

TODAY'S VISITORS

Lochee United pinched a point from us in the first home game of the season here on the Canniepairt and, with this result hard on the heels of a win over Carnoustie on the opening day, everything in the Lochee garden seemed to be blooming. Alas, as autumn and then winter came along the Bluebells withered and, despite a burst of life again come springtime, the hope of a 4th place finish became but a distant dream. With their league fixtures completed last Saturday and exits already from all cups bar today's, regardless of this afternoon's result, it looks like a long summer ahead for Eddie Wolecki's boys. Ironically, Lochee were extremely keen to be in the Superleague next season whereas some of the teams which will finish above the Bluebells are understood to be none too keen for a step-up. Who knows? They might yet get there by default.

Keeper Paul Mitchell, mentioned above, also has a Tayport connection, although somewhat tenuous. He is related somewhere along the line to that most colourful of 'Port supporters, Bunter Robertson.

More Tayport connections in midfielder Jackie Thomson who was at Tayport last season. Jake moved to Kirrie but a pre-deadline transfer last month saw United bring him to Thomson Park. The doyen of the Bluebells' squad for today's game is former Canniepairt favourite Jackie Devine. This time last season Divvy was preparing for the OVD Cup final with Carnoustie but after playing only a bit part with the Gowfers this season, Jackie secured a transfer to Lochee. This afternoon's tie is one which Association Match Secretary Jock Myles needs out of the way as it's causing a fixture logjam and the North End Challenge Cup can't progress until it's out of the way.

REVIEW

A week past Friday evening saw Tayport's OVD Scottish Junior Cup bid come to an end, when they succumbed to East Region cracks **Linlithgow Rose**, at the semi-final stage. While the defeat was obviously a disappointment to all concerned, the highlight of the ten match cup campaign was taking part in the semi itself, in front of 4,500 fans, on a fine playing surface at Livingston FC FC's Almondvale Stadium.

During the build-up to the game, there was much reference to 'Port's three previous last-four appearances, rekindling memories of Hamish Mackay's hat-trick, Steven Stewart's netbuster and Steve Hutcheon's brace. Any talk of this year's match, however, will always be accompanied by a question: should Ronnie Kenneth's first half 'goal' have been allowed to stand? Not for the first time this season, Tayport's star striker was frustrated by a debatable offside decision, which would have significant impact on proceedings.

Following the goalless first forty five minutes, Linlithgow came out for the second half with all guns blazing. Former Tayport winger Mark Corcoran, who has certainly developed as a player since his move to Prestonfield, emerged as the key man in their success, so much so that there was an audible buzz amongst the Rose support whenever he received the ball. Not that Corcoran ran riot against his old teammates, but when he did escape down the left flank, barely a minute after the restart, he produced a goalscoring cross, and followed this up shortly afterwards with a corner kick which enabled the prolific Davie Flynn to inflict yet more damage.

Colin McGlashan was in the right place at the right time to give his side a substantial lifeline, on the hour mark, but with 'Port having twice hit the crossbar, it was simply Linlithgow's day.

A bruising encounter away to **Montrose Roselea** (30/3) was hardly ideal preparation for the big match, with influential defender Derek Wemyss picking up a knock which would cruelly deprive him of taking his usual place in Friday's starting line-up.

Goals from Brian Craik and Barry McNaughton at least saw 'Port make progress in the Findlay & Co Cup, with the 2-1 scoreline flattering the robust first division hosts.


The previous weekend (23/3), Tayport also made progress in the Fife Tayside Inter-regional competition, requiring extra-time to eventually see off **St Andrews United**. Colin McGlashan's terrific early opener was cancelled out by a Hunter penalty kick, towards half-time. The inspirational John Ward edged Tayport through, netting a crashing header, then a well taken spot kick to complete the 3-1 win.

On Wed 10/4, Elmwood visited the Canniepairt for a rare league fixture. Wood kept the champions at bay for the best part of an hour, but Davie Evans broke the deadlock with a clinical strike from the edge of the area. This goal was followed swiftly by a John Ward penalty. Ronnie Kenneth claimed responsibility for the next spot kick, taking the final tally to three goals without reply.

In terms of profile, last Saturday's Canniepairt clash versus Carnoustie Panmure was more akin to our previous home Saturday match, when Grant Paterson's deflected goal defeated Bathgate Thistle in the Scottish Cup quarter-final replay (16/3) which gave the club the chance to contest the national semi-final. It was the second time in a week that a cup final place was at stake, with Sunnybank already through to meet the winners.

As in the match against Bathgate, Tayport won by virtue of a solitary early goal from an experienced player. Steven Stewart profited from Ronnie Kenneth's centre, to set up a final clash against the North Region's Sunnybank, and deal the Westfield Parkers a psychological blow ahead of the pending league meetings.

League points were at stake on Wednesday (17/4) when 'Port had to travel to **Kirriemuir.** For the second successive midweek, Davie Evans opened the scoring with a cracking strike from outside the box. Towards the end of the encounter, 'Port came close on several occasions, but had to settle for a narrow yet vital victory




