



The cry for seeding of the big guns will be heard once again after last season's finalists, Johnstone Burgh & Whitburn, were drawn against each other in the first round. Not the first time that's happened in recent seasons. When some of the games minnows have survived to round two without kicking a ball and the likes of Glenafton or Arthurlie will be out, one wonders if there is indeed a case for seeding. 



TODAY'S VISITORS

DOWNFIELD FC



Downfield, our visitors to the Canniepairt this afternoon, were the top club in the area ten years ago when Tayport emerged to challenge their superiority and quickly take over their mantle. These contests a decade ago were often titanic struggles which drew some of the best Tayside attendances of the 1990's.

Who can forget, for example, the three epic OVD Scottish Junior Cup quarter final games in 1993 which attracted attendances of over 7,000 before Dave Reilly edged 'Port home in the third game at North End Park?

Playing a big part in the emergence of Tayport in these days were present 'port manager Andy Sommerville and Jimmy Hunter, both of whom were signed from Downfield early in 1991 and went on to play significant roles in 'Port's success.

We stated in these notes last season that the Spiders were on the way back under the patient management of Gary Strachan and they have maintained that improvement, as was witnessed last week by the toppling of Kirrie Thistle from the top of the Premier table.

Downfield lost half a dozen players in the close season and probably the biggest loss was the departure of striker Darren Bonella to Carnoustie. Manager Strachan has been delighted with the replacements, however, bringing in 'keeper Neil McConnachie from Broughty United amateurs, Blair Flight, an 18 years old striker picked up from Arbroath FC, Bobby Skelligan from Lochee United via Elmwood, Chris Webster and the ex-North End duo of Billy Cooper and Alan Cranston.


The Spiders finished in fifth spot last season, two places and six points better off than the previous year and, had their home record matched that of their record on the road, a considerably higher finish would have been the outcome. They lost only once away from home in the entire league campaign, 1-2 at Lochee United, one of only three home wins which the Bluebells achieved.



When it came to dealing with his club, they did not come up with the cash so the transfer fell through, leaving the player disappointed.

I could not help thinking how similar this was to Patty's situation. I was reluctant to make Grant available to other teams as I still hoped to persuade him to stay at the club but the lure of a move to a club with the benefits that we could not provide seemed too great. The decision to make him available was made as there is no point in keeping an unhappy player at the club. The inevitable then happened when it was time to put up or shut up. The latter choice was taken by the club involved. We are now left with an unsettled player at the club and a bad taste in the mouths of all concerned.

Grant Paterson is a huge hero at this club and the best for all parties would be for him to sign again for the same terms as the rest of the players and I would welcome him with open arms. the grass isn't always greener on the other side.





FROM THE ARCHIVES

30 YEARS AGO SEPTEMBER 1970



Thirty years ago.... what a thought!

Tayside champions Blairgowrie were on their way to retaining their title while, in the second division, it was Carnoustie Panmure who would go up as champions the following spring.

On 19 September 1970 Dundee FC were drawing 2-2 at Dens v St Mirren thanks to two Gordon Wallace goals in front of a 5,000 crowd. In the 'dee line-up that day was Ronnie Selway, nowadays a kenspeckle figure in Tayport.

In the big wide world in September 1970, Concorde had landed at Heathrow for the first time and provoked compaints about the noise it made. Rock star Jimi Hendrix died of a drugs overdose and Egypt's President Nasser passed away. The Cyrenians organisation was founded to give shelter to alcoholics and the homeless.

Davie Hughes had the task of following up this idea. It was intimated at the meeting that the Ponderosa would be available to the club to hold fundraising bingo sessions. The committee decided to give this some thought The halcyon days of the Pondy Bingo may be past but the sessions are still limping along thirty years later. The subject of organising a dance for the Army, which was at that time encamped in the town on exercise Polex 70, was suggested. Looking at the committee at that meeting, all - bar one who is in Australia - are still involved with the club 30 years on, either as season ticket holders, groundsman or still on the committee - Freddie Bremner, Abby Walker, Ron Redpath, Davie Hughes, Abby Oswald and Eddie Stewart.


