



TODAY'S GAME

The Taycars Trophy has brought a new dimension to the Junior game in this area. Who knows, perhaps the success of this competition will act as a stimulus to reorganisation of the game, even if only at a local level.

To date we've done well in the competition, reaching a semi final and the final but Tayport's name has yet to be engraved on the trophy.

Thornton Hibs will be doing their utmost this afternoon to ensure that things stay that way. Tayport will be equally determined to go all the way, so we should have the ingredients for an entertaining game.

A measure of Thornton's capabilities is the fact that they held Fauldhouse to a 2-2 draw in the Fife & Lothians Cup the other week. A week later Fauldhouse were stuffing Arbroath SC 5-2 in the Scottish Cup 1st round at Seaton Park.

Hibs' manager Archie Wyse has carefully nurtured his side and his shrewd acquisitions are beginning to provide him with a return. Early season form took Hibs to the top of the league and they were a bit unfortunate to go out of the Scottish Cup the other week in a replay after holding Dalry to draw in Ayrshire.

So, it's a confident Thornton team which will run out today against a Tayport side selected from a pool which is still well short of full strength, mainly through injuries and there are a few doubts again today. It has been the story of the season so far but we've buckled to and got on with it, picking up some good results along the way.

In common with the North End Centenary Cup and all local Tayside cup competitions, this tie has to be played to a finish today. Credit must be given to the organisers for introducing this 'decision-on-the-day' rule. Teams which go out in extra time and on penalty kicks may not agree, but it's been a real boon to the administrators. Indeed had it not been for this rule, then the competition may never have been introduced in the first place.

Referee today is Bob Gunn from Invergowrie, who is on the Senior list, and he will be assisted by Keith Smith and Bill Hornby.

Footnote

Playing Thornton brings back memories to the committee of a previous Tayport v Thornton encounter. This was in the Scottish Amateur Cup v Thornton Amateurs at the pitch just down from Memorial Park in October 1980. Picture the scene. Tayport were desperately holding on to their 1-0 lead. The game was in its closing stages when Jimmy Anderson, playing a sterling game in midfield, shouts across to the Tayport bench in anguished tones 'subby me! subby me!' 'No, no, replies the manager, only a few minutes to go, keep it tight.' 'I.. I.. wish I could,' replied Jimmy as he ignored the instruction and raced from the park past a stunned bench. The entire company turned to see Jimmy heading for the adjacent public park loos from where, seconds later, came clearly audible sounds of relief. If anybody has suggested closing down these loos (maybe they have), then they should think again. They could have been that player!

POLLOCK 3 - TAYPORT 1

Diver 26, 36, Elliot 90 Ross H.T. 2-0 Attendance 3523

Sunday, 18th May 1997 At Fir Park, Motherwell

ALL the omens for this match were bad with one exception: the two best junior teams in Scotland were in opposition at Motherwell's neat Fir Park Stadium. But the weather conditions were poor, previous finals had failed to live up to expectations and the resulting attendances had dipped accordingly, so that on this occasion only 3,523 fans came along and the vast majority were from the Fife town.

But that is where the complaints must end. When I left the ground I had to pinch myself to provide my own reassurance that I had seen an absolutely superb thriller. It was all action from start to finish and, if at the end of the day Tayport were a wee bit unlucky to lose the trophy, their team and supporters took their defeat well, probably because their lads had given everything particularly in the second half when their all out efforts deserved a better reward.

The first half ended with the Glasgow team two goals to the good and worth the lead, although the goals were slightly dubious. Both rewarded the opportunism of Danny Diver after concentrated Pollock pressure, the first coming following a corner from the energetic John Morrison on the right. Diver did bullet in a fine header, but it seemed that Tayport keeper Fraser Mann may have been obstructed. Diver's second followed a cross - also from the right - by John Barrett, who admirably atoned for a richly deserved early booking. The ball eluded a static defence and was then returned across goal-by Morrison to be tapped in by Diver, who appeared to be well offside.

With the holders' defence at sixes and sevens it did seem that the right half-time score had been reached the wrong way, but the interval cups of tea seemed to transform Tayport, who totally dominated the second period and were unlucky that a fine shot by Stephen Ross, the 1996 double goal scorer, after a Grant Buist free kick was their only

During this sustained pressure the winners skipper Ian Spittal earned his man of the match award with his last ditch defensive efforts as Tayports well directed shots were desperately cleared in to some form of safety. Spittal even had to survive an accidental punch from his own goalkeeper, which flattened him completely

As Tayport became more and more anxious for an equaliser they inevitably left gaps in their own defence. One was cleared off their line. but when the admirable Grant Patterson was caught upfield after vet another surging attack Craig Cranmer collected the ball on his wrong flank and ran the whole length of the field before unselfishly squaring a short pass to David Elliot, one of the match's many stars, and a well placed shot with his left foot settled the result with only seconds remaining on referee McGarry's watch.



In future, too, it might be a good idea not only for the sponsors to draw a bit more notice to the occasion, but also for the enthusiastic and fanatical groundhoppers to consider a week in Scotland before this match. They would be able to watch junior games of good quality anywhere in the country on almost every evening leading up to the final and would enjoy themselves into the bargain. It is just a thought, lads and lassies, but why not?



TODAY'S VISITORS THORNTON HIBS

Thornton Hibs were founded in season 1934/35 at a time when the country's railway system was in its heyday and Thornton was an important junction on the network. In the same way that Fife has lost many of the railway stations of that era, it's also lost a number of its Junior clubs. The railway may not have survived at Thornton but the Junior football club has and Memorial Park has seen many a stirring encounter.

Hibs didn't take long to make their mark and picked up several honours before Hitler's war took a hand. The Fife Cup in 1936 was followed by the League Championship(E) in 1938 and the Cowdenbeath Cup (now the Peddie Smith Maloco Cup)in 1939. Championships were to follow in 1953, 1959. and 1969. The Fife Cup success was repeated in 1959 and 1975 and the Cowdenbeath Cup in 1960 and 1963.

In the early 1990's Hibs consistently finished in the bottom half of the table but since Archie Wyse, the former Newburgh and St Andrews United player, took over as manager with John McAndrew as his coach almost exactly three years ago, things have been beginning to stir down Thornton way.

Their fifth top place last season with the third best goals for tally was their best finish for many years. Indeed, add two cup final appearances, and it was Hibs' best season for a long time. They won the Peddie Smith Maloco Cup, beating Rosyth 3-0 but went down to Hill O'Beath in the final of the John Fyfe Cup.

In goal for Hibs today will be COLIN CAMPBELL signed from Kinnoull this season. Stand by 'keeper is ex-Dundonald Bluebell veteran MIKE MALLIN. Fullback CRAIG GILBERT is the longest serving player at Memorial Park. The 28 year old signed from Kelty Hearts in 1991. Left fullback CRAIG NICHOLSON, whose years as a teenager come to an end on Wednesday, was signed from Inverkeithing Juveniles.

20 year old centre-back JOHN DICKSON was with the club on a delayed transfer from Dunfermline Athletic but put pen to paper for Hibs when the Pars freed him at the end of last season. Defender CRAIG KIDD joined up from Lomond Vics in 1995. 18 years old defender CHRIS FRANCIS was signed from Raith Rovers and is one of two Hibs players currently being tracked by Dundee FC. The other is another 18 year old, midfielder GARY LAMONT, who was signed from Dunfermline Ath. Team captain is the experienced ex-Lochore Welfare midfield man KEVIN SMART. LEE MCPHERSON signed from Glenrothes Strollers U.21's. Striker ANDY GRANT is into his second season at Hibs after signing from Glenrothes Juniors.

Top scorer is 20 year old NEIL SELLARS who had a spell at Raith Rovers and was snapped up by manager Wyse after being freed from Starks Park. Central defender STEPHEN BRADFORD has played against Tayport before. He was a member of the Dundonald Bluebell team which ended Tayport's interest in the inaugural Taycars Trophy two seasons ago.

ROBERT SELLAR, a 22 year old midfielder, joined Hibs from Kirkcaldy YM U 21's. One of the club's most recent signings is 'old boy' ALAN BLYTH who is yet another who has departed Dundonald this season. The midfielder was previously with East Fife and Glenrothes. Also previously with Glenrothes was JOHN SZARANEK who can play in defence

or midfield. Midfield player ROBERT GARDINER left to join Cupar Hearts in the close season but didn't like things at Duffus and rejoined Hibs a few weeks ago.

Could be then, that Fife will have the lion's share of the 16 places come quarter past four.





FROM THE ARCHIVES

As we know Tayport is in the unique situation of being in one Region yet playing in another. The introduction of the Taycars Trophy has given our club greatly increased opportunities of playing competitively against other teams from the Kingdom.

Prior to the Taycars there was only the luck of the draw in the Scottish Cup. This did afford us, however, the first opportunity of playing competitively against a Fife club. That was St Andrews United in our inaugural season when we recorded one of the club's best results. Saints, under Norrie McArthur and Ernie McGarr, were a fair side at that time. That afternoon has since been described as the day the club came of age in the Junior football world.

Saints were the defending Fife champions at the time, having won the title without losing a game. In the current season they were lying second top. Tayport were lying 5th in the Tayside Division Two having won only six of their opening eleven league games.

The tie which had been postponed on 29 December 1990 was played on Saturday 5th January 1991 in wet and windy conditions, described by The Couvier as 'atrocious'. The newspapers before the tie anticipated 'The Match Of the Season' and afterwards they said 'St Andrews defeated by fine Tayport side'

Tayport lined up- Christie; Malone, Paterson, Irons, Dolan, Wilkie, Coventry, Cushnie, Thoms, D.Reilly and Lamont. Subs were Baikie and Howey.

Ian Christie, George Malone and Kevin Thoms have retired. Graeme Irons is Dave Baikie's assistant at Arbroath. A broken leg at Arthurlie ended Frankie Dolan's Junior career. Grant Cushnie is a retained St Josephs player but hasn't played for over a year because of a dispute with the club. Gary Lamont is playing amateur with Riverside Athletic and Howey, who played very few games, was playing amateur when last heard of.

Sean Wilkie, Dave Reilly and Billy Coventry have since accumulated almost 1000 games between them for the club and are still very much to the fore at The Canniepairt.

Saints squad was Lister, Finlay, Mackie, Martin, McLaren, McCue, Glen, Raeside, Watson, Sheach, Kirkcaldy, Murray and Henderson.

Jock Lister and Mackie are now at Kelty, Raeside went back to Raith Rovers and then on to Dundee. Henderson and Martin are at Newburgh. Glen fell out with the club earlier this season and moved on to Dundonald Bluebell. McLaren is thought to be retired from the Juniors while McCue was at Glenrothes last season.

Sheach is player/manager at Kirkcaldy YM and Colin Murray is now with Kettle United. Still with Saints are Paul Kirkcaldy, Ross Watson and Alan Finlay. Finlay, who was the subject of an approach from Tayport at the end of that season, received a Testimonial against Dundee United last Sunday. He's been known to wonder, whilst gazing into a pint on a Saturday night what might have been, had he encouraged Tayport's interest six and a half years ago.

For the record Dave Reilly gave the Port the lead, keeper Jock Lister netted the equaliser from the spot before DR headed the winner with

ten minutes left.


