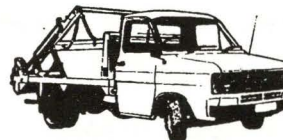

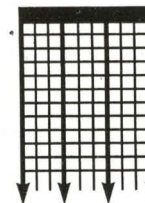

NORTH END CHALLENGE CUP v DUNDEE VIOLET

quarter final tie

Today's North End Challenge Cup quarter final tie is a repeat of last season's inaugural final which Tayport won by 6-3 at North End Park. Both sides have undergone dramatic change since then, each now with new management teams. Violet are likely to field only six survivors from their sixteen man squad which was taken to the cleaners that June afternoon. Brian Harris who turned out for the Pansies that day, is now, of course with 'Port and could be in the squad if he has sufficiently recovered from a lingering injury.

Tayport are likely to have only eight of last year's squad in action this afternoon, including one, Stevie Ross, who has been round the world in the interim.

Violet, despite being one of the few clubs which has maintained top division status during the last dozen seasons or so, have disappointed their followers in cup competitions during that period. We have to go back thirteen years for Violet's last cup win of note, the Cream of the Barley Trophy in 1988. It's a determination to change this situation that will fire up the Glenesk team today. In addition it's the last chance of some cup success this season. Defeat today and it's only four league games to complete the season.

Manager John Holt and his assistant Eddie Wolecki will have a blend of youth and experience in their line-up. Experience in the shape of former 'Port star Mark Spalding, ex-Brechin City veteran Bobby Brown, former Scottish Under 17 cap Jimmy Byrne and keeper Brian Brown. Jon McKeith will be the main goal threat. The big striker who had a spell at Brechin City before returning to the Pansies, hit a double in the recent win at Forfar Albion.

Other youngsters in Holt's pool are Andy Sommerville, who had the odd game for 'Port whilst his father held the reins here at the Canniepairt, Stewart Lunan, Craig Stott and Chris Wallace, all additions to the Violet pool since the early season meeting here.

Defensively Violet are a lot better organised this season and Tayport who didn't create many chances a week ago down here, will be looking to improve on that part of their game.

Tayport finish year in style

Tayport played their final competitive fixture of the year 2000 last Saturday, when first-half goals from Ian Greig and Davie Evans earned three valuable points at Glenesk Park, thus increasing the gap at the top of the NCR Premier Division to nine points.

The opening minute of the match almost produced a goal for the visitors, after home 'keeper Brian Brown spilled a Brian Harris strike. Ronnie Kenneth's follow-up was diverted into the path of Davie Evans, whose own effort was frantically cleared off the line.

Ian Greig then became heavily involved in the action, firstly smacking the post with a powerful free kick, before netting the opener, in the 22nd minute. Grant Paterson sent the ball forward to Ronnie Kenneth, who rose above the experienced Bobby Brown, to find Greig advancing into the area. Greig held off his marker, and drilled in a shot, which the goalkeeper was unable to keep out.

Shortly afterwards, 'Port doubled their advantage. Ronnie

Kenneth played in Brian Harris, whose shot was saved, but not held, by 'keeper Brown. Davie Evans tucked away the loose ball, taking his season's tally to twelve.

Violet's last line of defence was being kept busy during the half, and he made an excellent stop to deny Ian Greig, just on half-time, tipping a twenty-five yard pile-driver over the bar.

The Pansies had much more of the play after the break, forcing several corners, although the better chances continued to fall to Tayport. Derek Wemyss and Ian Greig, again, saw long-rangers touched over the bar, while Brian Craik went close with a couple of headers.

For all their endeavour, Violet never looked like salvaging anything from the match, and the dismissal of Scott Ferguson, for hauling down Davie Evans, with eight minutes remaining, all but ended their faint hopes.

This was quite a positive performance from Tayport, who played some good, fluent football, and could really have won by a more emphatic margin, given the num-

ber of opportunities which came their way.

December has proved to be a successful month for the club. Not only have maximum points been collected from the four league fixtures, but, despite the absence of Kenny Jones, no goals have been conceded. In addition, Carnoustie's OVD Cup commitments have allowed 'Port to move ominously clear of their title rivals.

SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOOT



Elmwood's defensive record in recent games has been exceptional and much of the credit has to go down to ex-Port keeper Fraser Mann. Since his transfer from Tayport, Fraser hadn't lost a goal at home until Wednesday past when Lochee United won 1-0 at Craigie Park to keep the relegation pressure on 'Wood.

Dundee Violet can still boast of being the only Dundee club to have lifted the Scottish Junior Cup since its inception in 1886. The Pansies triumph came in 1929.

Still on the Scottish Cup, two members of Carnoustie's semi-final squad at Dens last night, Jackie Devine and Ian MacLeod were with Violet last season, yet couldn't get a starting jersey for the final of the North End Challenge Cup, having to settle for a place on the bench. How their fortunes have changed in 12 months

The number of cups in the Association can, it must be admitted, cause confusion at times. Such an occasion was the North End Challenge Cup-tie between Tayport and Harp a few weeks ago. Harp officials were adamant that they had just played in the North End Centenary Cup, for Tayside & North clubs, not realising that the competition was now the Concept Trophy. So adamant were they that they that they were in the right, they refused to give Tayport a share of the gate. [The Concept is the only competition in which the home team keeps all the gate receipts]

Grant Paterson, ordered off in his 500th game for the club at Forfar West End in February, had his case dismissed at this week's meeting of the Tayside JFA. It seemed a harsh decision at the time and the 'beaks' obviously agreed. On the same topic, Sean Wilkie was shocked to see his name in the Press, having been fined £10. Under the totting up procedure for cautions (1 or 2 points per caution), Sean had reached the punishment level of 10. He can't recall having received so many and has instituted an investigation!

Dundee City Council have been unable to accommodate the Scottish Junior FA in their quest to have the Annual General Meeting for 2002 held in the city

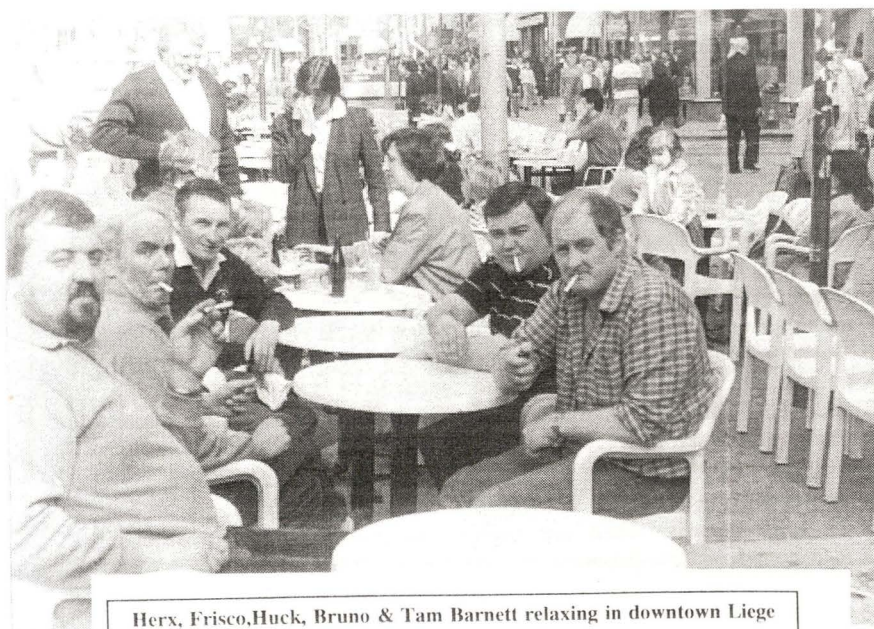

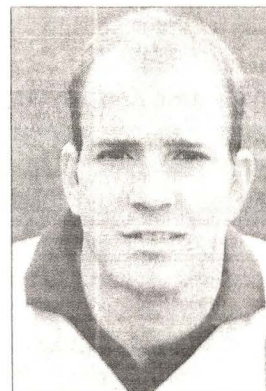

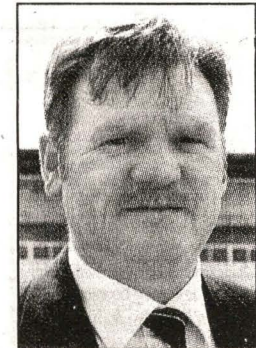

THE BAIKER'S BIT



Dundee Violet provide our opposition this afternoon for this North End Challenge Cup quarter final. I would like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials to Tayport and give a warm welcome to our fans.

The last couple of games have given us a bit more satisfaction with two victories, the first against Lochee Harp where for the first time I saw signs that our players were looking to play the game as we want it played. The 3-0 scoreline probably didn't reflect our dominance but, as I said, the positive aspect for me was the way we attempted to move the ball out quickly to the good areas where we could penetrate.

All games are important and no more so to the club than Wednesday night at North End Park. When you consider the changes that have happened at the club recently with Andy and Tosher's resignations and new management arriving, but from the beginning of the season with so many new players arriving and having to learn and work to live up to the standard we set at the club and there was a fair bit of pressure that this game was bigger than normal. I overheard one of the players, quote, "come on, we've not won a big game this season" My immediate thoughts were "what a negative statement", albeit fact, but it gave me an insight into the probable pressure some of the players put on themselves.

Well, despite that, our players gained an important victory and showed a lot of character. Not only did we gain three valuable points but the win adds that little more to the overall confidence of the squad and it is vital that we work harder on every aspect of our game. We must take it into this afternoon's game against Violet. I'm confident if we match and better our play and commitment of Wednesday's game, we can achieve a victory and a place in the semi-final of the cup.

Business discussed all seemed to be concerned with fund raising. Davie Hughes was given the go-ahead to purchase crockery for use at Coffee Mornings. Fred Bremner proposed organising fund raising dances for teenagers (some of whom will now be grandparents!). It was agreed to organise a Summer Prize Draw. 6,000 tickets @ 1.5p each, 5p per book. Top prize was £10.

In the Junior world Cambuslang Rangers were on their way to winning the Scottish Junior Cup before 25,000 at Hampden Park. Blairgowrie picked up the Tayside title and the League Cup. Osborne won the Telegraph Cup, North End the Kiddie Cup, East Craigie the Currie Cup and Lochee United the Courier Cup

MATCH REPORT by *DUNMORE*

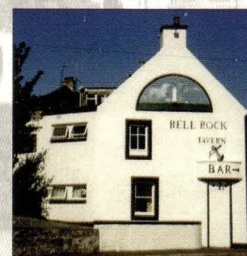

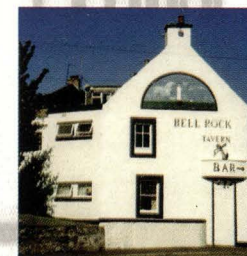
