WHO ARE THEY KIDDING?

It isn't surprising that there is resistance from the Ayrshire Juniors to a rationalising of the Junior game when the 'Wha's like us attitude prevails' as typified by Auchinleck Talbot's assistant boss Willie Young's statement last week prior to their West of Scotland Cup replay against Pollok. - "Down here we still believe we have the best teams in the country".


Such arrogance is hardly borne out by Ayrshire clubs' results against Tayport. Talbot have lost on both occasions we've met and Cumnock, hot favourites for the current championship, have lost three out of three against the 'Port. Ayrshire's last success was Glenafton five years ago.

Still on Ayrshire. Talbot went out of the West of Scotland Cup, beaten in a penalty shoot-out at Newlandsfield by Pollok in the quarter final replay after a 1-1 draw. No real surprise there. After all, Pollok have been getting plenty practice of late! Talbot boss Dennis Gray was in a real lather after the game. Talbot's McCulloch had apparently headed the winner in the dying seconds of extra time but their joy was shortlived when the linesman flagged for offside. Gray, who doubles up as Scotland boss, made his feelings very clear. " we were robbed......but for an incompetent linesman we would have won it"



FROM THE MANAGER'S PEN....

Hello and welcome to the Canniepairt for today's NCR League game against East Craigie.





FORTHCOMING FIXTURES

A veritable feast of football is in store for the Canniepairt faithful during the next few weeks. First visitors next week are North End for a crucial league game on Tuesday evening. Kick-off is 6.30pm.

Hill O' Beath are the visitors in the semi-final of the Taycars Trophy, the final of which is rumoured to be planned for Dens Park. Surprisingly, considering that the combatants have dominated Junior football north of the Forth for the best part of the last ten years, it's a first competitive meeting between the sides.

There will be a midweek league game, probably on the on the 29th April, opponents could be Elmwood or Kirrie at home or more likely an away game v either Forfar WE or Jeanfield.

It's unlikely to be against St Josephs because we meet them here on Saturday 2 May in the semi-final of the Dundee North End Centenary Cup.

The **DJ Laing Cup 2nd round** which was drawn earlier this week, has favoured us with yet another **home** draw. On this occasion **Luncarty** are the visitors.

The other ties are :- Scone or Forfar WE v Broughty Athletic; Brechin Victoria v Elmwood; Carnoustie v Lochee United; North End v St Josephs; Violet v Montrose Roselea; Forfar Albion v Lochee Harp; Arbroath SC v Bankfoot.

Another tie to be fitted in on the Canniepairt is the Whyte & Mackay 2nd round tie v Carnoustie Panmure.

Yes, it's all action at this time of the season. Don't forget, if you want to check on what the next action is for Tayport contact the **Newsline** on **552755**.

It's maybe all action for us with a possible 17 competitive fixtures before the end of the season but worse off are Hill O'Beath with something approaching a possible ten more than us.

BAIKER'S LIFE WITH THE LICHTIES

Dave Baikie carved out his managerial career at Tayport and was for seven years the dominating force behind the club. His move to Gayfield ten months ago to take over the reins of the 'worst team in Scotland' (the Red Lichties had just finished 40th out of the 40 teams in the Scottish League) wasn't entirely unexpected. He had achieved everything in the Junior game and deserved the opportunity to test his skills at Senior level.

Clubs had looked and pondered, newspapers had speculated but nobody in the Seniors was prepared to take a chance on Baiker. It was as if there were two unwritten rules 1) no Junior boss would ever be good enough for a Senior club & 2) a Senior manager must have played Senior football. Well, Baiker has shattered both myths.

Arbroath must now be reflecting on the scores of ex-Seniors who had been given the reins and done sod all other than spend a fortune achieving sod all. Baiker arrived at Gayfield despite not being the unanimous choice of the committee but he has confounded any critics which he might have had by revolutionising the club and leading them to a situation where they are still very much in the race for promotion for the first time in 26 years. Indeed there is still the outside chance of a first ever honour in the club's 120 years history.

With Dave still a Tayport resident and mine host at the Tayport Arms, we thought you might be interested in his first ten months at Arbroath. First we take a few snippets from the *Arbroath Herald* report of the Arbroath FC annual meeting held last month and then reproduce the manager's report on the next page.

The treasurer was questioned as to why, although attendances had increased, match income had not. This apparently was down to letting children in for nothing. On the transfer front, the biggest sale, somewhat incredibly, was £3000 from Armadale Thistle for Jamie McCarron. Sponsorship income from the SFA and SFL amounted to £25,000. The hire of Gayfield to Dundee United for Reserve games realised £243. Transfers and signing on fees amounted to £37,695. This included the fees to Brechin City for Brian Mitchell (£7,500), Montrose for Kevin Tindall (£6,000) and Hill O' Beath for Billy Spence (£4,500). It was also reported that the club had just acquired a Portacabin which was to be done up to provide a corporate facility.

In his report, manager, Dave Baikie, thanked a number of people who had helped him to ease into the job after leaving Tayport. "John Christison, Charles Kinnear and all of the committee have given me a great deal of advice," he said. "My coaching staff have also been a great help. Graeme Irons works hand-in-hand with me and was also with me at Tayport where we enjoyed a great deal of success. I also felt it was important to bring back Tom Fairweather and John Martin, because they are local guys who have a great knowledge of the local scene.

"Tom, especially, is a great help. Some of the players work shifts and as Tom is retired, he takes them for training sessions in the afternoon and does a tremendous amount of work. I would also like to thank the kit man, Peter Nicol; physio, Bill Shearer; groundsman, lain Gunn; the ladies in the tearoom and the 36-0 Club, all of whom have been a magnificent help to me."

Mr Baikie told the meeting that, on being informed of his success in gaining the position of team manager, he had mixed emotions. "When John 'phoned me to tell me I had got the job, I didn't know whether to be happy or sad," he revealed. "I had enjoyed seven great years at Tayport with unrivalled success, but it was probably the right time to move on. Had I not taken the job, then I would always being asking myself 'what if'.

"When I came here, we had only 12 players on the books and four out of contract. Since then, we have brought in another 16 players, including a couple of youngsters, and the playing staff is looking a lot healthier.

"Initially, we had players from Arbroath, Edinburgh and Glasgow, so we decided to do pre-season training at Kilgraston School in Bridge of Earn. This proved to be very important for the players. I am very strong on team spirit and fitness. This helped in both of those departments and I think that showed in the start we made to the season and our early results."

The Lichties boss added that the fostering of a youth squad is the only way forward for the Club, with money simply not available to be spent in large amounts in the transfer market.

"Obviously, when I first came to the Club, we concentrated on the first team which had finished bottom of the Third Division. However, it is important the you build a foundation and we are now putting a youth structure in place. The committee said I could have a youth team or a reserve team, but I couldn't have both. So, I asked them if the youth team was self-financing, would that be alright and, naturally, they did not disagree.

"We currently have about 20 youngsters training with the Club on a Tuesday night," continued Mr Baikie. "Initially, we were going to enter these youngsters in the Scottish Professional Youth League, but we felt that playing Rangers, Celtic, Hearts, etc., would be difficult for them. We now plan

to enter a team in the Dundee and District Juvenile Under-16 League next season, possibly under the banner of Arbroath Lads' Club, and, hopefully, they will progress into the youth league, the reserve team and, ultimately, the first team.

"Our first youth coaching course, which is to be held in the Easter holidays, will give us an opportunity to look at local talent first hand. There will be two more courses in summer and autumn, It is important for the Club to pick up local players. Dundee recently signed someone from Arbroath, but it should be Arbroath that sign local players, not Dundee."

Looking back over the season, the Gayfield supremo was pleased with it so far, but feels there is more to come. "After finishing bottom of the league last season, to be sitting second in the league this season shows a vast improvement. However, I will not be happy until we win the division and I will not give up until it is mathematically impossible for us not to win the league.

"We play Alloa on Saturday and, of the seven games we have lost this season, they are the only side to have caused us any real problems. I know we have lost to Montrose twice, but I honestly believe that is because the players are put under too much pressure by the fans because of the intense rivalry. Beyond that, I feel we are doing OK and I will be working non-stop until we win the division or at least gain promotion."

In a question and answer session that followed, Mr Baikie was asked if he had been forced to by-pass players because of the Club's financial position. He responded, "Tayport were a Club which didn't have a lot of funds. I have never been with a Club which has had a lot of money to spend and I have always had to work within the parameters set out. I asked the committee if Bruce McLean could come on board as commercial manager and the funds he has raised enabled us to buy Kevin Tindal and Dougie Scott.

"We must continue to generate more finance if we are to attract a better class of player. This will be particularly important if we gain promotion to the Second Division, as we must have a continual improvement."

The Maroons' manager was also asked if he was working with a contract. "When I took over the job, I was asked if I had a problem working without a contract which I don't. It works both ways, as I can walk away from the Club if things are not going well, while the committee can also get rid of me if I am not doing a good job," he replied.

Another member asked Mr Baikie about the situation regarding Steve McCormick. He

"We circulated all of the Scottish Second and Third Division Clubs, but we haven't received any offers. We have had offers from a number of Junior Clubs, but Steve feels he is good enough to play in the Third Division and that is the way it stands at the moment," said the manager.

The OVD semi-finals, as stated above are the ties the punters wanted. The Scottish Pyramid News commented "...and who could have asked for better semi-finals, with the possible exception of Tayport - still in my view, the best junior team in Scotland- not amongst them. But the four finalists won't miss them!"

So, out of the hat came Arthurlie v Kilwinning Rangers and Maryhill v Pollok.

The 'Lie v Buffs tie goes on at Love Street, Paisley on Friday 1 May (7.30pm) and the clash of Glasgow's top duo is on stage the following afternoon at Firhill Stadium (3pm).

It's tough to pick the finalists but the Port Prog goes for Arthurlie v Pollok with the 'Lok perhaps making it a spring hat-trick of winning a vital tie via a penalty shoot-out.

No word yet whether Sky will be televising the semis.



ANDY Sommerville is expected to be manager of the Tayside Select XI which travels to meet the North Region in the Chapman Cup on Sunday 24 May.




