What do we know about Nairn St Ninian? Not a lot. They have been members since 1968 of the 14 club North Region (North Section) *Scotscoup* League whose members are drawn from the Moray coast and the Spey Valley. Don't be misled by Nairn's self penned description of them being 'a small family club'. Whilst this is undoubtedly true, it doesn't disguise the fact that they are currently one of the top teams in the North Section.

Runners-up in their division last season, Nairn's best finish for many seasons, early season cup success already this season has meant they've only played three league games. However they are unbeaten in these games and come to the Canniepairt on the back of a six game unbeaten run in all games, including their first ever away win outside their Region, a 3-1 win at Kirkcaldy YM in the OVD Scottish Cup earlier this month.

Nairn, one of the principal clubs in their League, have over the years, forged close links with two Highland League clubs, neighbouring Nairn County and Inverness Clachnacuddin. Most of the Nairn St Ninian players have links with these Senior clubs, either at the start or the end of their careers.

We should be warned then that this afternoon's trip isn't just a rare jaunt south for Saints and Tayport will have to be on their guard. Recent games have seen Tayport take a wee while to get to grips with their opponents and they will be looking to make more impact early on.

Injuries to Grant Miller, Mark Spalding, Sean Wilkie and Brian Craik mean that Andy Sommerville's selection will be a late one. He is hopeful that at least one of the quartet will start. The absence of unavailable striker Kenny Cameron, 19 goals in his last 9 games, will put the pressure on his fellow strikers to deliver today. A niggling injury has meant that Dave Reilly hasn't started the last three games but he hopes to be in from the start this afternoon.

Steve Ross has been buzzing these last two matches and will be eager to continue his good run. Brian Craik, if he recovers from injury, will be looking to break his duck. With a goal strike average at Carnoustie Panmure of better than a goal every two games, the No.19 will be hoping that it's seventh time lucky today. The boss, of course has a further option should Birdie not make it. Mark Corcoran, after nine appearances as substitute, is standing by to make his first start of the season.

Defensively the Tayport manager has plenty options should skipper Wilkie not make it with Ian Greig and Paul Reilly anxious to see some action.

Referee today is the familiar figure of Doug McCorquodale from Perth and he is assisted by veteran assistants Alfie Forbes and Bill McGregor.

Benburb v Bonnybridge o 'Brig were very much on a high last season despit an uncharacteristic OVD defeat at - would you believe it - Kello, whom bens just managed to beat over two games this month, Managers, Jim Hardie(Linlithgow) and Bill Hutton (Lochgelly Albert) have moved on and senior players, Davie Wilcox and Charlie Kelly(goal), took over, I can only see Benburb, playing well under Hugh Burns, and with Troon pairing, Kevin Gribben and Alan Jack, giving them the elbow again. But it will be tough.

Lochgelly Albert v Vale of Leven o Bill Hutton recently installed as the manager at Albert and making guick changes, including bringing Graham Hillan from Bonnybridge. They will make it very tough for Vale' who rely on Joe Goldie and Alex Howie.

Dalkeith Thistle v Troon o "Westsound" recently opined that Troon should be "too good" for Thistle. But recent results, following the signings of Bobby Forrest, Ian McNaughton and Ritchie Johnstone by Allan O'Connor, have been very good at Dalkeith - now promotion candidates. John Redmond has his side back to full strength, including the recent move of striker Tom McKenzie from Auchinleck Talbot, but results are still patchy.

v Shettleston Stonehaven o "Hive" have been going well in all competitions but lost here 1-4 to Sunnybank in the premier division race. Town were, of course, relegated last season but are showing all the signs of going back to the Reebok premier under Dennis Curran.

Thorniewood Un v Lewis United o Former Albion Rovers boss, Tom Spence recently took over at Viewpark and has yet to make an impact on their poor form. Lewis gave a very good account of themselves at Glenafton last year and must be favourites, though they lost their star schoolboy striker, Martin Bavidge, to Caley Thistle.

Musselburgh Ath v Ardeer Thistle o Athletic were promoted last season after parting with Doug Bell (now at Kilsyth Rangers) and they have had a storming start to the Div 1, losing only once in six outings. Thistle must draw or win here to salvage something from their season, which is beginning to fall apart.

Thornton Hibs v Maryhill o This could turn out to be quite a cracker, given that Hibs have annexed the Peddie Smith Maloco Cup already, beating Hill O'Beath in the final.

Yoker Athletic v Camelon o Athletic have been struggling to keep their heads above water for a couple of years now, in what should be a good football area and their win at New Elgin will have given them a lift - which is what they will surely need against the former champions, despite some patchy form.

Rosyth Rec. v Larkhall Thistle Rec have been coming back to the top under new management, including former Whitburn player, carlo Crolla, but they were shocked here 3-4 in the Fife and Lothian Cup by Lochgelly. Rob Crilly's Larkhall are capable of doing the same, but it will be a tight contest.

v Broughty Athletic o The Mike Galloway revolution almost killed Tranent, who should be a big club. But they soldier on, recently going out of two cups in the east. Broughty will find it a step up despite establishing a strong promotion challenge in the NCR Div 2 under Gary Strachan.

Bathgate Thistle v Rob Roy o Rob Roy are struggling to regain the form of a couple of seasons ago, but showed mettle in winning a replay at Kirrie Thistle - which we forecast. The creamery park side are a tougher hurdle and betting men may attach some importance to their manager - one William Hill. Both have excellent facilities and personnel and should be higher up the football tree.

Irvine Victoria v Jeanfield Swifts o Dave Brannigan's Swifts gave Beith a wee fright before going out at Bellsdale by a big score. Vics will need to close them out at the first attempt and having Robin "Spider" Jamieson back is a big

Linlithgow Rose v Arbroath SC o Jim Hardie and Eric Sinclair are trying to put together a top side, but have been hampered by too many changes and some injuries, notably, to International 'keeper, Ronnie McPherson - out for the season - and ex- Amiston (21 goals last season and a target for Allan Rough's Glenafton) Roddie McDonald, just coming back from a preseason injury. They will struggle here - to keep the score in single

Kilsyth Rangers v St. Anthony's o Should be a win for Dougle Bell and JOhn Flood, though the Ants have tested bigger clubs this season. The Govan side are pre-occupied with finding a new ground, which - everyone knows

is in the shadow of Ibrox stadium and part of a massive re-building programme in the area. Let's hope they find a new home before June - maybe near neighbours, Benburb, could help.

Downfield v Irvine Meadow Much talk again in Ayrshire about Meadow being on the march, They certainly should be a much bigger force in the game. Spiders have a solid record in NCR Div 1 and won 2-4 at Longside in the first round under Peter Castle, His opposite number, Ward White, will not be expecting an easy game - maybe in the replay?

Blairgowrie v Naim St.Ninian Blair had a great win at Elmwood in Round 1, as did Naim at Kirkcaldy YM. It is even Stephen, with the North side, now coming back after losing top people to the almost extinct Naim County a couple of seasons ago, just favourites.

Hurlford United v Inverurie Loco o I intend to write to the Kilmarnock Standard imploring the people of the area to come out and support this game, because I think United have a chance here. Loco have just lost their manager, lan Mackay, who had been there only a short time and some of the players, like veteran hit-man Jim Findlay, are getting long-in-the-tooth. Hurlford upset Rob Roy here a couple of seasons back with a poorer side and have put a lot of work in at Blair park, including a new pavillion. They deserve a fair

Kilwinning Rngs v Strathspey Th o I don't think this will be the double figures some pundits are predicting. The North side are ambitious and have made an impact on the North section since coming in a few years ago. Junior incompetence could see them in the Highland league instead, but yes, Buffs should be a few goals better.

G.Perthshire v Lochee U - Orm o Stuffy Perthshire have alarmed a few sides and nobody like to go to their ground anyway. George Grier will expect to take Lochee United away with a narrow win. But it will be tough.

Burghead Th v Bonnyrigg Rose o Quite a few big clubs have been sent to the far north this season - a complete reversal of the previous few years of the competition. Rose are almost completely ex-Berwick Rangers players and the good Burghers will be pleased to see them, if only for one game.

Cumnock v Coupar Angus o Target practice for 'Nock's new ex-seniors, I would be alarmed if the tally did NOT reach double figures against Tayside's bottom club. Billy Whitefield is much frustrated by the club's lack of

recent success in this competition.

Crossgates Pr v Blackburn Un o Blackburn had a fine 5-0 win over Dundonald in the first round and even though they must travel. Crossgates are not as good.

Oakley United v A.Winton Rovers o Oakley coming back to form this season and Winton are struggling as badly as in much of the previous decade despite their top league status. I can only see a big home win.

North End v Blantyre Vics o John Markie's side had a great season in winning the Tayside title and losing in the final of the DNEC North and Tayside Cup last year. But they didn't do well in other cups and were shocked 0-1 in the OVD 4th round by Larkhall Thistle, Blantyre were in the semis two years ago and shocked Bo'ness in the last round with a fighting 1-2 recovery. But it remians to be seen what effect the removal of Stuart Miller and appointment of Armadale Thistle pair, Martin Clark and John Brogan, will have at castle park. This could be a real cracker.

Whitburn v Lesmahagow o Just when Whitburn look to be sweeping all before them, they suffer a shock defeat. So it goes. 'Gow have done nothing great this season, but still have the men to hit somebody hard like ex-Celt, Dougald McCarrison - if the opposition decides to pussyfoot around, 'Burn have a big pool of quality players and have yet to find the right side. But they should still win.

East Kilbride Th v Forfar West End o Thistle should also be a big club and they are really cheating punters by asking them to pay at Show park. This should give them a chance to step the pace up a bit against a struggling side.

Lossiemouth Un v Petershill o everyone will want this played at the bigger Grant Park - and rather auspiciously, Lossiemouth were due to play a home league game against Clachnacuddin on Nov 7, which will now be cancelled because Clach are in the North Qualifying Cup final also due on Nov 7. So there you are. My big mate, Jim George, will be really pleased to here that. He'll be able to get some kip on the way up.

Auchinleck Talbot v Dalry Thistle o Both clubs continue to strengthen their pools but without any sign of going anywhere. There has been too much whingeing from the respective managers and fans about referees, etc, etc, and it is time they both just got on with the game. If they can do so, this might be

a great tie - and one of them might get somewhere.

Bishopmill Un v Armadale Th o Thistle are greatly disappointed at losing Martin Clark and John Brogan after being relegated last season. And that could have a major bearing on this game. With Elgin City due to be at Fort William on Nov 7, the game could be at Boroughbriggs with a sizeable crowd.

Forres Thistle v Stoneyburn o I expect to hear from Thistle about printing the once-a-year results pages for this tie. Stoneyburn should come away with a handsome win.

Dundee Violet v Sunnybank o Possibly a very good tie and just a pity that there will be a wheen of big ties in the area at the same time - a point that Junior football will, surely, take on board before it goes down the tubes ? Dundee United host Motherwell on Nov 7 and there will be much interest in Dundee at Celtic park. Couldn't some of the five OVD ties in the city move to Sunday 8th.?

v Haddington Ath o I don't expect anyone will give Kinloss much hope of causing an upset. Athletic are not on best form but are conveniently placed to "fly" in and out of this venue.

Buckie Rovers v Bankfoot Ath o Bankies are favourites to win this on our form book. But these long trips can have a big bearing on things. Rovers were 2nd and 3rd in recent seasons, but lost four home league games last season.

Annbank United v Beith Rag-tag and Bobtail versus Godzilla. you have to fel sorry for Bankies, who don't get the local support. Beith liked their quarter-final so much last year, they want to do it again.

Dunbar United v Wishaw-Greenk o Greenock won't frighten Dunbar. who have started a bit of a giant-killing act this season, Hill O'Beath amongst the victims. They also beat Glenrothes in the last round here.

Forfar Albion v Tayport o 'Port seem to draw Albion in just about everything and actually beat them 0-4 in the same round at the same venue last season. Can't change that.

Kilbirnie Lad's v Dunipace o Ladeside have made a better start to this season after some dour struggles since John Minford took over. They've lost a couple of players, especially, International striker, Alex Eadie, to Pollok but should still have too much for 'pace. Jim Harkins' side has pulled in a few u-21 players and maybe in the Div 2 promotion race, but still lack experience.

Cambuslang R. v Baillieston o A tough local derby, with Peter Miller's men not playing as well as last season, whilst 'Ton reached the final of the Beatons League Cup. however fortunately. This could go to a replay and penalties, where Hugh Farrell is becoming a legend at Station

Largs Thistle v Hill O'Beath H o The Largs coaching staff have a bit of preparation work to do for the visit of the former champions. The big Beath travelling support will find plenty of seats and the ice-cream at Daniella Nardini's Grand-parents place is tip-top. I can only see a big win for Jock Finlayson's troops.

v Neilston o despite being North section champs two years running, I can't see the Banff men holding the Beatons league cup winners, even at home. Neilston will be amongst the favourites when the third round draw is made.

Johnstone Bgh v Lochore MW o Lochore Improving after a merger with the local amateurs and with ex-Hill O'Beath international, Bobby Wilson, who recently had 600 at a testimonial against Dunfermline at Hawthorn, now in the side But Burgh have been on the honours trail recently and with talent like John McLay, recently the subject of a huge transfer bid, they should be in the third round OK.

Ab. East End v Mont. Roselea Both sides on a par and hoping to get back to their respective top divisions this year. The Aberdeen men must be slight favourites on venue alone

v R. Glencaim o Glens came, saw and conquered Muirkirk in round 1 and they are a damed sight better than Darvel.

Ellon United v Cruden Bay o Ellon are making a wee bit of a revival this season by leading the East Div 1 title race in Aberdeenshire. But Bay have been there, seen it, done it and should go through.

Fauldhouse Un v Renfrew o A sticky wicket for lan McLeod's

Renfrew side with Fauldhouse beginning to show some top-rate form in the east Div 1. The Reebok side will probably look to draw at best.

v Kelty Hearts Glentanar The former amateurs have begun to find their feet, but are still a couple of leagues below Kelty.





# FROM THE ARCHIVES SATURDAY 2 NOVEMBER 1968 THIRTY YEARS AGO

NOVEMBER 1968 when you could still get eight nips for a pound, the Beatles and Mary Hopkin were in the charts with *Hey Jude* and *Those Were The Days* respectively and *The Good, The Bad and the Ugly* film theme was at No.1.

Jocky Scott, Joe Gilroy and John Duncan formed the Dundee FC strike force, Graham Hill had just become World Motor Racing Champion and Canbuslang Rangers were on their way to appearing in the first of five Junior Cup Finals in a six year period. The 12 team Dundee Junior Association was in its death throes, regionalisation of the associations taking place the following year.

Tayport Amateurs were on their way to the Midlands Division Two Championship, a first ever league title for the club after 21 years in the Midlands. At that time the team was picked by a selection committee which comprised Tam Laing, Abby Walker and the coach/trainer, RAF Sgt. Keith Wort.

The committee was Fred Janssen (chairman), Abby Oswald (secretary) Iain Bell (treasurer) and committee members Doug Henderson and Ronnie Laing.

On 2nd November the team was going for its 14th win in 15 games since the start of the season when they came a cropper in the second round of the Scottish Amateur Cup, beaten 2-1 on the East Common by Angus Amateurs side St Mungo.

Team that afternoon was Derek White; Walter Kemp, Jim Mathers; Ronnie 'Bingo' Laing, Jim Scott, George Ritchie, Abby Oswald, Andy Johnstone, Ian White, Doug Henderson and Raymond White.
