





# PRESS REPORT

PRESS REPORT today is from last week's Falkirk Herald and gives us the opportunity to look at the recent OVD tie from a Camelon perspective. The photo accompanying the report is overleaf.

.... 1 CAMELON JUNIORS. TAYPORT JUNIORS...... THE difference between delight in winning and the despair of defeat was there for all to see as Camelon ran out worthy winners of this 4th round OVD Scottish Junior

Cup tie at Canniepairt.

Buoyant Mariners' gaffer George Fairley was being interviewed by STV while just yards away striker Davy Flynn — whose two goals had earned Camelon a place in the last 16 — was surrounded by reporters with notebooks drawn.

In stark contrast was the sight of a traumatised Tayport side who trooped off in silence into the pavilion and past the Camelon dressing room where the celebra-

tions were already in full swing.

Back in 1996, the Camelon players had felt exactly the same despondency as the home team after two extra-time goals had seen Tayport defeat the Mariners to win the OVD Scottish Cup, but this time round the boots were well and truly on the

And revenge was indeed sweet for the large Camelon support who made up almost half of the 1,400 crowd. Not only did they see their favourites come good but they also enjoyed an added bonus thanks to the local bookmaker who had a

stall just inside the ground and even at half time was offering odds at 7/4 against Camelon.

As he found to his cost, the Mariners' faithful have never been afraid to put their money where their mouth is and after the game there was a long queue of Camelon men waiting to be paid out.

Make no mistake. Camelon were well worth their victory against a Tayport side who went into the game boasting a 22 game unbeaten run since the start of the season,

scoring 98 goals in the process.

Thirty eight of those goals had been scored by Kenny Cameron. He made it 39 from the penalty spot but he couldn't upstage Camelon's avenging angel Flynn, who had already netted twice to put the Mariners well and truly on the road to victory.

A fierce wind — which felt as if it had blown through a canyon of icebergs to reach Canniepairt — whistled down the park and Tayport had to contend with that and a bright sun at their backs as play got underway.

The home side pressed forward in the early stages but

\* the Camelon defence was rock solid.

Try as they might, free scoring Tayport could find no way through although there was a scare when Cameron threatened to break into the box before being pulled back by Grant Tierney. That earned the big man the first yellow card of the game but Cameron followed suit before the free-kick could be taken for trying to claim a penalty that

As play wore on there was an unmistakable air of confidence about the Camelon side. They had clearly been well



briefed by assistant manager Allan McGonigal who had run the rule over the Tayside bigshots

He had done his homework well and this was reflected in the Camelon tactics which were carried out to the

letter in a superb team performance.

Tayport were allowed the freedom of possession in midfield until they made a move toward the danger area where Grant Tierney, Dougle Smith, Stevie Tennant and Jinky Campbell formed a solid defence.

They broke up every move while in midfield Jack Ross, Jim Ellis and Gordon Abbott were always available for the forward pass that would set up a Camelon attack: There were no goals in the first half but Camelon came closest with McKenzie, Falconer and Ellis all hav-

ing chances.

After the break it was Camelon's turn to enjoy wind advantage and in the 58th minute a flick forward by Tennant saw FLYNN race in on goal only to be tripped from behind by Nicholson. The referee had no hesitation in pointing to the spot and the bold Flynn slammed the resultant penalty kick beyond Mann in the home goal.

Given their earlier lack of success against the Camelon defence this gave Tayport it all to do and in the 71st minute they were left with a mountain to climb. The tireless McKenzie played the ball forward to workaholic Marc Falconer who lofted a high ball forward which Nicholson could only head high into the air and there was ace predator FLYNN stealing in behind to send a first time volley into the net past the outrushing Mann.

Ten minutes from time, Tayport pulled one back through CAMERON who netted from the penalty spot after Grant Tierney was adjudged to have handled the ball

This made for a nervous last few minutes for Camelon connections but their fears were unfounded. Keeper Alan Banner and his defence answered every question Tayport could ask and only a good save by home keeper Mann low at his left-hand post denied Flynn his hat-trick three minutes from time.

# FROM THE CTUB'S ARCHIVES

Back in 1971 the club ran two teams in the Midlands Amateurs. The 1st XI, having flirted with relegation the previous two seasons following promotion, was in the third of what was to turn out to be 25 seasons in the top division. This corresponding Saturday **twenty eight years ago** Tayport played a league game on the East Common against Harris FP. The team at that time didn't have a great deal of flair but they did scrap and battle for every point. They managed a 1-1 draw that afternoon thanks to a goal from Richard Redpath.

The line-up was Derek White (an uncanny resemblance in style to Andy Goram and his goalkeeping was pretty good too). Jim Mathers (due to retire this year from Brown Construction where he is plant manager), Eddie Stewart (present club chairman), Ian Dempster (a student from the Art College), Jim Scott (played hard, looked hard, drank hard, was hard), Ian White (midfield artisan of the team now living in Cupar but was here for the Camelon game), Abby Oswald (present club secretary), Doug Henderson (50 this year but still playing and still as frustrating as he was then according to his Veterans XI teammates last week. Rarely misses a Juniors match here at the Canniepairt) Jimmy Lindsay ( then known as Jim the Hair but now it's more like Jim nae Hair. Has been prominent in local rugby circles for many years and is a gaffer with the DHSS in Dundee), Richard Redpath ( missed half his career through suspension or at least it always seemed that way!), Ian Paterson (another art student, best remembered for delicately removing Port Supporter Bunter's teeth with his left peg during an under 16's match at Balmullo) Sub was Frank Leslie (so injury-prone, he was once carried off after sustaining an injury in the pre-match warm up against Lawside FP at Macalpine Road). Soon to take a place in the team that season was another art student, a character by the name of Tony Gillespie. Tony made a memorable debut against Timex at Harrison Road. As kick-off approached, the lads were becoming anxious at at the non-arrival of their promised new player. Just on kick-off, however, Tony appeared on his bike at the brow of the Timex brae. He had cycled all the way from Edinburgh for the game. There was a fairytale ending for the big and slightly eccentric student - he scored the goal in Tayport's 1-0 win.

Neither of the top scorers that season, **George Ritchie** and **Tony Bloomquest**, were playing that afternoon. Goals weren't that easy to come by, it would appear. The top scorers only managed eight goals each. Tayport, though, finished in their highest ever league position - sixth.

Top scorer for the Alliance XI, who didn't have a game that particular afternoon, with 16 goals was **George Bryson**, now Fire Chief for the Isle of Wight. Player of the Year was **Derek White** and Alliance Player of the Year was **John Porter**, currently Dundee Council's Head of Architectural Services.

The club committee met in the Scout Hall in those days on Sunday afternoons. Committee present were A.Oswald, R.Redpath, I.Bell, D.Hughes, E.Stewart, F.Bremner & A.Boitz. Among the matters discussed - a Coffee Morning had raised £58, Christmas Raffle £32 12/6d and the club had £148 in the bank (about the same as we've got now). Tickets for a dance on 26 February were priced at 35p [ D(decimal) Day was fast approaching] and Eddie was instructed to get a band, cost not to exceed £20. The changing hut on the Common had been broken into and the gas meter raided. The matter was in the hands of the Police. The meeting decided on the accommodation for the proposed new changing rooms.





# WHAT DO WE KNOW ABOUT GLENTANAR?

Next Saturday's opponents Glentanar are the Scottish Junior FA's newest recruits. As such we know very little about them and the only track record we have to go on are their results against 'known' opposition in the Scottish and North End Centenary Cup in this, their first season in the Juniors.

Don't dare call them a pub team now but that's how it all started for Glentanar back in 1978 when a squad of lads - or should it be loons - who were regulars in the Glentanar Bar in Aberdeen, decided to form their own football team. The rest, as they say, is history.

Starting in Division 7 of the Aberdeenshire Amateur League, Glentanar climbed their way through the divisions until they reached the Premier Division. Once there, they consolidated and established the club as one of the best in the association.

The club had greater ambition, however, and the sights were set to reach a higher plane and they applied for membership of the North Juniors. Three times Glentanar were knocked back, the reason being that it would mean an uneven number of clubs in the League. When Bon Accord suddenly announced in the close season of 1997/98 that they were folding, Glentanar seized their opportunity and, with a year to prepare, applied again the following year and on this occasion were successful.

They have recently built a clubhouse and taken residence at the Woodside Sports Complex which they share with Aberdeenshire Rugby Club. Glentanar is not just about the Junior team, though, the club also runs boys' teams from Under 10's right through to Under 18's.

Glens knew the step-up would be tough so they signed a couple of experienced Juniors from FC Stoneywood and Sunnybank. By their own admission they are doing better than expected and are holding their own in Division One. With a record of P10 W3 D3 L4 F21 A18 Pts.12, they have concentrated on keeping things tight at the back. Coach Mike Crawford is involved with the Coerver Coaching Schools in Aberdeen and the techniques are taking a trick with the Glentanar squad.

So, how did they get on in the Scottish and NECC? In the Scottish they were unfortunate to draw Kelty Hearts and went down 0-3 but were praised in defeat by their opponents. 


