

It's a well balanced Kirrie squad which will be looking to the attacking strengths of Hamish Soutar and Ross Graham to trouble a Tayport defence still likely to be without the injured Kenny Jones. There were one or two injuries being treated in midweek but hopefully these will have cleared up by today. Back into the Tayport pool come Brian Harris and Graham Nicoll, both of whom were unavailable last week.

Still missing from Kirrie's squad of course will be Gordon McKenna who suffered a bad leg break in a recent game v Elmwood. Gordon is making good progress and, although it will be some time before he's even back to his work, he's determined to make a full recovery and get back into action at Westview Park. We wish him well.



MATCH REPORT by DUNMORE

Ronnie Kenneth again took centre stage last Saturday afternoon, scoring a remarkable five of Tayport's six goals, as they comprehensively defeated Jeanfield Swifts in a league fixture on the Canniepairt.

Despite the near legendary goalscoring feats of Dave Reilly and Hamish Mackay, only two players, Kenny Cameron, who once grabbed six, and Steve Hutcheon, had previously notched a nap of goals in one match for the club, so Kenneth deserves great credit for his exploits against Swifts. It must be said, however, that his tally was still two short of the seven that the player once scored for his former team Carnoustie Panmure!

The opener against Jeanfield came after six minutes, when Kenneth beat the visiting keeper with a powerful header, from a Davie Evans cross, and the lead was doubled five minutes later, courtesy of Brian Craik. Evans had again been the provider.

Before half-time the formidable Kenneth completed his hattrick with a right foot shot and a stooping header, giving the league leaders an unassailable four-goal cushion.

While the goals did not flow after the break, plenty chances were certainly created. Only Ronnie Kenneth, though, was able to produce an end product, driving home Tayport's fifth, early in the second half, then heading in his own fifth in the closing stages.

The comfortable win enabled Tayport to build on their position at the top of the NCR Premier Division, and given Carnoustie's Scottish Cup commitments, today's game offers an opportunity to further extend the advantage, although Kirrie are likely to offer far greater resistance than the unfortunate Jeanfield.

FROM THE ARCHIVES 15 YEARS AGO -DECEMBER 1985

For Tayport FC in December 1985 junior football was still five years away, but the 1985/86 season was to lead to Dens Park and a semi-final tie in the Scottish Amateur Cup. The first game of the New Year was a 4th round tie at home to Croda Star from Newtongrange. Tayport were held 0-0 at home but sensationally won the replay 8-0 with Bruce Burnett scoring six of the goals. A certain Kenny Cameron and an own goal made up Tayport's tally.

But, back to the previous month, and in particular, the Saturday before Christmas when Tayport played St James in a Midlands League match on what was described as a fine but windy afternoon at Riverside Drive. Tayport's run of seven successive victories had been ended the previous week by Riverside Athletic on the Canniepairt.

The teams lined up Tayport:- Angus Charity, Kirk Jack, Alan Gray, Neil Downie, Andy McRobbie, Jimmy Bissett, Doug Paterson, Stuart Davie, Graeme Cox, Bruce Burnett and John Walsh. Subs were Kenny Cameron and Ian Howe. Davie, Burnett & Howe are regular attendees at the Juniors games.



St James had an interesting team which lined up as follows:- Scott Drummond, Noel Kemlo, Andy Sommerville, Brian Goodall, Martin Lindsay, Michael Piggot,

Charlie Purvey, Derek Grier, Derek McDonald, Rab McLaren and Malcolm Graham. Substitutes were Peter Marr and John Cussick. It isn't recalled whether Peter, now Dundee FC chief executive, made an appearance as

substitute. Perhaps Tayport boss Andy Sommerville, playing for Saints that day, can remember.

For the record, Tayport won 3-2 with goals from Bruce Burnett (2) and Graeme Cox.



The Fife XI weren't playing that day but the Alliance XI had just embarked on a run which would see them fail to record a win from November to the end of April. They managed a draw that afternoon on the Canniepairt, 1-1 v St James. Team was Andy Don, B.McGavin,

Davie Blair, Danny Rice, Grant Letham, Lyall Clark, Bryan Fitchet, Neil Robertson, Alan Paterson, Roddy McCafferty, Andy Heggie. Jim Shields was substitute. Rod McCafferty had the goal.
