





Punters will have noticed the brighter look to the Canniepairt since the last game. That's down to the now retired Andy Bell, ably assisted by Kenny Coutts, putting in a good few shifts with the paint brush since we last played at home way back on 16 October. Well done, lads.

Several clubs managed some friendly action over the last week or so when the Junior card was suspended for the Scotland v England match. Bankfoot even managed to find foreign opposition in the shape of Lyckeby from Sweden who went down 2-1 to two Barry Ward goals. North End had a workout against Hill Of Beath.

Tayport FC successfully appealed to the SJFA against the fine levied by the Tayside JFA for an article in the Port Prog earlier this season. The club had been fined £100 but this was halved following a hearing in Glasgow.

Cupar Hearts, whose form the Kingdom Caledonian League has been on an upward spiral since the appointment of ex-Hill of Beath star Brian Ritchie as player/manager a couple of seasons ago, have accepted an invitation to participate in an international tournament in Liege, Belgium in June. Tayport Amateurs will be in the same city at the same time, competing in a similar international tournament. Although Tayport look unlikely to be able to send a team to play in a Veterans' Tournament in Belgium at the same time, the organisers have said that the club has an open invitation to participate should the situation change.

Whitletts Vics were on the wrong end of the OVD 2nd round's highest scoreline when Tranent hit 10 goals past them without reply. Maybe not too surprising considering the Ayr team had travelled to East Lothian with only ten men.

Ex-Tayport player Billy Coventry has signed for Elmwood after negotiating a transfer from St Andrews United. Covy moved from the Canniepairt to Recreation Park last season but asked away from the Fife side in the close season and hadn't played for them since.



Graham Nicoll, with a brace, also managed to get on the scoresheet in a game which Tayport won with much to spare


The low point of the afternoon was Niçoll's dismissal, following a tussle on the right wing. This marred the youngster's recent run in the team, which brought

1978

We look back TWENTY ONE YEARS to 1978. At that time the club ran two amateur X1's in the Midlands AFA. It was the era in which social clubs were booming. The breweries were throwing money at sports clubs and encouraging them to build social clubs.

Junior clubs, in particular, were keen to get on the bandwagon but the boom didn't last. The Junior scene is littered with the legacy of those days - Violet, Lochee United and Carnoustie Panmure, for example, in our own area and many more throughout the country. Some, of course, stayed the pace and still flourish today. In 1978 the only 'singing and dancing' type of social club in Tayport was the now demolished Royal Britich Legion Club in William Street, so a plan was hatched by Tayport FC to build their own social club. James Donaldson & Son, at that time the

Tayport-based timber merchants and sawmillers, saw this as an opportunity to provide a social facility and agreed to provide the ground on which the club would be built.

Plans were drawn up, forms of intent were completed by prospective members and the finacial backing of Lorimer's Brewery was put in place. It seemed all systems were go when the above advertisement appeared in The Courier on 6 September 1978. But at this point when Lorimer's Brewery became the subject of a takeover, the offer of finance was withdrawn and the project was abandoned.

House were eventually erected on the proposed site in Henderson Street then Donaldson's Timber pulled out of town after 100+ years to concentrate on their Leven-based operation.

One wonders how things would have panned out had the social club plan come to fruition. One thing is pretty certain. If the Social Club had survived until 1990, it would surely have blossomed during the past ten years we have been in the Junior FA.

Ironically, Andy Phin, now mine host at *Cobies*, had been earmarked as club steward and, instead of entering the new Millennium as a publican in Tay Street, he could have been entering 2000 running what surely would have been called *Phinnies* along the road in Henderson Street.





Tayport manager Andrew Somerville was relieved to escape Aberdeen with a win but has set his sights on much higher goals.


"Stoneywood were unlucky and should have got more from the game as they made us fight hard," said Somerville.
