TAYPORT v LOCHEE UNITED

It's a fourth successive home league game for Tayport against one of the division's form sides which has moved into fourth top spot and can boast an unbeaten record in the league away from home. From a side, a few weeks ago, which looked likely to have a struggle against relegation, the Bluebells will be looking to get their fair share of the points from these games in order to get a top half of the table finish and complete a respectable first season for new manager Larry Duncan.

Duncan had something of a clear-out at Thomson Park, recruiting several new players from the Midlands Amateurs. Being the successful manager of NCR Amateurs before taking over the reins at United, Duncan was well placed to know where to find the quality for which he was looking. In came John Mitchell, Jimmy Anderson, Ally Paterson and Robert Petrie from NCR and Mike Phillips from Riverside. Marcus Dailly was reinstated from Brechin City and Kenny Boyle arrived from Forfar West End. Eddie Winks, a scorer against Tayport earlier this season, is a recent signing from Forfar Albion. To complete the re-vamp, two promising youngsters, Kirk Dailly and Jonathan Morrow, were picked up from under 18s football.

A number of key positions in the Lochee team, however, are still held by seasoned campaigners, such as keeper Mark Murray, defenders Michael Feeney and Grant Milne, midfielder Kenny Laing and strikers Dave Hutton and Mark Kelly. Robert Petrie, to whom United will be looking for goals, had a spell at Downfield but lack of a regular starting place saw him move to NCR.

Tayport won the earlier meeting of the sides at Thomson Park but they will be mindful of Lochee's last visit to the Canniepairt, a 1-0 victory for the visitors in a Findlay & Co cup-tie towards the end of the season. This only four days after Tayport had trounced them 4-0 in a league game. Funny game, football.

Kenny Jones' injury looks likely to keep him out of action again and Alan Ramsay could again be missing. Grant Buist, substituted early in last week's game, required treatment during the week but Brian Craik, also a first half casualty, trained with no ill effects. Jake Thomson will have welcomed the opportunity of action last Saturday and Graham Nicoll be eager to similarly get an opportunity to stake a claim for a regular start. Floodlights would have been welcomed last Saturday, so this week the kick-off has been advanced to 1.30pm.

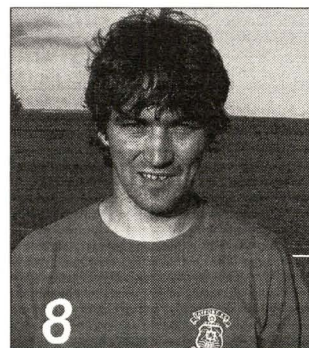

FROM THE ARCHIVES

9 YEARS AGO -DECEMBER 1991

On 7th December 1991, Lochee United paid their first ever visit to the Canniepairt for a league match against the Division One newcomers. Newcomers, they may have been, but Tayport went clear at the top of the table that afternoon thanks to a 5-1 win over Lochee and Downfield's home defeat from North End.

Tayport and Lochee United had met once before, during Tayport's inaugural season in the Juniors, when United won a Zamoyiski Cup-tie in extra time at Thomson Park.

On 7th December, on a calm but chilly afternoon in front of a disappointing attendance of 75, Tayport turned the screw on their opponents, with four second half goals. The *Fife Herald* headline was "Tayport's second-half blitz"

It was Lochee who almost went ahead, however, when McAllister, sent clear by Bell, saw his shot scrape the outside of Fraser Mann's post. Mark Spalding and Dave Reilly went close but it was something of a fluke which gave Tayport the opening goal in 40 minutes, Jimmy Hunter's free kick going nowhere until it hit Kevin Thoms and looped over keeper Gourlay.

Dallas went close for United early in the second half but Tayport increased their lead when Lochee's Vannett lost the ball to Thoms who hit his second goal of the afternoon. Andy Sommerville made it three from Jackie Devine's corner and a fourth came from Davie Reilly after Spalding's dummy had foxed the Lochee defence. The nap hand came courtesy of Billy Coventry who headed a goal from Hunter's cross.

The match ball was sponsored by Maurice Flynn.

Tayport had fielded Mann, P.Reilly, Paterson, Wilkie, Sommerville, Spalding, Hunter, Cushnie, Thoms, D.Reilly and Devine. Coventry and Frankie Dolan were substitutes. It was a Tayport side which was packed with players who were to become household names at The Canniepairt over the next ten years.

By the turn of the year Tayport had completed 18 league fixtures, while East Craigie had played 20 league games. That's nearly a season nowadays! Lochee's 26 game league season was completed on 11th April, their final game being a 2-0 defeat by Tayport.

That was quite a significant day for the club in that the legendary Hamish Mackay scored the first of his 150 goals for Tayport. Little did the 120 Tayport fans present at Thomson Park realise what was to follow from big Hambo.

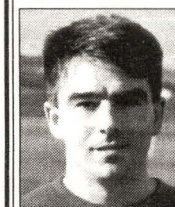

ANDY'S ANGLE

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the Cannie-
pairt to the players and officials of Lochee United
for our league game here today.



Last week's game was once again another great
result for the club in our efforts to retain the
championship. In my estimation, Kirrie are a serious
threat to any team on their day but last week we

despatched them with relative ease, having restricted them to a couple of longrange
attempts which Frazer Fitzpatrick dealt with by producing two exceptional saves.

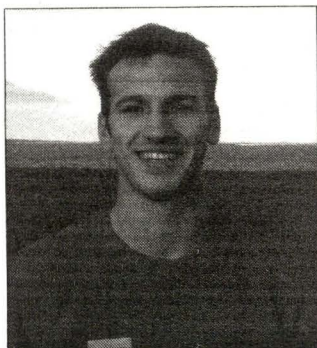

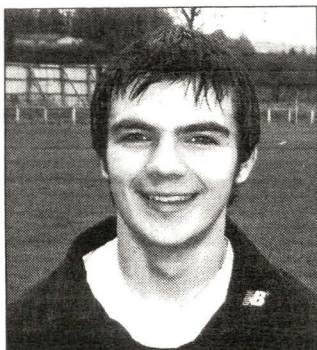

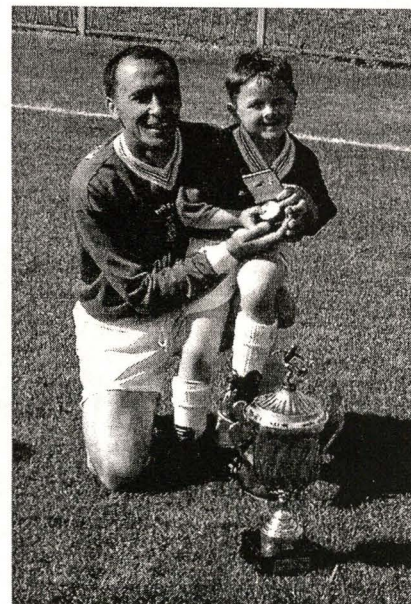
DAVE REILLY MOVES ON

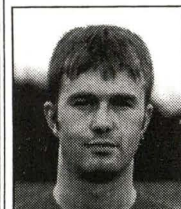

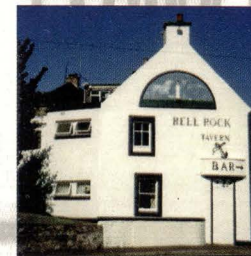
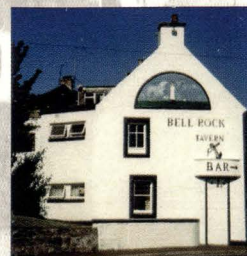
