Tabletopping North End are our visitors this afternoon and they come to the Canniepairt defending an unbeaten record for the season. Like ourselves, they have recovered from a couple of dodgy draws in their opening three fixtures to put together a sequence of three wins on the trot. Indeed the sides take the field today with identical records, although in the league, the Dokens have played a game more, one of our games being a cup tie.

North End showed that their top of the table placing in 1998 was no fluke by staying in the top two, albeit as runners-up, last season. This season again, they are well equipped to put in a strong challenge and this will be demonstrated in this afternoon's game.

One of North End's victories on the road was an impressive 5-1 win at Bankfoot where the locals conceded that they were well beaten by an on-song outfit which would have won by an even bigger margin had it not been for the form of home keeper Walker.

Tayport stuttered a bit early on before eliminating Violet from the Taycars, putting four past Montrose and then ending early Premier leaders Kirrie's 100% record with a first class performance last Saturday. These results achieved despite having a depleted pool from which to select.

Graham Nicoll, signed from Newburgh at the start of the season is settling in well to his new club and has been on the mark in each of his last two starts. Missing today will be Grant Buist and Brian Craik who are both still on holiday.

Sean Wilkie, Steve Ross and Keith Nicolson were all out for last week's win at Kirrie but are likely to be back in contention for a place today

It all points to an entertaining game this afternoon as the league's best defence looks to deny the league's most potent attack.

Taking charge of the game are officials from the west of Scotland who have been drafted in as part of the SJFA's policy to give referees the opportunity to gain experience in other associations.







ANDY'S ANGLE

First of all I would like to welcome the players and officials of North End to Canniepairt for our league game today.

Last week saw us put in our best performance of the season against an in-form Kirrie Thistle. Going into the game we were four points adrift of our opponents and a loss would have meant a seven point gap. Even at this early stage of the season a seven point gap would have left us



with a mountain to climb. This is the reason it was vital for us to win. Not only for the points but for the psychological side of things. If they had beaten us, it would have given them the self belief to go on and beat other teams in similar fashion. So, not only did we win the points, but we took the initiative from them and put an element of doubt back into their game.

The Tayport players need games against this standard of opposition, because it definitely brings out th best in them. They approached the game with the correct attitude and thoroughly deserve all the credit for what was a superb performance.

If last week's game was crucial in retaining the league, then this week's game is even bigger. We must now get consistency into our play. We have to build on all the good work done last week and there could be no bigger obstacle in our road than North End. In my opinion it is fitting that today's game will decide who will sit top of the league. Like ourselves, North End, whilst unbeaten, have drawn two games and will be desperate to put on a good show and establish themselves as title contenders. This is by no means a winner take all encounter, but it will go a long way to deciding which team will take a big advantage into the rest of the season.

This is the reason I would publicly challenge my players to once again rise to the occasion and give the same commitment to this game as they did the previous game. If they do that I can guarantee they will get the same enjoyment out of the game. Another pleasing aspect from last week was the partnership of Graham Nicoll and Kenny Cameron, both of whom scored. Lately, for various reasons, we have had to chop and change players in almost every position on the park. One player who has featured recently is Ryan Sochanik who came in to deputise for Fraser when he had flu. Ryan is a tremendous prospect and it is not surprising that he is interesting a few senior clubs. On a lighter note it may interest you to know that the average age of the substitutes on the bench for the Kirrie game was seventeen - one 16yr old and two 18 yr olds -excluding Sean Wilkie, of course!

FROM THE ARCHIVES

1984

Fifteen years ago the club was in the midst of a ten year spell when it was running three teams, competing in the Midlands, Midlands Alliance and Fife's Kingdom Caledonian Leagues.

This corresponding Saturday in 1984 the Midlands team was drawing 2-2 at Carnoustie. Team was George Hayter, Alan Gauld, Graeme McPherson, Rab Downie, George Wilson, Jim Downie, Stevie Whyte, Willie Brown, John Fernie, Stuart Davie and Derek McDonald. Subs were Allan Harte and Mark Whiteside. 15 years on all these players have retired. Gauld and Wilson, it will be recalled, travelled from Brechin each week to play. Indeed, of the starting XI that day only Stuart Davie actually resided in Tayport at that time.

The Fife XI were having a year out of the East Fife Amateurs and had their one and only season in the Kingdom League. It was a tough league for what was essentially a second XI and 'Port went down 1-8 at home to Star Hearts. Tayport lined up Brian Smith, John Aitken, Davie Blair, Alan Hart, Ian Lees, Ronnie Stewart, John Squire, Ian Ness, Roddy Davie, Ian Howe, Colin Robertson. Graeme Dempster and Colin Gray were substitutes. All apart from Keeper Brian Smith, now with NCR Amateurs, have retired. Brian, it will be recalled, kept goal for Tayport when we won our first trophy in the Juniors, the Perthshire Advertiser Cup.

The Alliance XI weren't in action that day but their regular line-up at the time was Neil Ferrier, Neil McLeod, Scott Crichton, Frank Feechan, Jimmy Brunton, Neil Robertson, Lyall Clark, Joe Myles, Roddy McCafferty, Stuart Turnbull, Roy Lessels. Again all the players here have since retired from the game.

At a committee meeting held that week among the items discussed were proposed plans for a pavilion extension, a Euro trip, staging our own International Tournament and a proposed barrier around the pitch. Team Manager Drew Herd had just been suspended for four weeks by the Midlands AFA Executive Committee after falling foul of a referee. It was noted that the chairman had put Bobby Waddell, assisted by George Norrie, in interim charge of team selection.

Donaldson's Timber had presented the club with a spnsorship cheque to the tune of £400.




