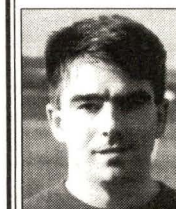

TODAY'S GAME

CONCEPT GROUP TROPHY 3rd ROUND

TAYPORT v CARNOUSTIE PANMURE

It's the meeting of Tayside's top two this afternoon as the only two championship contenders meet in the third round of the Tayside/North inter-regional competition. Tayport, of course, are the holders, knocking out today's opponents in last season's semi-final, before accounting for Lochee United in the final.

Both sides had comfortable first round wins, Tayport beating Luncarty by 7-1 in Perthshire and Panmure winning 8-0 at home to Forfar Albion. In round 2, the two teams were playing only a mile or so apart in Aberdeen. Carnoustie had the taller order but came out on top by the only goal of the game at Sunnybank. Tayport struggled early on at Aberdeen Lads Club but pulled away to get through to this stage by 6-2.

Under Kenny Cameron, given the unusual title of 'tactics advisor' in the Carnoustie programme information release, the Gowfers have had an excellent first half of the season, winning seventeen of their 23 games to date, drawing the other six. In addition they have reached the last sixteen of the Ovd Cup, and play at Shotts Bon Accord in the fifth round next Saturday. Representatives of Shotts are likely to be in attendance her today.

Tayport have won 21 of their 23 games to date, losing one and drawing one, the draw being in the league at Carnoustie. With eight of the players likely to feature having worn the colours of both sides to add a bit of spice to the occasion, the stage is set for a titanic struggle.

Carnoustie come here on the back of a hard grafted OVD win at Thornton, a game in which they weren't at their best by all accounts, and a home victory with two goals in the dying minutes to win 2-0 at home to Kirrie in the league last Saturday.

Carnoustie have experience where it matters in keeper Bobby Geddes and defenders Gus Malone and Gary Ogilvie while at the other end Kenny Cameron and Darren Bonella have something of a monopoly in the goalscoring stakes, the latter taking on a new lease of life since his move from Downfield.

Tayport have been rattling in the goals in recent weeks but it has to be conceded that the opposition hasn't been of the highest order. Nevertheless the football has often been a delight to watch but today will be a test.

As is the case in all Concept ties, this game has to be played to conclusion this afternoon, with extra time and penalties, and that could well be the scenario.

THE CONCEPT GROUP TROPHY

The Concept Group Trophy, the North/Tayside inter-regional competition, has its third sponsor since its inception back in 1988/89 and Tayport have the distinction of being the only club to have won the tournament under three different sponsors, Zamoyski, North End Centenary and last year, Concept.



The competition has been dominated by Tayside clubs, the Region having provided 19 of the 24 finalists in the 12 year life of the competition. Only in the inaugural season has the North produced a winner when Deveronside from Banff came to North End Park and defeated hot favourites Downfield by the only goal of the game.

St Josephs, now no longer with us, have the best cup record, 4 wins in 4 final appearances. Other final appearances with wins in brackets have been Tayport 4 (3), Downfield 5 (2), Forfar West End 2 (1), Kirrie Thistle 1 (1), Deveronside 1 (1), North End 1(0), Violet 1 (0), Lochee United 1(0).

Tayport are by far the top scorers in the competition with 128 goals for the loss of 28 in 45 ties in ten seasons. 'Port have been the main scourge of the North Region with 16 wins in 17 ties against North opponents, a 1-2 home defeat by Banks o' Dee in 1994 being the only blemish.

The record score in the competition is Sunnybank's 23-0 humiliation of Inverurie Juniors in 1997/98. The sides met the following season and the next best scoreline was recorded, 15-0. Inverurie are now defunct. No surprise there, then.

Tayport's best is 11-1 v Kinnoull in 92/93 and 10-0 v Elmwood in 95/96. Tayport's seven defeats in the competition have all been by the odd goal.

Panmure's best season in the competition was last season when they reached the semi-final when they lost to.....Tayport, 1-3 at Westfield Park. The best win of the Gowfers' 30 ties in the competition was last season's 8-0 success over Aberdeen East End. Worst defeat was way back in 1988/89, 0-6 at Downfield.

ANDY'S ANGLE

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the Cannie-pairt to the players and officials of Carnoustie Panmure for our cup-tie here today.

The game today is shaping up to be a cracker, with Carnoustie pushing us all the way in the league and having an excellent run in the Scottish Cup. Their confidence must be running high.



The fortunes of our opponents have changed dramatically this season. Last season they were not playing to their true potential. I say this because, in my opinion, Carnoustie have always had good players at the club. The problem was the application of these players and the big difference now is obviously the appointment of Kenny Cameron snr. as team advisor. Although this is a strange title, his experience of the Senior game has brought them valuable qualities. These qualities include discipline, fitness, organisation and most of all, his tactical awareness which is top drawer. He has the ability to make decisive changes to formation and personnel during a game that can turn the eventual outcome to their advantage. This coupled to some astute signings such as KC jnr and Darren Bonella makes this Carnoustie team a different proposition altogether. I'm sure David Laing will be happy that he is now seeing some return for his involvement over the past few years as Carnoustie's main custodian.

In last week's game against Elmwood we were pushed all the way. You may think this is a strange statement, taking into account the eventual scoreline. The way the game was played meant there was no quarter asked or given. As the game was so physical, there was no fluency in either side's play and this led to the game being stopped on a regular basis for infringements committed by both teams which, in a football sense, made it a less entertaining game than in previous weeks.

Spider's All Stars 1 Tayport FC Veterans XI 2

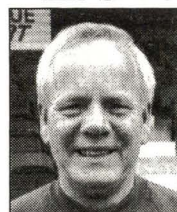

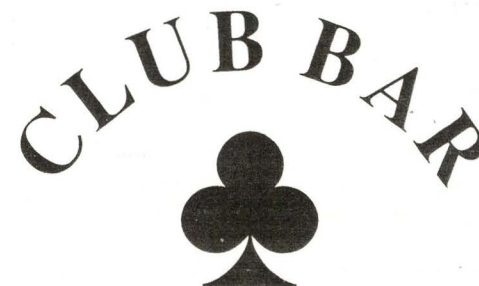
