

TODAY'S VISITORS LOCHORE WELFARE

Last season when the 'Port visited Central Park, they posted a 3-1 win in the quarter final of the Taycars competition in a highly entertaining contest to eliminate the ambitious Crosshill club who had accounted for East Craigie and Downfield at home in earlier rounds.

Ultimately, they finished fourth in the Stella Artois League last term, their first under the guise of Lochore Miners Welfare following the merger of Benarty and Lochore in the summer of 1999.

So it was a highly creditable start for the fledgling club under the shrewd and wily management of JIM HARDIE whose vast experience as a boss and a player encompasses the senior ranks as well as clubs in Fife and in Lothians. He had only been in charge at Benarty for a matter of weeks before the clubs combined.

His assistant is former Benarty boss JOHN STEEL and coach ANDY MUIR, the third member of the backroom staff, came from amateur football. From that firm base of last term's progress, boss Jim Hardie had a busy close season, making several significant signings, constructing almost an entirely new defence as he seeks to improve on last season's showing. They included goalkeeper NEIL RUSSELL, formerly with Cowdenbeath who returned to the game in August after being out with a knee injury, similar to the one suffered by Ian Durrant.

Last week against Kirkcaldy YM, however, his deputy and former Benarty keeper WILLIE CROWE, was in goal, keeping a welcome clean sheet after losing ten goals to Musselburgh and St Andrews.

Occupying the right-back slot is another close season newcomer, JASON STRATHDEE who was snapped up from Camelon, but he can also fill a central defensive role. He is keeping DAVID HUTT on the bench, a player who is in his second spell with Lochore, having been at Bonnybridge in between times.

Perhaps the most familiar figure in Lochore's team is the experienced central defender GARY PATERSON who was signed from Montrose this summer, returning to Lochore for a third time after senior experience with Dundee and Stirling Albion before his move to Links Park in December 1998. With his height he is always a threat at set pieces.

SCOTT WILLIAMSON, formerly a defender with Alloa, but until recently with Bonnybridge, was another of the acquisitions for the new term.

Former Benarty centre-half WILLIE McLEISH and SNP member is one of the older defensive hands, whilst CRAIG REYNOLDS, signed from Camelon in 1999, normally plays in the sweeper position and is a thoughtful and intelligent reader of the game.

At left-back is DAVID KENNEDY, yet another of this season's newcomers. He was also at Bonnybridge where he played under Jim Hardie.

Another option in defence is ANDY KINNELL who was signed last season. In midfield DENNIS CURRIE plays on the right-hand side and was previously with Dunfermline Athletic. JAMES SEARLE was recruited from Lochgelly Albert whilst the influential ANDY WILSON, previously with St Andrews United, only made his come-back after injury last week, playing in the opening forty five minutes in the 4-0 win over Kirkcaldy YM.

MAURICE DOYLE is one of the longer serving players, having been with Benarty, whereas BARRY TILLIER from Crossgates, who can play in defence or midfield, was yet another of the incomers this summer.

KINNOULL's top scorer last season COLIN BURKE and striker GEORGE ALLISON from Camelon were also close season arrivals whilst the other main frontman is GEORGE GIBSON. Recruited from Lochgelly Under 18's, the son of the former Hearts striker Willie, is a student at Edinburgh University when not banging in the goals for the Welfare.

Jim Hardie's attacking options were enhanced by the arrival of the experienced WILLIE CALLAGHAN who played for a host of senior clubs including Dunfermline, Montrose and Livingston, but until recently was junior with Camelon.

Not surprising in view of all the changes in personnel, the Lochore outfit are still gelling, but their remarkable 6-5 defeat at the hands of Musselburgh in the Heineken Cup excepted, they have made a good start to the new campaign and come to Canniepairt currently occupying third place in the Fife League with a 2-2 draw at Hill of Beath proving that the Crosshill side can compete with the best.

Their calibre showed early on, and it was not a major surprise when the Tannadice men opened the scoring. 'Port, who included guests Mark Spalding and Keith Nicolson, soon rallied, though, and a solid performance enabled them to gain a morale-boosting win. Fittingly, Dave Reilly notched the equaliser, from the penalty spot, before Ronnie Kenneth grabbed the limelight, with a fantastic effort, in the final minute of the game.

Last Saturday (14/10), a second trip of the season to Simpson Park saw the league leaders score seven without reply, as they eased to three points, against Jeanfield Swifts. Mark Corcoran and Ronnie Kenneth both bagged second half doubles, while Davie Evans, Brian Harris and Grant Paterson, with another great strike, netted one goal apiece.




