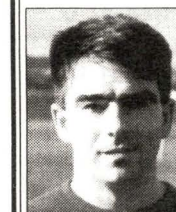

TAYPORT v FORFAR WEST END

We said last week in this column that Tayport faced their toughest challenge of the season to date when meeting Lochore in the Fife/Tayside Cup. And we weren't wrong. However the close call will serve to eliminate any complacency which could creep into Tayport's play.

Forfar West End's challenge in today's game must be respected. Their form in the early part of the season saw them take pole position in the Premier Division and it appeared that the re-shaped West End line-up was going to erase the memory of the last campaign. It will be remembered that the Strathmore Park outfit escaped relegation by the slimmest of margins.

The early season momentum, however, hasn't been maintained and West End have slipped back into the lower reaches of the division. Team boss John Clenaghan will be more than determined to ensure that he is not going to experience the relegation dogfight again this season. This means picking up points not only against the teams around him but sneaking points when least expected.....such as this afternoon.

Five times the two sides met last season resulting in five Tayport victories and five duck eggs in West End's goals-for column.

It is a run which Forfar will be all the more determined to end and, after five meetings in a relatively short time span, Tayport's card will be well and truly marked. It's not a situation with which Tayport are exactly unfamiliar but their patience, nevertheless, will be tested

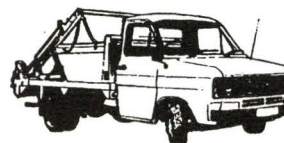

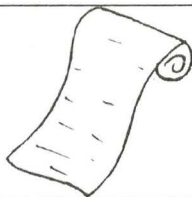

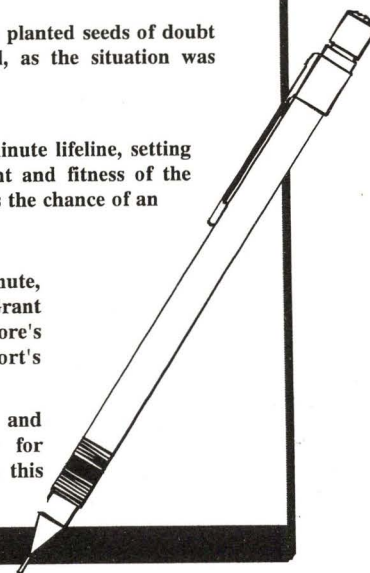
The same player was certainly enjoying his afternoon and put his side two up early in the second half.
