A place in the last four of the Dundee North End Centenary Cup is at stake this afternoon. For Kirrie it is an opportunity to extend their current best ever run in the competition. For Tayport it is an opportunity to reach a fifth Centenary Cup semi-

final.

For their 40th tie in the competition Tayport could not have picked more difficult Tayside opponents than Kirrie who have shown in their two previous games against us this season that they have the ability to make today's game an exciting contest.

Kirrie were as impressive opponents as we've seen at the Canniepairt this season when, in a league game in August, a Hamish Soutar goal rocked us, before we pulled clear with a 3-1 victory. That this was no fluke performance, was confirmed in January when Kirrie became the only club to date to prevent Tayport from collecting full points when we were held 2-2 at Westview Park. Indeed it could have been worse as it took a Kenny Cameron goal, around eight minutes into time added on, to give us a share of the spoils.

Since our first meeting this season, Kirrie boss Wilson Coupar has secured the services of Ross Graham from St Josephs. The Blairgowrie based striker demonstrated in our last meeting the ability which previously persuaded Brechin City to sign him from Lochee United.


For Tayport, with the league championship wrapped up for a record-breaking sixth occasion in eight years, the attention will now be centred on the four remaining cup competitions, starting this afternoon.

Goalkeeper Fraser Mann took a knock against Violet last week, but has been making good progress under the direction of physio Andy Bell and is expected to be between the sticks as usual this afternoon. There is good news too on the progress of the other injured parties. Allan Ramsay is well on the way back to fitness and, although he will still be out for this week, Allan could be back in contention in time for the Taycars tie at Lochgelly. John Young put in a full session on Wednesday evening and will be in the squad today seeking to reclaim his midfield spot.

In charge today will be Ellon based official Alfie Smith and he is assisted by fellow North Region officials Dennis Ewing from Peterculter and Bill Gerrie from Westhill.

The outcome of the tie will be determined today with extra time and penalties if required.







NEXT SATURDAY'S OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP QUARTER FINALS



No beating about the bush as far as next Saturday's quarter finals are concerned. The last four are predicted to be Kelty Hearts, Maryhill, Auchinleck Talbot and Arthurlie.

Looking at the other draws they could have had, it could have been worse for Montrose Roselea, so they won't be too despondent about travelling to Fife and a meeting with Kelty. Despite their excellent showing in the OVD tournament, Roselea will be very much underdogs here. Hearts have a very experienced side but if they do have an achilles heel, it could be over-confidence. If they can't get an early goal, the high expectancy of their fans could work against Kelty. Nevertheless the bookies will go for a comfortable margin of victory for the hosts.

Maryhill v Petershill looks almost too close to call and a single goal, either in a first game or a replay could be all that determines the winner. Maryhill were written off by many after an exodus when supremo Ronnie McDonald took over at Clyde. However ex Forfar Athletic front man Neil Watt took over and has pulled things round and this could just be Hill's year for the cup.

The four ties will all attract crowds well into four figures, more than most of the Seniors will attract outside the SPL, and the top OVD attendance will be at **Kilwinning** where the rejuvenated Buffs take on **Auchinleck Talbot**. These two sides are battling it out for the Ayrshire title and the only points either has dropped in their ten games or so to date was when they fought out a goalless draw over the festive season. In addition the sides met in the League Cup final in the autumn when Rangers emerged 2-1 victors. On the field indiscretions have cost Talbot the services of key players regularly this season and their suspensions could weigh against them. Kilwinning will fancy themselves to do the business on this occasion but I have a sneaking feeling that Auchinleck will shade it.

If it wasn't for the presence of Montrose in the last eight, Larkhall Thistle would be marke down as the outsiders by virtue of the fact that they languish in the middle of the Reebok Central League Division One with a fairly average record. Home advantage will give them a chance against holders Arthurlie but the Barrhead team look like continuing the pattern of the holders reaching and losing- the final the following year. Despite facing only nine men for much of last week's replay with Camelon, 'Lie struggled for long spells and, had Davie Flynn and Christie McKenzie not missed good chances, they could well have been out.

With reconstruction in the air and therefore the opportunity to impress, the Juniors could have done without the shocking challenges which saw two Camelon players sent for a shower before the water had even had a chance to warm up. The fact that it was televised didn't help either. Hopefully next Saturday's ties will be free of the sort of unsavoury action that the newspapers and TV love to associate with the Junior game.



ANDY'S ANGLE

First of all may I wish a warm welcome to the players and officials of Kirrie Thistle and to the Port support to the Canniepairt today for our North End Centenary Cup game.






