Tayside To The Fore In Concept Trophy

As they have done almost since the competition began in 1988, Tayside clubs are dominating this season's tournament. However the North looks very likely to have at least two of the places in this afternoon's last eight draw to be held in North End's Social Club following the Dokens v Lochee United contest.

Hermes and **Sunnybank** will be odds on to account for Jeanfield and Kinnoull respectively. **Glentanar** have moved up a division since we put nine goals past them three years ago, but a win for them at **Carnoustie** is about as likely as Bunter getting to Angola.

The fourth North representatives, **Aberdeen East End** are at **Bankfoot** and this a difficult one to call. Bankfoot will probably rue going to Carnoustie last week where they were humped, and this result won't have done morale much good for a tough tie today.

Arbroath SC are on a potential banana skin at Davie Park where **Blairgowrie** will fancy their chances. Blair were fancied to account for a struggling Downfield in a home cup-tie earlier this season and failed to do so will be doubly determined to prove a point against SC.

Lochee United under Eddie Wolecki promised so much at the start of the campaign but they have generally disappointed to date and their tie at **North End** is just the sort of game in which Bluebells officials will be expecting Eddie to deliver the goods. North End will be favourites but it's not beyond United in what is the tie of the round.

Elmwood will go in as favourites against a **Forfar West End** side which has faded after a bright start. Elmwood's cup form has often disappointed and they could be surprised in a match which is unlikely to feature many goals.

The competition, currently sponsored by Concept has previously been known as The Zamoyski Challenge Cup and the North End Centenary Cup. North End are the holders and other winners have been -

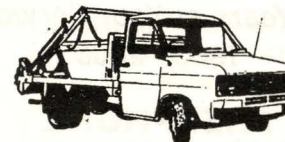

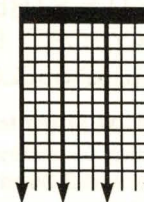

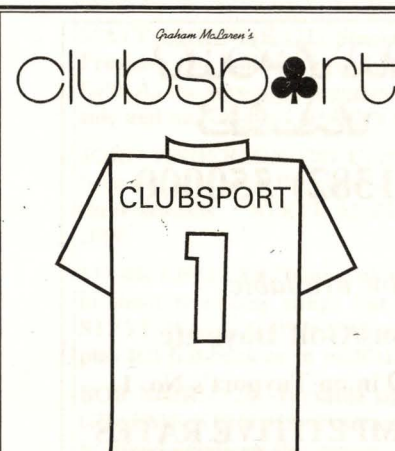

OFF THE NET.....

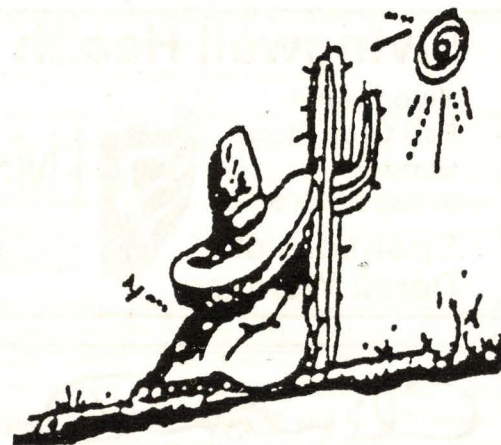

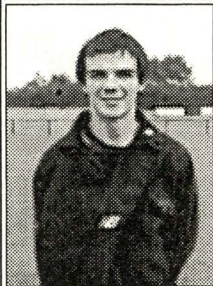

TAYPORT v LUNCARTY

A glance at the respective league positions would suggest that Luncarty's visit to the Canniepairt is akin to lambs being led to the slaughter. However, as we all know, football doesn't work that way. All grades of football have a history of shock results and there is not a player in a team of underdogs who doesn't cherish the thought of scoring a winning goal against the 'big boys'.

One thing is for sure, Dave Baikie will ensure that Luncarty will be treated with the utmost respect. Three reasons for that. 1. It's his style. 2. Bankfoot. 3. Renfrew. The fact that Bankfoot humped 'Port down here earlier this season rankles and, with a Scottish Cup tie next week, all players will be looking to ensure they are worthy of a place at Renfrew.

Tayport, interestingly, have never played Luncarty in a league match, the Perthshire club having been relegated the season Tayport were promoted. There have, however, been four cup matches between the clubs, two of which have been in this competition. In 1992/93 Tayport won 9-0 at Luncarty and in last season's competition, Tayport recovered from going a goal behind to win by 7-1.

In 1995/96 Tayport won 10-0 at Luncarty in the Whyte & Mackay and in the only previous match played on the Canniepairt, Luncarty went down 6-0 in a DJLaing Cup-tie in 97/98 season.

Allan Ramsay is unlikely to be risked today unless he has completely recovered from injury but Scott Peters and Ronnie Kenneth could get a starting place this week, although neither did full training during the week.

Luncarty's player manager Shaun Ewart felt his team had turned in a spirited performance in their last outing, despite going down heavily to Scone. After a promising start to the season, Luncarty have slumped to the bottom of the table but will look on today's game as one in which they can demonstrate that is a false position.

Renfrew manager Mick Dunlop was an interested spectator last week at Tayport v Arbroath SC and, with 'Frew without a game this afternoon, he could well travel east again with some of his coaching staff..

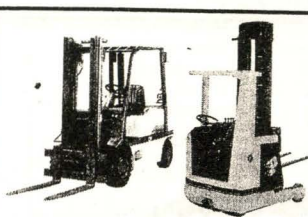

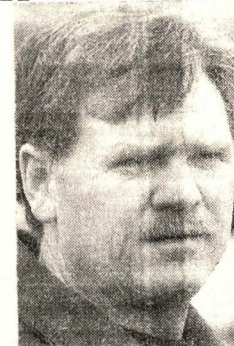

THE BAIKER'S BIT



Luncarty provide our opposition this afternoon for this Concept Cup 3rd round tie and I'd like to welcome manager Shaun Ewart and his players to Canniepairt.

I see from press reports that I produced 'another managerial masterstroke' on or around 3.20pm in last Saturday's league nailbiter against Arbroath SC. 2-1 down with ten men, twenty minutes to go and things not looking at all rosy, 3 subs. warm up, go on and each scores a goal in the final ten minutes of the game to win 4-2 and secure three vital points. Brilliant! The only problem was, at 3.20pm last Saturday Davie Nicol and myself were standing on a rain drenched terracing in Shettleston, Glasgow thoroughly depressed because information on our predicament had been passed on.

The ensuing 20 minutes, in the absence of any further update, had Davie and myself completely dejected as we walked towards the exit. The dreaded sound of the mobile ringing stopped both of us in our tracks. Do I really want to hear this? "Well, hit me with it", says I. "ok", was the reply, "we just managed to win 4-2." For a brief moment I thought about giving Davie a hug but I quickly came to my senses!

So the moral of the story is - don't believe every word you read. Fortunately we had very capable people making the correct decisions at the right time in a very difficult situation which was, unfortunately, one of our own making. It was stressed in this column and by Mel Irons prior to kick-off, about complacency, attitude, starting well and discipline. Sometimes people listen but for some reason choose to know better. By all accounts the latter was the case. What bothers me - and it should the players also - is the reality of indiscipline. In the past six months or so, we have found ourselves having to battle against the odds because of a lack of professionalism.

The first, we managed to snatch a defeat from the jaws of victory in the last game of the season, the cup final against Carnoustie, with two stupid acts of retaliation. There's no doubt in my mind we'd have won the game had we had 11 players on the park because Carnoustie did not have an answer to our play on the night. The second, most definitely could have seen our Scottish Cup progress draw to a halt. And thirdly last weekend's dismissal could, I've no doubt, have cost us the league title.

The bottom line is, it cannot be allowed to continue. We've been fortunate that the other players have shown real character to produce victories against the odds. Indiscipline goes hand in hand with failure. We're not in that business, so I say to our players, be professional at all times and get it right.

This afternoon we entertain Luncarty for a place in the quarter finals of the cup. Last week we let ourselves down for the best part of the game. Let's make sure we don't repeat that. I'm confident if our attitude and discipline is right, we will win and progress to the next round.

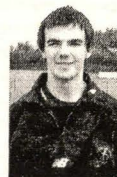

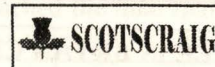

A FAMOUS CUP VICTORY FROM 6th FEBRUARY 1993



Tayport took four busloads of fans down to deepest Ayrshire and a 4th round OVD Scottish Cup tie at Cumnock. There was a crowd of just over 800 for one of the ties of the day at Townhead Park (pictured).

Tayport produced one of their most memorable performances that afternoon, a performance which caused the west based media to sit up and take notice. West coast bookies M&S Racing later installed Tayport as tournament favourites. "As far as I know it is the first time a Tayside club have ever headed our betting for the Junior Cup" said a spokesman for the bookies quoted in The Courier. "Tayport really raised some eyebrows with their 4-1 win at Cumnock"

Tayport's team was Mann, P.Reilly, Paterson, Spalding, Sommerville, Wilkie, Hunter, Coventry (Lynch), Mackay, D.Reilly, Devine (Lamont).

Dave Reilly (2), Hamish Mackay and Billy Coventry were the Tayport marksmen.

"Brilliant Tayport cruise through" said the *Fife Herald*. "OUTCLASSED" read the banner headline in the *Cumnock Chronicle*.

The club archives noted ' *Magnificent performance. A day to remember for all who witnessed Tayport completely over whelm their opponents*'

Tayport, of course, reached the final that season, only to go down 1-0 to a late goal by Cumnock's neighbours Glenafton from New Cumnock.

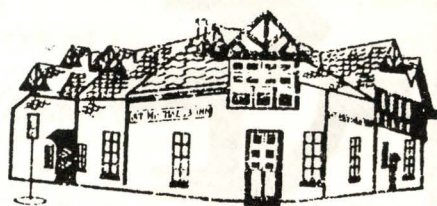

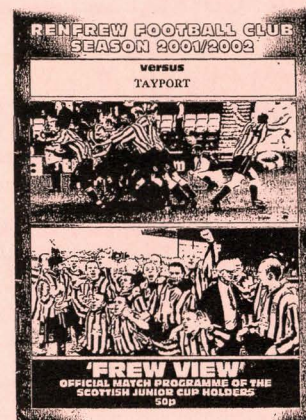

NEXT STOP RENFREW



Just as there was a buzz went round the room when Tayport were drawn at Pollok in the last round, the pairing of holders Renfrew with Tayport resulted in a similar buzz when the 5th round was drawn.

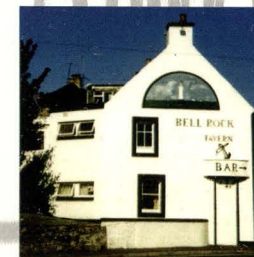
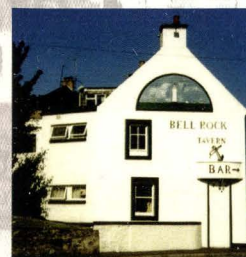
