THE SPORTING POST BLOWS IT AGAIN

With no Premier League football last weekend, one would have thought that the *Sporting Post* would have taken the opportunity of trying to fill what was going to be a very obvious void in their publication- especially after not publishing for two weeks. (That in itself was a bit bizarre - no Sporting Post on Jan 2nd despite a full Scottish and English Senior card).

Does anybody at the SP take a look at the Junior card and try and work out what the top game(s) of the day is/are likely to be? It would appear not. The very obvious game of the day last Saturday was 3rd top Kirrie v top of the league Tayport. You hardly need to be Gerry McNee to be aware of that fact. Kirrie were after all the only team to have scored v Tayport in the league this season. The punters seemed to think it was the top game anyway, because it pulled out the best Tayside crowd of the day.

Not so at the SP however. Whilst a pathetic few words at the foot of a column on the Junior page was all the Kirrie v Tayport match merited, we got two huge photos of Violet playing St Josephs with, as usual, no names on the caption. And huge headlines and a lengthy report on a totally meaningless Broughty v Blairgowrie match watched by a couple of hardy souls. (no disrespect to these teams intended) Surely , though the interest in watching reflects the interest in reading.

The SP seem to think that 'big is beautiful' as far as the Junior page is concerned. I can just hear them. Boss, there are a few games off this afternoon, what will we do? Och just stick in another photo to fill the space. Later. Jings, boss, there are even more games off. Oh never mind, what's the most meaningless game of the day? Broty v Blair. Right, then, treble the size of the headline and increase the size of the report '. I don't know who the SP think they are kidding but falling sales will clearly give them the message that the punters aren't fooled.

No way did the tiny report on Kirrie v Tayport do justice to the way the game unfolded. It had all the ingredients for a readworthy report - penalty and a disputed goal (was it over the line, was it not?) to have the 100pc league leaders trail by 2-0 with 35 minutes left. Tayport sub scores with his first touch to reduce leeway, the match goes deep into injury time with Kirrie hanging on desperately before the Region's top scorer equalises in 95 minutes. Does the following report reflect that? I think not.

Thistle share points

KIRRIE THISTLE played host to league leaders TAYPORT and opened the scoring via McKENNA. Half-time—Kirrie Thistle 1, Tayport 0.

Kirrie stunned Tayport with a second when the ball crossed the line following a goalmouth scramble with WILSON getting the credit.

Port substitute CRAIK pulled one back on 57 minutes and CAMERON thumped home the equaliser. Final—Kirrie Thistie 2, Tayport 2.

It's almost - in fact, it is - embarrassing to see the punters in Tayport queuing up as they wait for their SP to be dropped off the bus at the local paper shops at 6.30pm on a Saturday and realising they are to be met with such a poor quality production.

Whilst our grade of football is grateful for any media coverage, I would respectfully suggest that, without much effort, great improvements can be made in the SP coverage. For example.

- 1) Determine in midweek which games are of the greatest interest/importance and grade accordingly. If necessary in consultation with Tayside Match Secretary.
- 2) Get the correspondents for the 'top' games to phone in the teams prior to kick-off which can then be included with the match report.
- 3) Send the photographer to the 'top game' not just the game 'round the corner from Dens or Tannadice' because it happens to be convenient.
- 4) As all the junior games finish at least half an hour before the copy deadline and mobile phones are as common as muck these days - there should even be an opportunity for the editorial staff to make a general comment on the days proceedings, highlighting the shocks and top stories from the day's card.

TV, radio and teletext are increasingly keeping everybody up to date with what's happening in the Senior game and this pinch is bound to be felt by the SP sales. However what we don't get from TV & radio is good Junior coverage. An improved Junior coverage in the SP might just help arrest these falling sales. It's worth a try. As the old cliche has it nothing ventured, nothing gained. It would be sad for the old SP to slip away without a fight.

TODAY'S GAME

All being well this afternoon should see new ground broken at the Canniepairt with TV cameras here for the first time covering the match for tomorrow's **Scotsport** programme.

Back in 1990 when the club announced its intention to join the Juniors, the club's pre-launch publicity brochure stated *inter alia* "It is the Committee's intention to create a Junior team of some standing, a team of which the community can





be proud......." We've probably done that but the old maxim, you're only as good as your last game, still holds good. It is imperative, therefore that we - both Tayport and Camelon - produce the goods this afternoon. It's not just the eyes of the local community that are on us - and we want to give them something to remember the day by - but the eyes of Scottish soccer. So, if the teams can serve up entertaining and exciting fare this afternoon, then we'll be giving the Junior game a big boost

and in so doing perhaps give credibilty to those who are anxious for change in the structure of the Scottish game.

This is the teams' fourth meeting and there's nothing to suggest that this tie will not be as closely fought as the others. There are a number of survivors of the cup final meeting in both camps. Six of the Camelon players who played on Sunday 12 May 1996 are in their squad today while Tayport have eleven of their 14 that day in today's pool.

The teams boast two of their respective Region's top scorers in their line-up. Kenny Cameron notched his 38th goal of the season at Kirriemuir last Saturday while in Davie Flynn, Camelon have one of the East's ace marksman. With 25 goals, David is only two behind Whitburn's Colin Campbell at the top of the goal charts.

Tayport didn't start with Paterson, Wilkie and Craik at Kirriemuir and it remains to be seen if they're in today. Grant Miller was in last week's squad but, having missed out most of the season to date through a couple of bad injuries, it's likely he'll have to again settle for a place on the bench.

Camelon haven't had competitive action since 19 December when they won well at Haddington and it's unlikely that they'll show many changes from their line-up that day.

Tayport will be in unfamiliar blue this afternoon. When the clubs' colours are similar, the home team has to change. The names which are on the backs of their normal jerseys would have been particularly helpful today but Camelon, quite understandably exercised their option to play in their first choice strip and will, therefore, be in red.

THE CARMUIRS SOUAD

Manager GEORGE FAIRLEY has been at the helm for most of the 1990's and in that time has elevated Camelon Juniors to, and maintained them in, the top echelon of the Scottish Junior game.

ALAN BANNER - (Goalkeeper) Experienced ex-Senior with St Mirren and East Fife, Alan has been the last line of defence at Camelon for the past 7 seasons and has the badges to show for his efforts. His

back-up is ALAN FRASER the former Tranent goalie who keeps in trim by helping the Seniors out from time to time in midweek reserve games.

CHRIS CAMPBELL - Close season signing from Bannockburn Amateurs and played his early games in midfield before settling into the right back role. STEVE TENNANT - Another new signing, fixed up this season from Armadale to take over the No. 3 shirt which had previously had an array of occupants. The 32 year old was ten years a Senior with Clyde amongst others.

GRANT TIERNEY - 37 years old central defender and vastly experienced having served Hearts, Dunfermline, Partick and most recently Livington with distinction before signing on at Carmuirs just over a year ago. Weighs in with the occasional goal as he demonstrated against Arniston earlier this season.

DOUGIE SMITH - Came on as substitute v Tayport in the '96 final. Has since left and then returned to the club to hold down a regular place mainly in the sweeper role. **CRAIG GILLAN** - First season after signing from Cambusbarron Rovers amateurs and a candidate to team up with Tierney in central defence, possibly at the expense of Smith.

JIM ELLIS - Played in the 1995 & 1996 finals. Thereafter his work took him out of the area but has regained a midfield place on his return to the fold this season.

GORDON ABBOTT - Teenager who was previously attached to Falkirk. Has rekindled his enthusiasm for the game as an attacking midfielder whose performances this season have seen him catch the eye of the Scottish selectors.

JACK ROSS - 22 years old midfielder who played for Lochee United against Camelon in the Tannadice OVD semi-final in 1995. Moved to Carmuirs the following season but did not get off the bench v Tayport in the '96 final. Has made the No. 8 jersey his own this season.

CHRISTIE McKENZIE - Livewire left side attacking midfielder whose performances in the 1995 Cup run earned him a step up to Alloa but that trip across the Forth proved shortlived and he was soon back at the Mariners. Junior and Amateur international caps.

DAVID FLYNN - 31 years old striker who has consistently been amongst the top scorers in his years with Camelon. Played in both Cup Finals. Hit four goals as Camelon beat Kilsyth in the last round. Shiftwork saw him move to Bannockburn Amateurs last season but he returned this year still with a keen eye for goal.

MARC FALCONER - Flynn's striking partner who signed early on in the season from Armadale This. Prior to that he had three seasons Senior with Queen's Park and Clyde. Ten goals so far this season.

KEVIN HAMILL - Had a midfield role in the 1996 final but has not held down a regular starting spot this season. **CRAIG REYNOLDS** - Was a regular in defence at the start of the season but has invariably been on the bench in recent times. Signed form Sauchie Juniors. **COLIN WILSON** - Had a tough time with injury and yet to get back into the starting line-up. Signed from Kilsyth in '96. Senior with Stenhousemuir.

SCOTT ROSS - Close season signing from Oakley but injury has restricted his availability. SCOTT TIERNEY - Brother of Grant. Currently suspended



IT WASN'T ALWAYS A FOOTBALL GROUND

Developed as a football ground by this club during the latter part of the 1970's, The Canniepairt had been allowed to grow wild for much of the post-war period. Prior to then, however it supported a small farm and the following poem describes what it was like to stay there.


Oot tae the shore and ower tae Lucky

Dunbar have the ex Hearts striker Wayne Foster in their ranks but he'll be faced with a trio of erstwhile Senior opponents in the Kelty line-up, ex United, Hibs & Luton defender Dave Beaumont, ex Dundee and Raith Colin Harris and the former Par and Brechin player Ian Heddle. *Verdict - draw*.

FC STONEYWOOD travel to meet LANARK UNITED and, had the game been at Polo Park, my money would have been on FCS but, despite their relatively lowly Reebok Premier placing, Lanark don't give goals away easily and I take them to shade it. *Verdict - home*

LEWIS UNITED look like being lambs to the slaughter at Dunterlie Park against holders ARTHURLIE but at the hospitality at Barrhead will be some consolation. Verdict - home

BONNYRIGG ROSE's major close season recruit was ex Dundee & Livingston striker Graham Harvey and he's repaid the club's investment with a barrowload of goals. Harvey looks to be the main threat to a **BEITH** side looking for a third successive fifth round appearance. *Verdict - draw*.

With Camelon boss George Fairley's brother, Brian, in charge at WHITBURN. one of the best Cup fancies, the outcome of their tie at home to KILWINNING RANGERS will be of more than passing interest to our visitors today. This tie will attract the best attendance of the round and if they can keep 'Stormin' Norman Montgomery quiet, Whitburn could just carry the day. Verdict - home.

BATHGATE THISTLE's reward for ending North End's interest is a home tie with **CUMBERNAULD UNITED** and a last 16 place beckons. *Verdict - home*

One of six ties in the Lothians is the meeting of LINLITHGOW ROSE and GLENAFTON ATHLETIC. Glens, still under the stewardship of Alan Rough, have been starved of their OVD fix these past three seasons. With Henry Smith in goal and the recent recruitment of ex Celt Tony Shepherd, they've got a stronger squad than of late and have set their sights on a return to the glory days of the early 90's. Rose, however, still crave the success denied them by Tayport these past two seasons. Despite the recruitment of ex Hearts & Man. U. defender Graeme Hogg, Rose disappointed last week in losing three goals in drawing with lowly Dalkeith. Glens, by contrast won at Beith. Verdict - away.

Our old adversaries **CUMNOCK** are also visitors to the East Region where they meet **FAULDHOUSE**. There's been a lack of match practice recently for Cumnock and their hopes could well be ended by a home side in buoyant mood following their Heineken Cup win at Dunbar last Saturday. *Verdict - home*

AUCHINLECK have appeared in only two finals in the 90's. Since the second of these in 1992 they have flattered to deceive and there will be mutterings from the Beechwood Park faithful if that record doesn't improve soon. Certainly a visit from STONEYBURN, replay winners over Bankfoot, should hold few fears. Verdict - home.
