Last Saturday's OVD Cup exit was a bitter blow to the Gowfers who, by all accounts underestimated Lewis United. That defeat will serve only to make Carnoustie more determined than ever this afternoon. Their hopes of league success this season basically hinge on the outcome of today's game.

Unless a keeper was signed earlier this week, the veteran ex Spider **Grant Clark** will be in goal. Brian Anderson went to Forfar Albion earlier this season to be replaced by ex Dundee 'keeper Barry Thomson. Thomson, however, signed last midweek for East Stirling leaving Clark sole contender for the No.1 jersey.

Any team with a back four which can include former Seniors Gus Malone, Gary Ogilvy and Stewart Forsyth must be respected and it's on this experience that manager Lex Richardson will be relying. Others in contention at the back are ex Forfar Albion full back Jon Durie and ex Tayport Amateur of some years ago Keith Galbraith who was signed from Blairgowrie a couple of seasons ago.

Perhaps the key player in the Gowfers line-up is another who has worn a Tayport jersey, the enigmatic **Gary Christie**. Midfielder Gary was one of Dave Baikie's early signings in 1990 but failed to adapt to Baiker's strict regime and was allowed to leave within months.

Gary Mearns signed from St Josephs this season as did former Scottish Amateur internationalist striker Ronnie Kenneth who returns today following a period of suspension. Goals are also expected from the pony tailed ex Lochee United & Scone player Murray McDowall.

Last week's goalscorer was **Sean Christie** who has been farmed out to Panmure by Forfar Athletic. Sean took his place in Scottish Football history when he became the youngest ever outfield player to appear in the Scottish Senior game when he turned out against Berwick Rangers in November 1995 aged only 15 and some days. Another farmed out from the Seniors is **Gavin Tinley** who is with East Fife.

Striker Greg McGill completes the quintet of ex-St Josephs players in the Carnoustie pool. 'Del' arrived at Westfield via Violet arriving in exchange for Danny Powell.

Dean Reid, Wayne Morrison, Glen Knox and Jamie Tosh complete the Carnoustie pool for this afternoon's game. Defender **Paul Goodman** is still an absentee after injuring a knee against North End early in the season and **Kevin Longmuir** is only available on occasion when his shifts as a bus conducter with Strathtay permit.

TODAY'S GAME

It's our last game of 1998, it's not yet Christmas and after today both ourselves and Carnoustie will only have 9 league games to play.

It's a crucial game in terms of the destination of the league title as looking over the past ten years in terms of points dropped by the eventual champions, statistically either Tayport or Carnoustie will win the league!

Therefore there is much to play for and with bags of experience on either side and with both clubs putting the emphasis on the finer points of the game, the supporters will surely witness an enjoyable encounter.

Carnoustie statistician Dougie Mitchell will be first to point out that although Carnoustie may not have been consistently successful in terms of trophy hauls over the past few years, and have lost out to Tayport on many occasions, they do have the distinction of being the team which has inflicted on Tayport our heaviest ever defeats, both at home and away, 5-2 at the Canniepairt in 1994 and 6-3 at Westfield in 1997.

This afternoon promises some interesting on-field contests, with ex-Gowfer Allan Ramsay likely to be in direct opposition to his former teammate playmaker Gary Christie. This time last season defenders Gary Ogilvy and Gus Malone shared a St Josephs dressing room with Kenny Cameron but today they are in direct opposition. Similarly John Young and Gary Mearns were teammates at Fairfield Park but today they lock horns for the first time with their new clubs.

One player determined to show his mettle this afternoon will be Brian Craik. Brian moved from Westfield to the Canniepairt earlier this season after successfully appealing against his retention and has already been amongst the goals, eight to be precise, and will be anxious to add to that tally at his old club's expense. An injury sustained at Forfar West End has restricted Brian's action these past two weeks but he will be hoping to start today.

Not starting today will be Grant Miller who is out 'til the new year with ligament damage. After sustaining a nasty injury at Gretna, Grant had just fought his way back into the side when an injury at training put him out again.

It's a welcome back to the Canniepairt for Carnoustie physio Pud Hill, physio at Tayport for several seasons in the early 1990's.

Referee this afternoon is Mr Allan Thurston from Broughty Ferry. Dr. Thurston was in charge of the Camelon v Kilsyth Rangers 3rd round OVD tie two weeks ago.
