TODAY'S GAME

Well, this is billed as the Tayside game of the day. It must be, because *The Sporting Post* have seen fit to send their No.1 Junior reporter to the game at the expense of the local scribe who dutifully reports the games on the Canniepairt week in, week out.

It's the top match of the afternoon because the respective sides are neck and neck at the top of the table. We are trying hard to win back the league title that was won last season by our opponents this afternoon, after five successive 'Port successes as the flag billowing above the pavilion testifies.

Goals were in short supply when the teams met on league business last season. Indeed they were non-existent, both games ending in goalless draws. The games v Tayport were the only occasions on which St Josephs failed to score in the league last season and the Canniepairt encounter was Tayport's only home blank.

The respective defences haven't been so tight this season but Saints still have the league's best defensive record with only eight goals lost in the same number of games. Not surprising considering the experience of the individuals that make up their defence and the fact that the rearguard is largely unchanged from last season.

Goals haven't been so plentiful, however, and, in the league, the Tayport attack is currently the more prolific of the two, with Stevies Ross & Hutcheon, Dave Reilly and Barry Gardiner finding the mark regularly.

A new management team of George Shields and ex-Violet duo Phil Smith and George Sinclair has picked up the reins dropped by Andy Sommerville and Dave Tosney and they will be anxious to prove their worth today.

A drawn match today would suit the other realistic title challengers, North End and Carnoustie. North End are at home to East Craigie while Carnoustie have home advantage v Downfield.

Man in the middle today is Mike McGregor and one of his assistants is his old man, Bill. His other assistant is Jeff Banks from Perth. Jeff is just getting back into action following an eye injury received whilst officiating at a St Johnstone game earlier this season.





OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP REVIEW



Last season's last eight still retain an interest in this season's competition after last Saturday's 2nd round ties. Of the eight, only FAULDHOUSE UNITED aren't certain of being in tomorrow's draw. They will, however start as favourites at LOCHORE today when the teams make a second attempt to get the tie completed, a waterlogged pitch being responsible for abandonment last week.

Two goals from Danny Diver put POLLOK through by the odd goal in three at BONNYRIGG ROSE. ARTHURLIE were made to fight all the way before overcoming Ayrshire second leaguers SALTCOATS VICS. AUCHINLECK, the bookies favourites as usual, made the longest haul of the competition a fruitless journey for BUCHANHAVEN HEARTS who lost 6-1.

GLENAFTON did well to come from behind and get a 1-1 draw at ARNISTON RANGERS. Glens had to make the eleventh hour signing of ex-Partick keeper John Hillcoat after Henry Smith was recalled by Ayr United. Another surprise for the 'Afton faithful was the appearance of Frank McGarvey in the No.9 jersey.

LOCHEE UNITED looked to be cruising into the last 64 when they led HILL O'BEATH by 3-1 with only a few minutes left but a late rally by the Haws secured a replay. KELTY HEARTS, one of Fife's big cup hopes crashed 4-1 at home to BEITH. KIRKCALDY YM had their first OVD win since 1989 when a single goal put the skids under DYCE. Blood and snotters at ST ANDREWS UNITED where ST ROCH'S, who have a 100% record in the Central third division, went out to Tommy Falls' goal. Four sendings off here and an estimated 10 bookings (nobody's really sure but it was a bumper day for the SJFA treasurer who will collect from the clubs in fines, more than they would have received from the 'gate')

KINNOULL continue to struggle and listed only 12 players for their game at HARTHILL ROYAL. A penalty from Devaney was their only consolation in a 1-3 defeat. COUPAR ANGUS took the lead at WHITBURN after half an hour but lost 5 second half goals to go down by 6-1. JEANFIELD did well to win 3-1 at Larkhall against ROYAL ALBERT who have been experiencing a rather better season than of late. There must have been a news embargo at Renfrew where Downfield lost 0-1. Other than the scoreline, the papers had nothing to report.

Tayside's CARNOUSTIE and NORTH END scraped through by the odd goal against NEWBURGH and DALRY respectively but ST JOSEPHS found it considerably easier against ELLON UNITED at Fairfield, winning 5-0. The North Region teams seem to be mirroring the form of their Senior neighbours at Pittodrie. Only TURRIFF, 4-3 winners over BELLSHILL, won against out of the area opposition.

LINLITHGOW ROSE, East Region champions and current league leaders, saw their cup dreams end on the Canniepairt last year but they are up for it again following a good 3-2 win at Baillieston. There was a big shock for their fellow East side Bo'ness United. Having started the season well, Bo'ness were expected to polish off Neilston who presently prop up the Reebok Central Premier Division, but were beaten 4-1.



FROM THE ARCHIVES 15 YEARS AGO - NOVEMBER 13 1982

1982 were halcyon days for amateur football in Tayport. The club fielded three teams every week and all were doing well in their respective leagues. The 1st XI were Midlands kingpins, the 2nd XI played in the East Fife Amateurs and the Strollers XI played in the Midlands Alliance.

That November afternoon it was a strong Tayport which recorded a 3-0 Scottish Amateur Cup 3rd round win away to Lomond Vics at Falkland.

Team was Angus Charity; Micky McPherson, Phil Smith, Alan Hart, Andy McRobbie; Jim Downie, Jim Bissett, Ronnie Whitton; Alan Harte, Ian Howe, Malcolm Graham. Subs were Rab Downie and Ronnie Stewart. Harte, Howe and Graham had the Tayport goals.

Gus Malone, who is in St Josephs' line-up this afternoon, had been transferred the previous week to Brechin City and two weeks later, Phil Smith, Joeys' coach, also went Senior, moving to Forfar Athletic. The Lomond Vics game was actually the last of Phil's 51 games for the 'Port. Apart from Ronnie Whitton, who is in Australia, that team still all live locally.

The Fife XI was also away from home, winning 5-2 at Balmullo Thistle in a East Fife Division One game.


Line-up was Dave Tosney; Colin Gray, Sandy Hamilton, Doug Henderson, Neil Downie; Stevie Whyte, Roy Shaw, Brian Simpson; Bruce Burnett, Gordon Smith and Brian Cosgrove. Subs were Des Docherty and G.Burnett.

Dave Tosney was, of course, a member of Joeys' management team up until a few weeks ago and Gordon Smith is Phil's wee brother. Whyte (3), Burnett and Docherty were the scorers. By the way, if anybody ever sees Des Docherty, tell the treasurer. The sod still owes for a pullover!

The Alliance team was enjoying a good season and on 13/11/82 were chalking up their 7th win in 8 games with a 2-0 home win over NCR with the following team.

George Hayter; Dougie Hill, Davie Blair, Bob McDonald, Dean Anderson; John Falconer, Frank Feechan, Roy Lessels; Roddy McCafferty, Micky Hall, Ian Ness. Subs were Steve Cassells and Rabbie Burns. McCafferty and Cassells were the marksmen.

We had a German, Wilf Pawlik, playing for the Alliance XI that season and this was one of the few games that he missed. He was hardly Gerd Muller or Jurgen Klinsmann but he did manage to notch in a 5-1 win over Newport on 6 November and, therefore has the unique distinction of being the only German to score for the 'Port.




