



TAYCARS TROPHY 1999/2000 SECOND ROUND

It's a warm welcome to the Canniepairt for Crossgates Primrose from the other end of the Kingdom. It is, of course the clubs' very first meeting.

Tayport, having collected the scalps of Bardon Aggregates Fife League clubs Glenrothes, Hill of Beath, St Andrews United and Oakley United in the last eight months or so, will therefore be considered by Primrose as a major here today.

Manager Brian Lindsay and his assistant John Duncan are seeing steady improvement from their charges and will out to spring a surprise. Tayport have been giving little away in terms of goals against in recent weeks, but will be under no illusions that the first goal this afternoon will be crucial. That was certainly the case in recent cup ties at Longside and Shotts Bon Accord.

Although in the bottom half of the Bardon Aggregates League, Crossgates are a team capable of providing a shock and Tayport will be well warned in that regard.

Manager Andy Sommerville will still be without Graham Nicoll and Paul Reilly who are both recovering from injury, but otherwise should have a strong pool from which to select. Stevie Ross has withdrawn his transfer request and, having played half a game last week at Forfar, could feature again this afternoon.

Having a full - or nearly full - squad brings its own problems and the manager will no doubt be thinking long and hard about his selection, fully aware that those players who don't start the game will be unhappy and desperate to get their chance to come on and show that they should be first choice.

The referee this afternoon, Mr Munro, and one his assistants, Mr Laird, are in charge of our game for a second successive week. Both were officiating at Forfar West End last Saturday.

As with all cup-ties apart from the OVD Cup, today's game will be played to a finish, with extra time and penalty kicks if required.

TWO TAYSIDE CLUBS' HOPES STILL ALIVE IN THE OVD CUP

Carnoustie aren't in the last eight yet but they will have a better than even chance of getting there this afternoon when they replay against Shotts Bon Accord at Westfield Park. Shotts may have been misled by the Gowfers lowly league position, but they'll now know what to expect this afternoon. Grant Miller, a OVD Cup winner with Tayport, showed he's the man

for the big occasion with the opening goal at Hannah Park after only three minutes - and a header at that! Danny Diver then struck twice to put Shotts in front but, with substitutes, another ex-Port OVD Cup winner Barrie Gray and ex Harp striker Stevie Higgins on as substitutes, a late equaliser from the latter capped a great away day for Carnoustie.

By all accounts it was blood and snotters at Cumnock where the locals progressed at the expense of Ayrshire rivals Kilbirnie. 'Nock won 3-1 but it wasn't the football that grabbed the headlines. This quote says it all "A full scale brawl broke out that ended with the floor [of the pavilion] covered with glass from framed pictures that were smashed off the walls, and the wall splattered with blood from Rodden's [the Cumnock player allegedly punched by an opponent whilst entering the dressing room] face."

Three off at Cumnock and also three off at **Benburb** where the locals ended **Larkhall's** hopes by 3-0. Bens' ex-Pollok player Dougie Fontana was first to go followed by Thistle's McQuade before Bens went 1-0 up. A second from the penalty spot before a second sending off for Larkhall and then a third goal for the Bens settled things.

Thrilling stuff at **Neilston** where **Whitburn** went 2-0 up in only 20 minutes. Neilston pulled one back before the break. Their second half pressure finally paid off with an equaliser in 85 minutes only for the Burnies to breakaway and net the winner in injury time.

Fife hopes ended with the 2-0 defeat of Thornton Hibs at Lanark United. With Arbroath SC, Newtongrange and Johnstone Burgh going through last week, there's only the Carnoustie tie to be decided. Port Prog predictions weren't too bad with five out of seven correct, Glenafton and Neilston letting the side down. So that's three Central Region, two East Region, one Ayrshire and hopefully, two Tayside teams through to the last eight.

The draw for the quarter finals which are to take place on 11 March will be made on Grampian TV on Sunday, probably during 'Football First'

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Actually not from the club archives today but some hitherto unknown information on junior football in its infancy in Tayport from the turn of the last century. The following was picked up from Eric R.Thomson's Internet site on the history of Fife Junior Football on

www.geocities.com/sjosta/

Mr Thomson's research reveals that junior football was played in Tayport 100 years ago. Although Tayport played a season in a Fife League, at the turn of the century Tayport played mostly in the Angus League. However in season 1900/01, they played in Forfarshire and Tayside cup competitions but were members of a five club Howe of Fife League along with Ancient City Athletic from St Andrews, Kettle United, Tayside Albion from Newburgh and Wormit.

In 1903 Tayport even boasted two junior sides, Tayport and Craigmore who both played in the Angus League but somehow Tayport still managed to meet Kettle United in the Armitage Cup. The following year Tayport United (an amalgamation of Tayport and Craigmore?) reached the 4th round of the Scottish Junior Cup and the following season played in the East of Scotland Cup which seems to have had entries from the Lothians to Aberdeen but Tayport went out in the second round.

In 1907 'Port were back in the Howe of Fife League, now with 14 teams, and carried the Fife flag furthest in the Scottish Junior Cupthe 4th Round. "Plus ca change" notes Mr Thomson!

In 1909/10 Newport also had a Junior team and Guardbridge United beat St Andrews City to win the Jannetta Cup. The following season Tayport were now in the East Fife Junior League along with the likes of Balgonie Scotia, Buckhaven, Leslie Hearts and Rosslyn and were still bidding to be the first Fife team to win the Scottish Junior Cup but, although going furthest of the local Junior sides, went out in the 3rd round. Next season, 1912/13, Inverkeithing United became the first Fife side to win the Scottish Junior Cup. Tayport would have to wait another 83 years to get their hands on the Holy Grail.

The Great War saw many junior clubs go into abeyance, many never to return, but Tayport did return and there is a record of their participation in the Scottish Junior Cup in 1919/20. (to be continued in a future edition of Port Prog))

ANDY'S ANGLE

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the players and officials of Crossgates Primrose for our cup game today. This is the first time the teams have met in any capacity and it is always interesting to play against and meet new players and teams. Hopefully we can put on a good entertaining game for both sets of supporters.

Last week's game was the third time we have played Forfar West End this season. On the previous two occasions it was two nil in our favour.



The game last Saturday looked like it would be the same type of game with us dominating but failing to capitalise on this dominance when leading only by Kenny Jones' goal. The second half was to become a different affair with us converting three more chances to make the scoreline reflect our dominance in open play.

This has been a problem for us in previous games, converting the chances that have been created. The three games in the league that we have drawn so far this season bear that out. Downfield, Carnoustie and Elmwood were all games that we should have won convincingly. We did not close the door on these teams and failed to protect a one goal lead, ending these games with one point as opposed to three.

Don't get me wrong. These views are not a criticism of any individual or department of the team. We can, however, do with a bigger goal threat from the middle of the park and we could be more composed in front of goal when the strikers are presented with an opportunity. It's a Catch 22 situation. You need confidence to score goals. To gain confidence you need to score goals.

We went a long way to gaining that confidence with six goals in two games from Kenny Cameron and a goal from midfield from Steven Stewart, who once again has been called up for Scotland duty. Long may this continue. I should also inform you that our young goalkeeper Ryan Sochanik has turned down the chance of going full time with a local Senior club. He feels it would be more beneficial for him to stay at Tayport where his game has come on by leaps and bounds since being coached by Dave Tosney. This is great testimony to Dave's training and management methods and I forsee a bright future in the game for Ryan.

It also pleases me to inform you that Stephen Ross has withdrawn his transfer request and wishes to remain at Tayport. I know he was frustrated at his lack of appearances but Tayport is all about a squad of players and I know Stephen will be pushing everybody hard to regain that starting place. There is nothing wrong with a good healthy competition for places.




