Apart from the Scottish Junior Cup, the Findlay & Co. Cup is the oldest trophy for which Tayside clubs compete. It is of course the Currie Cup which was presented for competition by Messrs. J.&T. Currie, Wine & Spirit Merchants, Perth exactly 90 years ago.

With five wins Tayport are fourth in line in terms of victories in the competition, behind Blairgowrie (10), Jeanfield (9) and Alyth United (6) but have the distinction of having the best winning run, four cup wins on the trot during the 90's.

Downfield have had two successes, 1969 and 1995, the latter preventing 'Port having a fifth successive cup win. The Spiders won 4-1 in a penalty shoot-out after the final at North End Park had finished goalless.

This afternoon a keen contest is envisaged, with the Spiders showing up well when we met last month in the league at Downfield Park when four goals were shared. Gary Strachan, however, will be concerned with the inconsistencies displayed by his charges this season.

Keeper Ian Boardley was in excellent form in the clubs' last meeting and he is one of a host of experienced players which Gary has at the club. With Michael Clark and Jim McMulkin at the back, Billy Cooper and Bobby Skelligan in midfield and Hugh McLachlan up front, Spiders have a core of well seasoned juniors in their side. Stephen Craib and Steven Smith had the goals in the last game and they will again be the main goal threat as they seek to avenge the 7-2 drubbing here earlier this season.

Downfield got a welcome mid-season boost when Gary Strachan persuaded George and Willie Grier, two legends of the Tayside game, to come out of retirement and assist with the coaching duties. A couple of shrewd and cunning operators (remember them reducing the width of Thomson Park when in charge at Lochee United a couple of seasons ago!), Willie & George will provide good support to Gary in his efforts to plot our downfall this afternoon.

Andy Bell reports that Stevie Ross, taken off early last week at Montrose, will miss out. With a number of big games on the horizon, those who did not get a starting jersey last Saturday will be anxious to get a look-in at some point today, in order to press their claims for a place.

Brian Craik is back in full training after his holiday and he, along with Brian Harris, who has been out for a lengthy spell through injury, and Jake Thomson, will be ready for the call. Gareth Dailly has been called back by Montrose and he could again be an absentee.

The tie will, of course, be played to a finish.

#### WHEN SLIM JIM MET BIG CHIC

Jim Baxter or Slim Jim as he was commonly known was a legend during his lifetime and was arguably the most skillful football player this country has ever produced.

His football career started in the Junior ranks with Crossgates Primrose in the Fife League before moving on to Raith Rovers, Rangers, Sunderland, Nottingham Forest and back to Rangers. Jim won 34 caps for Scotland, two of his finest performances for his country being reserved for Scotland wins at Wembley in 1963 and 1967. He also played for The Rest of the World select in 1963.

The fact that 60,000 Celtic fans were totally hushed for a minute's silence in memory of a Rangers player says it all. That was the situation at Celtic Park on Sunday past when tribute was paid to Jim Baxter who died on 14 April.

The tributes to Baxter have, of course, been many during the past two weeks and it is only fitting that Tayport FC should add its tribute.

Jim Baxter's appearance on the Canniepairt

Tayport FC was greatly privileged when Jim agreed to join us here at the Canniepairt for a fundraising gala weekend in the summer of 1985, having accepted an invitation to be the guest of honour.

Jim Baxter to come to Tayport? They said it couldn't be done, it wouldn't happen. But it did. And the person instrumental in bringing Slim Jim to Tayport was committee member Chic Anderson. It did, however, mean a Monday evening trip to Glasgow by Chic and Abby to rendezvous with Jim. The deal was sealed over the course of the evening during which time the company partook of several (in fact a large number) refreshments. With the arrangements confirmed, Chic and Abby were poured into a car (they had taken a driver-Roddy Davie) and driven back to Tayport, asleep all the way. Seasoned imbibers, Jim and his entourage went off for a meal to an Italian restaurant.

Come the summer, Jim and some friends arrived at the gala on schedule and were shown to their accommodation for the weekend - a caravan on the Tayport site.

Throughout that weekend Jim endeared himself to everyone in the

community, not just by greeting them with courtesy, but by showing a genuine interest and attention to the events of the gala programme and his down to earth approach was warmly received. He had a great sense of fun and humour but this was coupled with a modesty not always displayed by sporting superstars.

Baxter was introduced to many Tayport people that weekend including the Reverend Frank Cougan, with whom he had in common, a start to working life in the pits of Central Fife.

It is true that he loved life and lived it to the full and we at Tayport Football Club are very proud to have shared a very small part of that life.



#### FROM THE ARCHIVES

THE GREAT TAYPORT v DOWNFIELD CUP CLASH OF '93

OVD Scottish quarter final tie took up the entire month of April

When young pretenders Tayport and falling Tayside giants of the time, Downfield, were drawn together in the quarter-finals of the 1993 Scottish Junior Cup, it was a tie which captured the imagination of the Tayside and North Fife public.

It took three games and 300 minutes of tense action before a total of 7,865 fans to settle the tie. At Tayport on 3rd April, a Canniepairt record attendance of 2,186 witnessed a dearth of goalmouth action as the teams fought out a 0-0 draw.

Heavy rainfall put paid to the scheduled replay on 10 April but 1,909 saw the rematch at Downfield Park on the 17th. Downfield officials were overwhelmed by the attendance, so it was all hands to the pumps with their Tayport counterparts helping count the gate money and missing Dave Reilly put 'Port ahead on 19 minutes, only for John Young to level in 36 minutes. Tayport's Andy Sommerville was ordered off for two bookings on the hour mark but Tayport held out comfortably through extra time to force a third game (this was the practice in those days) at North End Park.

Eight years ago this weekend, 2,770 crammed into the Dokens' ground to see Tayport make the last four thanks to a 56th minute goal from Dave Reilly after defender Roy Price and 'keeper Grant Clark had got themselves into a tangle. As the Sunday Mail said "Both sides had their chances although Tayport were always on top".

Within a week, the following Friday to be precise, Tayport were pitched into a semi-final against Auchinleck. Given not a ghost of a chance against the Ayrshire big guns, Tayport weathered an early storm to record one of the club's most famous victories - 3-0, thanks to a hat-trick from Hamish Mackay. Ah, what memories!

Tayport came of age that evening and have never looked back, taking their place in the annals of the Junior game.

Face to face again at Tayport again this afternoon are the respective management teams from that '93 marathon, 'Port's Dave Baikie & Graeme Irons and Spiders' Willie & George Grier. The latter pair now coaching under manager Gary Strachan.
