## TODAY'S GAME

TAYPORT v BROUGHTY ATHLETIC  
D.J. LAING HOMES CUP QUARTER FINAL

Tayside clubs this season voted to bring in a sectional league cup with which to start the season, ostensibly to pad out the season for those clubs which ran out of fixtures in April. Clubs which were knocked out of the DJ Laing in its first round knock-out formula last season will get at least three extra games. With Broughty going out in the 1st round last season, today's game will ensure their season is extended by at least four games. Tayport, finalists last season, played five games in the competition, the same number as they will have played in this season's contest after today.

Over the years Broughty's visits to the Canniepairt have been fairly infrequent, indeed this is their first visit since 1995/96, the last season in which the Whitton Park side enjoyed Premier League football.

Things are on the up and up, though, for the Ferry club and a far more competitive encounter is expected today than six years ago when, in three games, Broughty yielded 15 goals for none in reply.



Although they will likely be without experienced defenders Stuart Cassidy and Bobby Dow as well as striker Kevin Steele, manager Steve Kell's pool is sufficiently strong not to be unduly affected by the absentees. Youngster Colin Wares (pictured) was the side's top scorer last season and forms a formidable striking partnership with Brian Duell.

Tayport will, of course, again be without injured ace marksman Ronnie Kenneth and there's an injury doubt over Billy Spence. Allan Ramsay is abroad on holiday but Grant Paterson will be available again after missing the win at Forfar because of a wedding. Scott Peters wasn't risked last week but should return this afternoon.

### **BROUGHTY ATHLETIC TODAY'S VISITORS TO THE CANNIEPAIRT**

Broughty haven't been too frequent visitors to the Canniepairt, a situation brought about by the Whitton Park side spending lengthy spells in the second division. However their most recent spell in the bottom division ended earlier this year when their second half of the season form took them into second place to pip Blairgowrie for runners-up spot behind champions Bankfoot Athletic.

Steve Kell and Brian Kenyon took over the reins at Whitton Park, made a few shrewd signing and steadily established the club as one with which to be reckoned. Last season was probably their best ever. As well as winning promotion Broughty won both First Division Cup competitions and were runners-up in the Findlay & Co. Cup, narrowly losing to ourselves at Thomson Park. Had it not been for an unfortunate administrative error, they might well have also made a splash in the North End Challenge Cup. A second round win at North End was to no avail after they were found to have fielded an ineligible player.

Steve Kell is already on record as stating how important it was for Broughty to get off to a good start. The players have answered the manager's call by recording two wins from their opening two Premier League fixtures and going effortlessly through their league cup section with a flawless record.

The Broughty squad is very much the classic blend of youth and experience. In front of 20 years old Russell Brown in goal are seasoned campaigners like ex-Downfield, Montrose and Violet defender Roy Price and Stuart Cassidy. The experienced Andy Heggie brings effervescence to midfield and weighs in with his fair share of goals, while up front Colin Wares and Brian Duell can cause the best of defences problems.

Such has been the transformation of the Tayport squad, in terms of personnel, over the past year or so, only two players, Grant Paterson and Allan Ramsay, survive from the team which Dave Baikie left in 1997.

Early indications, however, would suggest that the manager, along with the Port Support, should be looking to the future with great optimism, as the new look side have begun the season very positively.

The one negative aspect so far has been the enforced absence of talisman Ronnie Kenneth. The club's Player of the Year, grabbed a customary goal, but was injured in the first game of the season, the Herschell Trophy win against Bankfoot Athletic.

While Kenneth has certainly been missed, the goals have continued to flow unabated. Davie Evans opened the league campaign with four strikes against Elmwood. New forwards Brian Grant and Billy Spence also netted in a resounding 8-1 victory.

Of the new signings, all of whom appear to be valuable assets to the squad, Paul Boylan has perhaps had the most bizarre experiences, twice having to take over goalkeeping duties, due to the dismissals of Frazer Fitzpatrick, in the aforementioned game at Elmwood, and then at Downfield Park eleven days later.

In the five NCR Premier Division matches to date, Tayport once again find themselves in pole position, having dropped only two points, after sharing four goals with Lochee United on the Canniepairt.

The most significant three points came in the crunch encounter at home to North End, who included a quartet of former Tayport stalwarts in their party. Billy Spence settled that particular contest, late in the second half.

Also high on the agenda has been the inaugural DJ Laing League Cup. Drawn in the same section as Forfar West End and Bankfoot, 'Port comfortably qualified for today's quarter finals, scoring an impressive 19 goals in their four fixtures.



Davie Evans and Brian Grant currently lead the way in the goalscoring stakes, notching twelve and eight goals respectively, after ten competitive matches. What has been of more importance, though, is the number of players who have already contributed on this front. On Saturday Gareth Dailly became the fifteenth player to find the net. This is indeed a remarkable statistic, achieved within six weeks of the start of the season, and which augurs well for the year ahead.

### TODAY'S OTHER LEAGUE CUP QUARTER FINALS

The other three ties in this afternoon's DJ Laing League Cup quarter finals are Premier Division v First Division affairs and, if the experience of last week's Concept Group Trophy is anything to go by, it should be no contest.....not that Jeanfield, Luncarty and Montrose Roselea would agree.

Montrose, having disposed of the challenge of two Premier sides, Elmwood and Kirrie in their qualifying section, will certainly fancy their chances of reaching the last four at the expense of an Arbroath SC side which has started the season very disappointingly. It should be extremely close but home advantage might just tip the balance in SC's favour.

Jeanfield travel to North End Park as clear outsiders but manager Tom van der Ham is a shrewd coach and will be looking to keep things tight and perhaps scrape through on penalties. Realistically, though, it should be the Dokens by a fair margin.


Luncarty should be cannon fodder for Violet at Glenesk but the Perthshire club are clearly an improved side, as qualification from a section which contained East Craigie and Kinnoull demonstrated. A heavy home defeat in the Concept Trophy last week from Jeanfield showed they still have some way to go, however, and again the Dundee side should cruise comfortably into the last four.



## Dailly's back in the old routine

### FORFAR WEST END ..0 TAYPORT.. 4

Tayport consolidated their position at the top of the NCR Premier Division with a comfortable victory at Strathmore Park, on Saturday afternoon, against opponents who have become somewhat familiar, over the past few weeks.

The visitors, who triumphed 6-0 at the same venue in the League Cup competition, opened the scoring in the sixth minute. Hat-trick heroes from that meeting, Davie Evans and Brian Grant, combined on this occasion, with Grant taking the ball in his stride before sending a clinical finish beyond keeper Ron Adam.

The highlight of the game came on the half-hour mark, when Tayport doubled their lead, with a fantastic goal. Allan Ramsay, captaining the team in the absence of Grant Paterson, unleashed a screamer from all of 30 yards, which flew past the helpless Adam, into the top corner of the net.

Gareth Dailly's return to the side, following a lengthy suspension, was another positive aspect of the match, and he celebrated his first appearance of the season by notching the decisive third goal, calmly finding the net after Barry McNaughton's dangerous right flank cross had broken back into his path.

McNaughton was also instrumental in creating the fourth goal, in the 67th minute. Davie Evans' pass allowed the midfielder to reach the byeline and drive in a low cross, which was stabbed home at the front post by Brian Craik, for a counter which would certainly have pleased the coaching staff.

Clearly frustrated by the experience, tempers within the Forfar ranks soon began to boil over, and, amid a flurry of yellow cards, West End had full-back Jan Atagan ordered off, for a crude, late tackle on Davie Evans.

As one would have expected, Tayport continued to dominate, but they could not add to their tally, with Brian Harris coming closest, only to see his long-range effort narrowly miss the target.



Broughty Athletic are our visitors today for this DJ Laing league cup quarter final tie. I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials to Canniepairt. May I also give a warm welcome to the 'port support this afternoon and hope we can provide an entertaining and successful day for you.



It's a bit unusual for the Port Prog to have its first outing of the season in October but I'm glad, as I'm sure you are, that it is now available. It gives me an opportunity to keep you updated and allows you to get some information on the players and performances from my perspective.

Ten games have now come and gone since the opening game of the season when we defeated Bankfoot 3-0 to win the Herschell Trophy for the ninth time. Although I feel we are a long way from being the finished article, I am pleasantly happy with our progress to date. Over ten games we have been successful in eight and, in the two we drew, we created so many scoring opportunities against Lochee United, we could have won six games and the Forfar WE game was heading for a high scoring win. This afternoon provides a great opportunity for our players to show the progress that we have made. Broughty Athletic are a very well organised, hard working and talented side. We must better their attitude and commitment, and if we do so, I am sure we can achieve success and a place in the semi-finals.



On that topic, it was perhaps a trifle insensitive, then, to be given the same match official for the Herschell Trophy, the season's pipe opener, as had been involved at Glenesk.

Even at that stage of last season, things were moving. Paul Clark, a short term signing, had been freed and an offer from Lochore Welfare accepted for Graeme Nicoll. Jake Thomson was wanted by Kirrie and the clubs quickly agreed a deal. Similarly, Scottish Cup hero Stevie Ross didn't see himself getting a regular game and invoked the agreement he had with the club to sign for North End.

Kenny Jones had made it clear that he saw his future elsewhere and we accepted an offer from Violet for his transfer to Glenesk to re-join Andy Sommerville who had originally brought him to the Canniepairt. Grant Buist announced that he was hanging up his boots and, although he answered a plea a few weeks ago to help us out, has stuck to his decision. Physio Andy Bell, whose arrangement with Dundee FC had also ended, left to join Lochee United.

The players had barely four weeks off before being back in for pre-season training in mid July. Disappointingly, a couple of planned pre-season friendlies against Dundee United and Raith Rovers XI's were called off at the eleventh hour but on 3rd August a somewhat depleted squad set off for a two game tour of north east England.

Ex-committee man Brian 'Bruno' Burnett was driving the Moffat & Williamson executive double decker and a fine job he made of it too. Friday tea-time traffic held things up, however, and the kick off against South Shields, members of the Northern Premier League, was delayed. Tayport went down 1-2 but acquitted themselves well. Collingwood College at Durham University proved to be an excellent base and the lads remained in good spirits throughout the weekend following a well deserved 1-0 win at Easington Colliery on Saturday. A stop at Haddington on Sunday at lunchtime rounded off a most enjoyable trip.

The season's start was looming but first, another tough friendly, this time at Johnstone Burgh, OVD finalists only a year ago, proved beneficial in the build up to the kick-off. The game, organised by Johnstone businessman and Tayport sponsor, Jim Cherry, ended goalless.

First competitive action was on Wednesday 15th August when the Herschell was retained at the expense of Bankfoot. Injuries, suspensions and holidays were causing Dave Baikie some concern and Paul Boylan was fixed up on a delayed transfer from Brechin City to supplement the squad. Ian Greig, although keen to get a move back to Arbroath for domestic reasons, honoured his contract and stuck with the club until the absence situation improved. An agreement was struck with Arbroath SC and, after four trophy laden years, Greig went back to Seaton Park.

Although Sean Wilkie had done some pre-season training, he had made it clear that he wanted to be on his way, and after featuring in our opening three games, disappeared. He subsequently appealed - unsuccessfully - to the SJFA against his retention but the lure of North End and its burgeoning ex-Tayport colony was an attraction for Sean and not surprisingly, that's where he ended up a couple of weeks ago after the clubs had come to an agreement. The end of an era, then for Sean and the team he captained to Scottish Cup glory during his eleven years at Canniepairt.





## PAUSE FOR THOUGHT






