For the first time, Tayport host the defending champions in a Scottish Junior Cup tie when we meet Renfrew on The Canniepairt this afternoon.

Renfrew Juniors is a name familiar to the 'Port support probably only because of their exploits in last season's final at Firhill. A good number of ex-'Port players were in Gowfers' line-up therefore increasing the interest factor on that occasion. There was no be no repeat of a Tayside cup win, however, thanks to a resilient performance by Renfrew and some disappointing finishing by Carnoustie.

That's all history now, of course, and it's all about today's game when the supporters of both teams will be looking for the sort of action they got in the last twenty minutes or so for the remainder of the tie.

Both teams are likely to make changes to last week's starting line-ups, although Dave Baikie, with a limited squad at his disposal is likely to keep changes to a minimum. There were a few knocks receiving attention on Monday night but, hopefully they will have cleared up in time for today.

Renfrew on the other hand have 19 players looking for a starting jersey including James, Ross who came off the bench to net the equaliser. In his post match comments to the *Evening Times*, Ross spoke of his disappointment at not getting a starting number.

Key defender and skipper Neil Farquharson has been out for some time with a chipped ankle bone but could make a surprise return. Farquharson is now in full training but manager Mick Dunlop may not want to change a defence which has conceded only three goals in the last five games. His hand could be forced though, by an injury to fullback Alan Foster which necessitated his substitution last week.

With only one goal in three games, however, Dunlop will be looking for a better return in that department and is likely to give Tiger McNally a starting berth.

Today's match officials are from the south of Fife. Mr Gilfillan from Cowdenbeath is the man in the middle and he is assisted by Mr Aird, also from Cowdenbeath and Mr Hynd from Oakley.

Tayport have no clues to Renfrew lineup for Cup

TAYSIDE giants Tayport are heading into unknown territory when they face Renfrew on Saturday.

For since the sides were drawn against each other in the fifth round of the OVD Cup three weeks ago, Tayport have only seen the cup holders in competitive action ONCE.

That was in the League Cup against Shettleston a fortnight ago and the only other chance they had to run the rule over the Western Park side was a meaningless bounce game against a boys' club last Saturday. And on both occasions 'Frew fielded nowhere near their strongest starting line-up.

Renfrew meanwhile, have twice watched the Taysiders tear lowly local opposition apart up at Canniepairt.

Said Renfrew manager Mick Dunlop: "Tayport had someone there watching us [v the boys club] on Saturday. They must have phoned the SJFA to find out if we applied for a permit for a friendly. "They couldn't have seen that much though, because we used all our nineteen players, giving them half an hour each and just chopping and changing things as we went along.

I can't imagine they'll have learned anything from watching us. Even when they watched us against Shettleston the week before, we had made about seven changes to the team. "We've watched them twice and hopefully learned something but it's what we do on the day that's important. "They're obviously going to be favourites in everyone's eyes, but we're used to being underdogs and quite enjoy the tag" But he warned: "We'll have to take the game to them and hopefully we can get a result, but we're under no illusions that it's going to be a very difficult game"



Renfrew are a long established Junior club, having been founded in 1912 and although domestic honours haven't been too plentiful, three Scottish Cup appearances have more than made up for it. Unsuccessful in 1917 and 1962, Frew finally got their hands on the holy grail last season. There have been a number of changes to the Renfrew squad from that which won the cup. A total of eight players have moved on. All credit, then, to manager Mick Dunlop who has recruited shrewdly to maintain the momentum of last season.

Veteran 'keeper JOHN THOMSON joined up this season after a number of years at Maryhill. Defender NEIL FARQUHARSON is one of the club's longest serving players, having now played in excess of 160 games. Has been out injured for some weeks but his return to action is drawing ever closer. JAMIE ROSS netted the goal which made today's game possible. Been at Western Park for 5 years since signing from Lesmahagow. Represented the Central Region, the first Renfrew player to have been so honoured for many years.

BEN SMITH defender ex- St Mirren. Another signed from Lesmahagow. JIM QUIGLEY defender now in his sixth season at 'Frew. It's a family thing with Jim. His father also turrned out for the club and is now on the committee. ALAN FOSTER former Arthurlie defender now in his 4th season at the club. JOHN HAMMOND has been equally at home in defence or midfield in his 3 years here with Mick Dunlop. Exactly the same description can be applied to BRIAN McKEOWN

COLIN CLARK is a defender now enjoying a second spell with Renfrew. First signed on 10 years ago but returned in the close season from Rob Roy. JOHN PEACOCK midfielder with senior experience at St Mirren and QPR. 3 years at Western Park. ALAN PRENTICE another ex-St Mirren midfield player who had a short spell playing in Iceland. Netted his only goal of the season to date at Lochgelly in the last round. STUART GILCHRIST. Midfielder and one of the club's long serving players. A local lad, he and Quigley were at school together.

CHRIS DICKSON. midfield signed this season from Largs Thistle. A post denied him his first goal of the season last week. JAMES 'TIGER' McNALLY another signing from Largs with whom he was a prolific scorer prior to moving to Western Park 3 years ago. Three of his five goals this season have come in the last six games. ANDY MORRISON, very skilful striker, current captain and top scorer with 10 goals (inc. 6 pens.) Signed from Glenafton. RICHARD BARR young striker signed from Hibs this season. Club's second top scorer. Has been catching the eye of the seniors again. MICK DUNLOP another quality young striker. At Killie last season, now with Ayr Utd with whom he has played in the 1st XI but farmed out at present to 'Frew. GERRY MALONE striker who was here last season with Cambuslang Rangers. NEIL McKINNON forward now in his third season having graduated from Renfrew's U.21s.

Manager MICK DUNLOP and assistant BILLY PEACOCK joined 3 years ago from Johnstone Burgh and it's been success all the way - and a place in the history books. MATT McCOLL held the reins temporarily 'til Dunlop arrived then reverted to coach. Physio ALLY CAMERON is in with the bricks at Western Park, having been on the books for 25 years. 




