

TODAY'S GAME

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP 2nd ROUND REPLAY TAYPORT v CAMBUSLANG RANGERS

There are of course high stakes today when Cambuslang become the 32nd side to visit the Canniepairt on OVD business. Last week's encounter was never the blood and guts affair one might normally associate with a Scottish Junior Cup-tie. Although it was a hard and keenly fought contest, both sides preferred to put the emphasis on playing football. Hopefully today's replay will provide entertaining fare with a few goals to shout about.

Tayport will make at least one change as it's certain that Kenny Jones will return to action and this could prompt a change of game plan for the home team. There are a number of changes manager Andy Sommerville can make with Brian Craik, in particular, staking a claim following his contribution when he came off the bench last week. There were a couple of knocks getting attention from physio Andy Bell in midweek, but, with Brian Harris, Graham Nicoll, Ian Greig and Jake Thomson all chomping at the bit to get a starting jersey, the manager knows he has eager and quality players to bring in.

Rangers suffered two injury blows last week. Influential midfield player Stuart Gauley broke down in during a pre-match fitness test and young centre-back Graham Doak pulled up with what looked like a pulled muscle early in the game. Both have, no doubt, been spending time in the caring hands of their club's physio Leanne McLaughlan, and will be given every chance to make the team.

Cambuslang give little away at the back where keeper Wardlaw is currently on top of his game. For goals, the Glasgow side will look to Billy Holmes who is currently well ahead of his teammates in the scoring stakes with 11 strikes so far this season.

It's one of the ties of the day in the competition and let's hope it lives up to that billing. The tie has to be played to a finish this afternoon with extra-time and penalties if required.

The officials this week are all from Glenrothes.

TODAY'S VISITORS

CAMBUSLANG RANGERS

The wee Rangers dominated the Scottish game in the early 1970's making 5 Scottish Junior Cup final appearances including 4 in a row, lifting the trophy in 1969, 1971,1972 & 1974. The 101 years old club hold the record for Scottish Junior Cup final appearances with eleven, the first of their five successful appearances coming in 1938. That, of course, is now history and the intervening 26 years since the last Scottish Junior Cup success have been fairly lean.

'Gers were knocking on the door back in 1997 but an Allan Kennedy goal in the last minute, when Tayport won 1-0 at Somervell Park, deprived Cambuslang of a last four appearance.

Although relegated from the Central Premier Division in 1999, Cambuslang look a good bet for promotion this season, particularly if they don't get tied up with too many cup-ties and we'll be doing our best to assist in that respect today.

Cambuslang started their season well by qualifying from their Beaton's League Cup section, which is always based on geographical location. They topped a section comprising Rutherglen Glencairn, Blantyre Vics and East Kilbride Thistle then saw off Cumbernauld United in the quarter finals, despite finishing the game with nine men. In the semi-finals, last season's OVD semi-finalists and Central League champions Benburb were put to the sword in a penalty shoot-out and, in the final against Shotts Bon Accord, a Mark Daisley goal after 22 minutes was sufficient to bring Rangers their first silverware for nine years.

After getting past Kello Rovers in the first round of the West of Scotland Cup, they were unfortunate to be drawn away to Auchinleck Talbot in the 2nd round and, by all accounts, unlucky to go down by the odd goal.

In the league there have been only two games - a major upset when Carluke won 1-0 at Somervell then an excellent 4-1 win at Port Glasgow.

This is the second trip to Tayside this season, the first a visit to Perth in the opening round of the OVD Cup resulting in a pretty comfortable 3-0 win at Jeanfield Swifts.

Basically then, bar one hiccup, Cambuslang are off to a flier this season, scoring goals and playing attractive, confident football.

ALAN WARDLAW will keep goal for Rangers this afternoon. Signed a year ago after ten seasons at East Kilbride Thistle, Wardlaw's form, including saving three penalties v Benburb, has kept recent signing, ex-East Stirling custodian GORDON MACDOUGALL, on the bench. McDougall, who has yet to make his debut, was signed to replace Kenny Barnstaple who is on the transfer list.

Utility player ANDY NOBLE who had the No.2 jersey last week came from Fauldhouse United 8 seasons ago and is now one of the club's longest serving players. Centre half JIM KAVANAGH, signed from East Kilbride Thistle three seasons ago, has made the No.5 jersey his own since Greg McDonald moved to Stranraer in the close season. 18 years old centre back GRAHAM DOAK, who was signed from the amateur ranks at the start of the season, has been in good form but was injured after only 18 minutes last week and had to be replaced.

No. 3 last week JOHN McCABE, one of the team's veterans, is in his second spell at the club having played for neighbours Balntyre in between. Midfielder DAMIEN DEVANNEY was signed from the amateurs this season and has quickly established himself in the No.8 jersey. One player who didn't feature last week was influential midfielder STUART GAULEY. The ex-Arthurlie player was injured at training and failed a fitness test just prior to last Saturday's game. No.6 JOHN RICHARDSON is manager Andy Cunningham's player /coach and moved from Shotts a couple of seasons ago after long service at Hannah Park. Three goals to his credit this season.

No. 9 BILLY HOLMES has also played midfield but it his role will be as a striker today. Signed from Annbank United 9 years ago, Holmes, the team captain, has been the club's top scorer virtually every season since. MARK DAISLEY became the club's record signing when he moved from Bonnybridge during the close season. The No.10 paid off a chunk of the transfer fee by netting the winning goal in the Beaton's Cup Final. Tricky No.11 STUART MAXWELL is comfortable in all left sided positions. Signed from Ashfield 3 seasons ago.

MARK DUNN came in for the injured Gauley at No.7 last week. Now in his fourth season, the ex-Cumnock player is gives manager Cunningham several options thanks to his versatlity. Winger STEWART HILL was the No 14 who replaced the injured Doak last week. Signed from amateur football, he is in his first season at the club as are two other ex-amateurs GARY TENNANT and GREG ROBERTSON. BERNIE MULLIGAN, a midfielder, is a recent signing from Bonnybridge. It's unlikely that he will make his debut today. Completing the squad is GERRY MALONE, a striker signed from Beith two seasons ago. Can't get his place just now and is also unlikely to feature.

Team boss is **ANDY CUNNINGHAM.** Fixed up from Shotts around five years ago, this is his second season in charge after hanging up the boots.

ANDY'S ANGLE

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the Canniepairt to the players, officials and supporters of Cambuslang Rangers for our Scottish Cup replay today.

Last week's encounter was a very interesting affair. We were a bit slow to start and Cambuslang held the upper hand in the early stages of the game. After about twenty minutes we settled and the game evened itself out with play



flowing from end to end. The real battle for the game was taking place in the middle of the park with both midfields trying to stamp their authority on the game. As the half-time break approached, I felt that we were starting to assert ourselves on the game and the break probably came too early for us.

In the second half I was pleased to see we started off as we finished and we dominated for most of the second period and might have snatched victory in the final minute with a Ronnie Kenneth lob over the keeper.

The game overall was an entertaining contest despite the lack of clear-cut chances and I came away from it with a healthy respect for Cambuslang for the way they play the game. They are a good passing team who work hard for one another and are well organised with most of their players comfortable with the ball at their feet. It is easy to see why they have already won a competition this term, taking some notable scalps on the way.

Whilst having some admiration for our opponents, huge praise must be given to our players and I was understandably disappointed not to win the game but I was more than pleased with the team's performance. The effort and application shown by us was excellent and I think we should have been better rewarded for our endeavours.

We must now start again today. It is another game with different circumstances. I feel that the size of the park will have a huge bearing on the game and some personnel changes may be required to make more use of the open spaces.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the fine job Ron Nicol did with the report he gave me on the opposition. The information he passed on was spot-on. He did a firstclass job of assessing them and nothing they did on the day was a surprise.

For us to progress today to the next round, we must produce the same standard of performance, if not better. We have the right tools to do the job. It's how we apply them that will determine whether or not our ambitions are realised. There is a danger that, because we have a home game ,the job is done. Nothing could be further from the truth. We will only succeed if we play to our full capabilities.

I was talking to Jim O'Donnell, the Junior Scotland team manager, before the game and was interested to hear that his attention had been drawn to two of our players that haven't been capped. Both players, in my opinion, went on to distinguish themselves during the game so, hopefully, we could be seeing another chapter in Tayport's history of capped players.

HILL OF BEATH PANNED BY PRESS FOR UGLY SCENES

The [Glasgow] Evening Times had a real go at Hill of Beath following after-the-match scenes at Keir's Park last Saturday which prompted Glenafton's ex-Hearts 'keeper Henry Smith to quit football, a decision he subsequently reversed. The Times reported "Following astonishing scenes in the wake of [Glenafton's] 3-0 OVD Cup defeat by Hill of Beath, the former Hearts' stopper [Henry Smith] decided enough was enough. There were angry exchanges within the confines of the Fife side's pavilion after the game when Beath players gleefully derided the unfortunate Smith for handling errors which led to two of their goals.

Several Glens players were stopped from entering the home dressing room, as they attempted to halt the string of abuse directed towards the veteran. Said Smith " What they were singing was nothing short of disgraceful and it was made worse as my daughter was standing outside in tears listening to their tripe.

"I decided that if this is what Junior football is all about, then I've had enough and I told the manager [ex-Raith Rovers' **Jock McStay**] I was packing it in. However, I've had a good time to think it over and when Jock phoned me, I told him I still wanted to carry on playing for the team. In saying that, I'm still furious about the treatment from the Hill o' Beath folk and the fact that no apology was forthcoming from their boss **Jock Finlayson.** He has gone way down in my estimation.

McStay commented "Beath went right over the top with their celebrations, you would have thought they had actually won the cup. But when you're on the losing side you just have to grin and bear it, however it became a bit over personal against Henry, and threatened to turn nasty, as one or two of our lads were all for shutting them up.

Thankfully there was an SJFA official present, who I hope will comment on their behaviour to the authorities...."


