Dundee North End 2

SO it's looking like they've just about forgiven me, right?

Bit of early snarling, boyish charm breaks the ice, then it's handshakes all round and come away in for a cuppa.

From Carnoustie's public enemy No1 to everybody's pal in 45 minutes of diplomacy. Then I only go and win the half-time draw.

The committee boy handed me the tenner like a summons and my new pals disappeared as quickly as a mother-in-law's smile.

As I slunk back round the grass bank of terracing, you could hear them whisper: "Aye...there he is. Slags oor club then takes oor money."

Best to go and park myself beside Dougie Mitchell. No one messes with Dougie. You can't miss him if you

ever go to Westfield Park, in his luminous yellow council jacket and his milk bottle glasses. Believe me, a club like Carnoustie Panmure could not exist without his like.

For 13 years, Dougie has collected the gate money, tidied up the muddy kit and kept a mountain of club facts and figures in his head.

He and the rest of the committee put in endless hours at this ramshackle ground, and create the kind of atmosphere that makes you feel good about football.

They've got no facilities, little money. The players don't get paid and the social club shut down long ago. What they do have is enthusiasm. They live and breathe their club, and on a raw, windy day when you're going out of the cup you sure as hell need to.

Dougie's first problem is that most of the 150 or so crowd are still coming in after kick off.

As he stands his corner, Dougie knows them all by name. In fact, Dougie knows everything.

When winger Alan Sturrock taps in midway through the first half to put Panmure ahead, he's ready.

Brilliant

"Now here's an unusual fact," he says. "Before he was here, Alan had about ten years as a running back with the Dundee Whalers American football team."

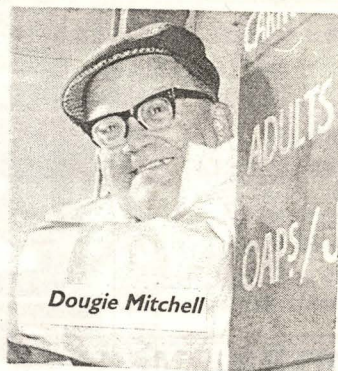
"See our No8? That's Gary Christie. Brilliant player, used to be with Montrose, but hates travelling."

"I've made you up a wee factfile about the players and the club."

And so he had, which is how I now know that the name Panmure comes from a huge estate which used to stand here and that one-time Scotland keepers Fred Martin and Bill Brown used to star for them.

I also know that being a manager is as big a pain in a place like this as at Ibrox or Old Trafford.

Lex Richardson stands up on the grassy bank beside the punters. He is banned from the dugout after having a word or two with the ref the last time they played North End. As the

former St Mirren ace is no more than six feet from the touchline it's hardly a handicap.

"How long to go?" he asks his chairman, local housebuilder Dave Laing, for the umpteenth time.

The answer is too long. By the time we're inside the last ten, Lex is starting to relax. He says: "North End have got the ball a lot but they're not doing anything with it."

The words have barely blown away when a corner causes panic in the Panmure box and suddenly the ref has pointed to the spot.

Nobody knows what for. Richardson finds one word - "nightmare".

The keeper goes the wrong way, and the wind feels stronger than ever. When another corner ping-pongs around the six-yard box in the dying seconds, it's almost inevitable when it ends up in the net.

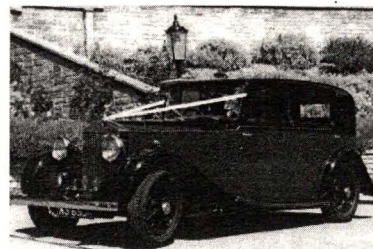
A good hour later Dougie Mitchell finishes counting the takings. "We just can't get a win," he says, "but we wouldn't be anywhere else."

1993

5 YEARS AGO
20 FEBRUARY 1993

In **FEBRUARY 1993** Tayport were heading towards a first ever Scottish Junior Cup appearance and during the month of February had won 4 - 1 at Cumnock in a 4th round tie and 5 - 3 at Arbroath Vics (after extra time) in the late Perthshire Advertiser Cup quarter final.

On this corresponding weekend **FIVE YEARS AGO**, it was another trip to Arbroath, this time to **Sporting Club** in the League Championship and another five goals to go five points clear at the top of the league from Forfar West End with seven games left to play.

Tayport's team which won 5 - 0 that afternoon at Seaton Park was **Fraser Mann, Paul Reilly, Grant Paterson, Billy Coventry, Andy Sommerville, Sean Wilkie, Jimmy Hunter, Grant Cushnie, Hamish Mackay, Kevin Lynch and Gary Lamont**. Subs were **Jackie Devine and Bomber Harris**.

Hamish Mackay netted a hat-trick, one of the 15 he netted in a Tayport jersey, and the other goals came from the two substitutes, **Devine and Harris**. One of big Hamish's goal came from the penalty spot after Covy had been felled by **Ian Greig**, now a teammate at the Canniepairt. Also in the SC line-up that day was **Danny Powell**, playing here today with Carnoustie Panmure.

Covy had been involved in all five goals but the day ended in disaster for the Tayport midfielder when he dislocated his shoulder minutes from the end of the match and was taken to Dundee Royal Infirmary where he was detained overnight. On the positive side **Grant Cushnie** played his first full ninety minutes after six months out through injury.

Dave Reilly had been out injured after damaging a hand at Cumnock and wasn't to return until the following week.
