

A place in the last eight of the Whyte & Mackay Cup is at stake this afternoon. For Kirrie it is an opportunity to make further cup progress in what has been an excellent cup competition season for the Westview Park team so far. You've got to go back to 1988 for Kirrie's last major cup success, the Drybrough Cup. For Tayport, the Whyte &

Mackay Cup (formerly Currie Cup) had a permanent spot in the Tayport trophy cabinet during the early ninties when we lifted it four years on the trot. However that space has been vacant since 1994.

It won't be easy, however, with Kirrie already having demonstrated their ability to put one over us and they'll be confident again this afternoon. A last eight place in the Taycars and a semi-final spot in the North End Centenary Cup bears witness to their prowess in cup competition this season.

Tayport showed improved form last Saturday at Downfield and as Junicus commented to a Tayport committee man towards the end of the game, "it was two going on fifteen". And he wasn't far wrong. This was despite the absence of Steven Stewart (stitches in a head wound) and Brian Craik (wedding guest) and leaving Ian Greig, who was to play for the Tayside Select the following day, on the bench. All should be back in contention today. John Young is unlikely to be here. Manager Andy Sommerville is unlikely to renew John's contract.

Kenny Cameron, 50 goals chalked up this season including netting in 13 successive games, hasn't been on the mark these last two weeks so will be hungry to get back on the scoresheet. One man who has been on the sheet is Stevie Ross whose strike against Downfield was his 100th in 'Port colours.

Kirrie will be relying on the squad which caused the upset on their last visit to the Canniepairt four weeks ago. An addition, though, will be tall former Brechin City and St Josephs striker Ross Graham who was cup-tied on that occasion. He forms a formidable partnership up front with Hamish Soutar. Big Hammy always seems to do well against us, having regularly found the net in a way no other striker has done against Tayport over the past nine years.

Another problem has been the goalkeeping of Kirrie's Jim Menmuir who invariably excels against us as he demonstrated in this season's league game at Kirrie and more recently in the 3-2 cup victory here recently.

Today's match will be played to a finish with penalty kicks if necessary and (whisper it) the referee is the same official who had the Bankfoot cup-tie the other week.



TAYCARS TROPHY

With the league wrapped up in the wintertime and today's opposition turfing us out of the NEC Cup, the biggest prize remaining for us is the Taycars Trophy. Being drawn away against Hill O' Beath in the quarter finals, we could hardly have asked for more difficult opponents.

The Haws, beaten finalists last season, are suffering from an unprecedented number of injury problems at present and this clearly contributed to their first league defeat of the season on Saturday past against Rosyth. Haws boss Jock Finlayson is a crafty operator, though, and he'll have his troops well drilled for his club's meeting with ourselves in a competition second only to the OVD Scottish Cup in prestige. Supporters should note that this tie will likely kick-off at 2pm.

Interestingly enough the only Tayside survivors in the Taycars Trophy are ourselves and Kirrie. While we eventually did enough to ease past Lochgelly Albert by 2-0 in an instantly forgettable 3rd round tie, Kirrie were winning by the same score at Benarty. A good result for Thistle here against Junior newcomers who have improved dramatically since the start of the season.

Carnoustie were destroyed 4-1 at home by Glenrothes for whom ex Forfar Athletic and Kettle United player Ally Gray and our OVD semi final hero of two seasons ago Steve Hutcheon were amongst the goals. The draw was made immediately after the last round and has thrown up some cracking ties. Kirrie are at home to OVD Scottish Cup semi-finalists Kelty Hearts in what should be another good day for the trackside clubby which has just been re-roofed by Stevie Stewart. Glenrothes host Newburgh and, with both clubs enjoying their best form for many years, it's a tie to savour.

Lochore and St Andrews are hovering around the middle of the Fife League. Lochore have made a dramatic improvement over two seasons while St Andrews United, with a new manager recently at the helm, are in the doldrums. A semi-final place is a great incentive for both. 




