It's the tie of the day, without a doubt, and hopefully will provide an appropriate level of entertainment for what is sure to be a healthy crowd. Surprisingly, Tayport and Hill of Beath have never previously met in a competitive fixture at Junior level. Both defences are extremely experienced and the key to the contest could lie with the side with the ability to take a half chance.

Haws had such a player last season in Billy Spence and this did not go unnoticed by Arbroath boss Dave Baikie. Baiker had fancied Billy for Tayport and, when he moved to Gayfield, the Haws man was one of his first signings. With Spence currently Arbroath's top marksman and well up the Division Three scoring charts he was snip at £4,500.

However, despite the loss of Spence, Haws still carry a potent goal threat through Syme, McNab and Liam Baillie. In defence the towering ex-Brechin City man Brian Kenny is an imposing figure for the visitors and the contest with our own ex-Brechin City man Keith Nicolson at set pieces should be interesting.

Three games a week can stretch any pool and that's the situation Haws find themselves in because of their well documented backlog of fixtures caused by replays and weather related postponements earlier in the season. This will be their sixth game in thirteen days. No problem with lack of match practice anyway.

Tayport shuffled the pack v North End in midweek when Ian Greig, Allan Ramsay and Stevie Ross got the nod from the start in preference to Mark Spalding and the Barries, Gray and Gardiner. With Steve Hutcheon and Steven Stewart back in the frame, it's anybody's guess which players will start. Hutch has just joined the Cupar Fire Brigade and, because it's training night, he was unavailable for Tuesday. [does this mean he'll be turning out for the Scottish Firies as well as the Scottish Posties?] Steven missed out last Saturday because of the Scottish Junior tour to the Republic of Ireland and on Tuesday, family/business caused him to miss out.

This afternoon's tie will be played to a finish with extra time and penalty kicks on the agenda if the tie cannot be settled in regulation time.







TODAY'S VISITORS

Had it not been for the emergence of Tayport FC on the Junior scene, Hill of Beath Hawthorn would have enjoyed unquestioned domination of the junior game in Fife and the east of Scotland during the Nineties. As it is they have dominated the Fife Juniors since winning the first of 23 trophies in 1986 including the Scottish Junior Cup when they defeated Lesmahagow in 1990.

Like Tayport, Haws were born out of an amateur club which was founded in 1975 and have been led since then by manager Jock Finlayson, known as *The Legend*. Another of their similarities with the 'Port is the fact that they have a number of players who have given good and loyal service. Six of the players who collected winners medals eight years ago are still regularly pulling on a Haws strip.

Last season Haws had something of a lean time by their own high standards, needing to find space for only the John Fyfe Cup in their trophy cabinet. This season started off in promising fashion and they looked poised to pick up the first silverware of the season but were shocked 4-3 by Glenrothes in the final of the quaintly titled Peddie Smith Maloco Cup. The OVD Cup trail looked promising until their surprise defeat by Kilwinning Rangers in their quarter final replay at Hill of Beath. Next in the pecking order is the Whyte & Mackay (Fife & Lothians) Cup but the hopes on that front were dashed last Saturday with a 1-0 defeat at Camelon.

Elsewhere in cup football there's a Bardon Aggregates 2nd round tie v Thornton Hibs and a Whitbread Cup 2nd round tie v Kelty Hearts waiting to be played.

However the legacy of a host of OVD replays and postponements is a horrendous backlog of league fixtures. With 80% of the season past, only 9 out of 28 fixtures had been played. With Kelty Hearts and Oakley United, not to mention Newburgh, already with points in the bag, lifting the title is a tall order for Hawthorn. A sixteen man pool, including two goalkeepers, will probably require to be supplemented by trialists when a four games a week card looms towards the end of the season. However these thoughts will not bother our visitors today as they seek to take a notable scalp.



FROM THE MANAGER'S PEN....

Good afternoon and welcome to Tayport for this afternoon's Taycars Trophy quarter final. Firstly, may I take this opportunity to welcome our visitors. Hill o' Beath, like ourselves, have been by far the most consistent team in their region over the last few years. They have numerous league and cup wins to their credit and regularly reach the latter stages of the Scottish Cup. With that in mind I believe we have a very difficult game ahead of us this afternoon.

Ron Nicoll and I watched them lose narrowly to Camelon in the *Whyte & Mackay* Fife & Lothian Cup last Saturday and they are a quality team who are well organised and have a number of very good players. Having said that, I honestly believe we can win the game if we play as well as we all know we can. A cracking game is on the cards which I hopefully everyone will enjoy.

Although I wasn't at last Saturday's 3-0 win over East Craigie, Jimmy Hunter and George Nicol briefed me on how the game went. By all accounts we again had little difficulty creating chances but, in common with some recent games, we did have some trouble converting them. I know that this is sometimes frustrating for everyone, players included, I would be more concerned if we were not creating chances. I was also pleased that we had another clean sheet. At the end of the day, a good workmanlike performance and three more vital league points.

Tuesday evening saw us play host to our nearest league rivals, North End and I am sure by now you are all aware what happened. After an initial shaky first fifteen minutes, we composed ourselves and took a 2-0 lead. Although I don't think that we started the second half particularly brightly, we managed to contain North End but didn't manage to create too many chances ourselves. They then pulled one back. 2-1 with 15 minutes to go but I believe we would have held on to that lead and go on to win. That was when everything went pear shaped

After a tackle on the halfway line the ball broke to Dave Reilly who played the ball through to Steve Ross who was fouled running in on goal. The assistant referee signalled for a penalty but unfortunately the North End player involved in the earlier tackle had sustained a serious injury. With the time taken to treat him including the wait for an ambulance running to 20 minutes, the referee had no option but to abandon the game due to the lack of light. Although I was disappointed at the game not finishing, I am confident that when we do eventually meet North End, we can go on to win.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

TAYPORT V HAWS - THE FIRST MEETING **20 NOVEMBER 1976**

It's over 21 years since the first meeting of Tayport and Hill of Beath - the only previous competitive meeting between the clubs. Haws had been founded the previous season and were playing in the Kirkcaldy & District Amateur League when they were drawn against Tayport in the 2nd round of the Fife Amateur Cup. Tayport had been beaten finalists in the Fife Cup the previous season and were confident of another good run when they were drawn at home to the unknown Hill of Beath Hawthorn.

The match was played on East Common (The Canniepairt wasn't yet open) and Tayport were to pay for underestimating their opponents and went out, beaten 3-1 by the new kids on the block who went on to win the competition that season.

Tayport were looking to extend a seven game undefeated run when the following team ran out to face Haws - Derek White; Bruce Ritchie, Stuart Davie, Graham McLaren, Ronnie Fleming; Bobby McMahon, Stewart Ritchie, Dave Henderson; Ian Howe, Graham Dandie, Gordon Hughes. Gordon Gray replaced Ritchie and Abby Oswald replaced Dandie.

McLaren (proprietor of Clubsport), Howe, Stewart Ritchie and Hughes have all been at Tayport matches this season) Stuart Davie's in Dubai, McMahon's in Canada. Dandie, a prolific scorer for a couple of seasons, was from Guardbridge. The player of the present era whom you could most liken to 'keeper Derek White is Andy Goram - in every respect!

It was the beginning of two decades of success for manager Jock Finlayson who fielded the following players that day. Brian Inglis; George Stein, Billy Maxwell, Derek Murphy, Billy Smith, Tom Hamill, Kenny Reddington, Tosh Wheatley, Malky Hamill, Mike McKee, Billy Hutton. Subs were Willie Spence and Malcolm Whyte.

Tayport led at half-time through Dandie but 2nd half goals from Wheatley and M. Hamill (2) took Haws through.

Although there are committee members from that day still with their respective clubs, the only direct links with the teams are Haws' Smith, now club treasurer, and Tayport's Oswald, now club secretary.



THE HAWS SQUAD

In goal this afternoon will be either **DAVID WESTWOOD**, a cup winner in 1990 or big **MARC GRAHAM**. Graham was the man in possession last Saturday at Camelon and performed well enough to suggest he could be between the sticks again this afternoon.

At full-back will likely be SCOTT BIRRELL. Scott will have played at the Canniepairt before, having been signed from Kinnoull a couple of years ago. on the opposite flank will be the longserving JOHN MITCHELL. Another contender for a midfield berth is one of the Hill of Beath youngsters recently recruited as they build for the future, **JOHN DRUMMOND**, a clever little player who was with Raith Rovers and was expected to go with Jimmy Nicoll to Millwall until the deal fell through.

Up front Haws will select from WILLIE SYME, a key component of the team, top scorer JAMES McNAB and youngster LIAM BAILLIE. The long serving McNab went to Camelon last season but was soon back at Keir's Park. The tall striker, Baillie, was bought from East Fife this season. Also in contention for a place will be MARTYN THOMSON who was signed from Newburgh this season. Defensive midfielder STEVEN McINROY is another of the Beath youngsters who has senior experience. Unlikely to feature today is ROBERT DUNCAN whose work has taken him to Ireland. Duncan, had a spell a couple of seasons ago with Lochee United.





JIM BAXTER - FIFE'S FINEST EVER FOOTBALLER

appened. Scotland's cky left-half, Jim Baxter ollected a pass near his own penalty area and nonchalantly flicked the ball onto his left foot, before juggling it from thigh to boot It was a full 30 seconds before anyone got near ball or man. Even the fabled Twin Towers swooned.

The perpetrator of the most famous keepy-up session of the modern era remembers it well. "It was '67. We were playing England - the world champions, so most people expected us to get cuffed," chirps a perky 'Slim Jim' Baxter.

"But to be honest we roasted England - 3-2 didn't do us justice We were so much on top of the game, I decided to take the piss. Denis and Billy were running around shouting, 'Let's score more goals!' to avenge the 9-3 game in 1961, but I was just enjoying having a fucking good giggle.

Baxter, an incurable prankster, was on the wind-up even before the kick-off. "I congratulated Alan Ball on being a world champion, then asked him in a high-pitched voice if his dad was Jimmy Clitheroe, the squeaky-voiced comedian of the time. Bremner told me this sent Bally off his rocker... and it did. I'd dribble up to him in the game and say, 'Who am 1? Who am 1?' and as I went past him I'd shout, 'I'm the fucking greatest. That's who.' He spent the whole game trying to kick me."

IIM BAXTER WAS NEVER ONE for half-measures, particularly if he happened to be in a pub. And he often was. In fact, doubles were his thing - vodka and barcardi (though not normally together), bets, the League and Scottish Cup with Rangers in '63, a couple of liver transplants, and two legendary triumphs over the Auld Enemy

Baxter played his first game against England at Wembley in 1963, scoring both goals in a 2-1 win. "I never scored two goals, ever, not even in school matches, so to do it at Wembley was pretty special. And I scored a penalty

That was the first penalty I'd ever taken. I remember when I picked up the ball to take it, lan St John and Dave Mackay said. 'Don't miss it.' I told them to trot back to the centre circle for the restart. I knew exactly where the ball was going. The big stage was made for me.

Wembley was right up my street." In many ways, Baxter wasn't the consummate player - he couldn't would do now. I'd fancy ourselves against Walter Smith's team."

Rangers' early-60s dominance of the old First Division, as with the Premier League in recent years, was largely the result of Celtic's failure to overcome their arch rivals in the crunch matches. Baxter by now was the sole occupant of the 'spiv's role' in midfield and at his swaggering best. In 18 Old Firm games, he was "It was the easiest match I ever played in," laughs the Rangers libero. "We thrashed Celtic 3-0"

Influential on the pitch, Baxter was also inspirational off it. When Real Madrid arrived in Glasgow in 1963 for a European Cup fixture, he took it upon himself to act as unofficial Scottish ambassador, welcoming their Hungarian star striker Puskas with open arms Determined to show Puskas a good time, Baxter whisked him off to a party in Drumchapel where the Hungarian - who spoke no English - found himself with a bottle of whisky and a clearly perplexed local girl for company

Gary Sobers, the West Indian cricketer, was a regular drinking partner during Baxter's unhappy spell at Nottingham Forest, the club Baxter joined from Sunderland in '67. They were known locally as drunk and sobers. "I'd lost a lot of my enthusiasm for playing by the time I joined Forest," he admits. "My time there was a disaster."


Baxter, by his own admission was the architect of his own premature downfall. "I loved the booze simple as that " he says

In 1969, he returned to Ibrox on a free transfer from Forest, but the magic had gone and 'the glove' simply fell apart at the seams, "I'd lost it, everything was gone," Baxter says now. "I was never very disciplined. I never trained once in my life, and that was a big mistake When I wanted to play, when I really needed to play, I just couldn't. I finished playing at 30, which was a scandal

"I was never in awe of anyone, not even Pele. Most players weren't even fit to lace my boots. As soon as I got the ball, I was the gaffer,

no matter who I was up against." And few who ever came face to face with Slim would disagree with that. O

weighed just 9st 12lbs, and he used his right foot as a crutch for his left, which he nicknamed 'the glove' Yet he was one of the most talented players ever to play for Rangers.

Baxter began his career as a £200 teenage signing for Raith Rovers. In 1960, aged 20, he transferred to Rangers for a then record £18,000. By the time he left for Sunderland five years later, he was the lynchpin and idol of one of the greatest Scottish club sides since the war.

"Naturally, I'd say that it was the best Rangers team since the 1940s," says Baxter. "The 1963 team played together for so long, that we took some beating. Still

against Celtic," he recalls. "We went to the cinema, but on the way home I stopped off at a casino in Dunfermline. I only meant to stay an hour. But my luck was in, so I stayed all night." After just two or three hours' slumber, Slim Jim set off to join the




