TODAY'S GAME

This will be Tayport's 53rd Scottish Junior Cup tie but only the sixth against North Region opponents. First was in 1991/92 when we travelled to Aberdeen's Chris Anderson Stadium to beat Lewis United 5-0 in the second round.

Then we beat East End 2-0 on the Canniepairt in the third round in 1992/93 on the way to the final. The other three ties were here on the Canniepairt on our way to collecting the ultimate prize in 1995/96. The campaign opened with a 6-0 win over Banchory St Ternan. Then we were held to a 1-1 draw by F.C.Stoneywood in a 4th round tie but won 3-1 in the replay. In the following round we accounted for the now defunct Bon Accord by 2-0.

Although it's our first meeting with Stonehaven, we were afforded hospitality by the 'Hive when we warmed up at Glenury Park en route to the replay at F.C.Stoneywood two years ago.

While Stonehaven were winning at home to Banks O'Dee in the league last Saturday, we were struggling to make headway against a resolute Forfar West End on the Canniepairt. The supporters will be hoping for better fare this afternoon. The Scottish Cup traditionally brings out a bigger than usual crowd, so hopefully, it'll be a worthwhile spectacle.

Both teams received byes in the 1st round before winning their second round ties away from home. Tayport won 4-0 at Forfar Albion while Stonehaven had a stirring 3-2 derby win against Hermes. Hermes had a good run last season before going down 1-0 to eventual winners Pollok in the 5th round.

Tayport will again be making a late selection. Several players were on the treatment table during the week. Paterson, Wilkie and Hutcheon joined Dave Reilly and Allan Ramsay on physio Andy Bell's list of patients. Stonehaven appear to have no such problems and will be on their usual lines.

This afternoon's officials are from the Fife Region. The game will go to a replay if level after 90 minutes.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS

We welcome Stonehaven FC to the Canniepairt for a first visit in their near 80 year history. The North Region Premier team celebrates its eightieth anniversary in 1999.

It's a fairly experienced squad that manager Derek Allan and his coach Donald Cordiner have assembled at the trim Glenury Park.

In goal will be LEE MELLOUGH who moved over the hill from Banchory St Ternan with whom he appeared here in the opening tie of the historic 1995/96 season. Banchory lost six goals that afternoon so Lee will be anxious to keep things tight today.

In the No.2 jersey will likely be the experienced GARY THOW, now in his second year at the club after signing from Cove Rangers. He will be joined in defence by 30 years old long serving DAVID MUIR and the equally experienced IAN MATHIESON. Mathieson is in his second season at Glenury following his move from Highland League Buckie Thistle.

Also available for a defensive position is DAVID INGRAM who has seen service with a number of North Region Junior clubs. He's in his first season at Stonehaven after signing from Hall Russell United. Two products of the Stonehaven youth team, youngsters PAUL NICOL and PAUL REID give the manager further defensive options but both will likely start on the bench. NEIL YEOMAN, a 23 year old in his second season with 'Hive, can also be called upon to take a defensive role.

Most experienced player on the field today will be 38 years old midfielder MIKE TURNBULL. In his younger day Mike was Senior with Forfar Athletic and Montrose. Has been capped five times with Junior Scotland. He's been 8 seasons at Stonehaven after seeing service at Banks O'Dee. Notched the 85th minute equaliser which set things up for a dramatic finish in the last round.

There's further midfield experience in the form of seasoned Junior BRIAN MITCHELL who has been with a number of clubs, the most recent being East End from where he joined up this season. Only 19 years old but ex-Montrose midfielder STUART ROBERTSON is a key member of the team. In his second season at the club, Stuart is the club's current player of the year. Midfield player DARREN STEPHEN is in his fourth year at the club after stepping up from the Aberdeenshire Amateur ranks.

STUART PETRIE moved from Lewis United five seasons ago and has been a regular scorer. Netted against Culter the other week and was the hero of the hour in the last round with the last minute winner which took his team through to this afternoon's tie. One of the other marksmen that day was striker STEVEN BLACKLAWS who returned to the club this season from Highland League Deveronvale.

DAVID RITCHIE, who has also been amongst the goals in recent weeks, is another in his first season. Also list Hall Russell United as his last port of call. Striker RAYMOND WATT moved to Glenury this season from Inverurie Loco Works.

The striking options are completed by 19 years old ANDREW SKEA, another product of the youth team, and GARY MILLER who was with FC Stonewood last season.

There must be something about, cleaning Mark Spalding's boots and a desire to leave the country and travel! Since we started in 1990 we've had only two bootboys. The first, Danny Oswald, is staying in Belgium, spending this weekend in Holland and is going to Spain at the end of next month. His successor, Cameron Foster, is much further afield. He left earlier this year for India where he's doing voluntary work. He had to raise money for this venture before he went and the club made a small contribution. Cameron sent us a newsletter recently and we reproduce it here for your interest. [p.s. we've got bootgirls now]

Hello from India

Well I've been here for two months now almost half way through my time teaching and everything is fairly rosy. You'd be surprised how easy it is to do three hours work a day and spend the rest of the time lazing around. Right now, for example, I've just started my 4 hour lunch break and I'm sitting at the local tea shack (I think restaurant is too generous - 1 shed, 1 stove, 1 fridge, 2 benches-cum-tables and 6 chairs) waiting for inspiration to strike and my pakora to cool down. All in all things could be worse. It's not all fun and games though, no, teaching is a stressful and arduous vocation. There is a wide range of abilities needed which makes teaching very difficult. There are a lot of new monks from Lahdak who speak little or no English and they have been put in the same classes as those that have been here for a long time. Splitting the class up is difficult, due to the lack of materials I have to pretty much teach the whole lesson, which means that I don't have time to set two lots of work. Other than English I am also teaching Social Studies and a little science. In Social Studies we are doing Early Man and Ancient Civilizations. They seem to like that as I keep the words to a minimum and draw lots of pictures. On Thursdays we do songs and poetry. They're absolutely terrible but they enjoy it, so I just put my fingers in my ears and hope the principal doesn't hear.

Being from the West the monks presumed I would be some sort of football Guru, that was their first mistake. Their second mistake was asking me to play up front in a tournament to which they were invited. Unfortunately the monks had been on a special Puja (literally 'respect') which meant that they weren't allowed out for a month which in turn gave us the grand total of one day's practice. This didn't worry me at first then I got to the pitch where we were playing. No one had told me that this was a proper big tournament with huge cash prize, an opening ceremony, a sizeable crowd and competition who had been training for the last four months just for this tournament... Cobblers.

I caused quite a stir being the only white guy in any of the teams if not the next 100 miles. The commentator ("please remember our motto is fair play, fair play is our motto, I'm glad to see everyone is remembering our motto which is fair play, fair play that's our motto, we believe in fair play in fact it's our motto. Right the next match looks very interesting and let's hope both teams remember our motto of fair play") even gave me a special mention "We even have a player all the way from Scotland. Let's hope he remembers our motto which is fair play..."

Had I been any good at all I would have had a field day as the general standard was not that high but in my defence I would just like to say that a few days earlier I had decided that the tap water didn't look that bad after all and was still feeling the consequences. I did have one golden opportunity. I had the ball, I knew the covering defender would soon be on me so I looked up to pick my spot. Two

huge black cows picked that moment to wander in front of the goal giving me a 2cm squared target area. Primary 7 football training never really prepared me for this eventuality so I was caught somewhat on the hop. They took me off at half time with the score at 0-0 and they lost 1-0 ha! ha! It was a good laugh though and I got a free plate of chow mein out of it too.

DKI is the seat of His Holiness Chetung Rinpoche who is the head of the Drikung Kagyu sect of Buddhism and he is almost as important as the Dalai Lama. We hope to meet him when he comes back from Singapore. At the moment the reincarnation of the Dalai Lama's teacher is staying at the monastery. He is only 14 but because he was so wise in his last life he is treated with extreme reverence and he already gives speeches and teaches the monks. The Dalai Lama is due to visit this monastery on the 21st November. The monks don't seem to be as excited as I am by this news but I think that, nearer the time there will be more excitement. It's sometimes hard to remember that the guys here are monks, everyone's cool and there is no pressure to get involved, in fact I have to do quite a lot of asking before anyone will tell me anything about Buddhism.

The quiet grounds of the Tibetan Buddhist monastery are quite different from the hustle and bustle of Indian city life. India seems to have a higher than average population of mad people most of whom are employed in public transport. Getting from A to B is a whole different pot of pakora over here, it's about as close to anarchy as I want to come. The Sex Pistols may well have rewritten Anarchy in the UK had they been on a rickshaw ride round Delhi. Everything is so different here it's impossible to know where to start so I don't think I'll even bother. Anyway must dash, I have a class in 10 minutes. Thanks for all your support.
