



TODAY'S GAME

FINDLAY & Co. CUP 2nd ROUND TAYPORT v JEANFIELD SWIFTS

Today's combatants, Tayport and Jeanfield Swifts have had something of an affinity with the Findlay & Co. Cup, not just in its current guise, but in its former life as the Whyte & Mackay Cup and prior to that, the Currie Cup. In fact it's by far the oldest of the Tayside Association's trophies and as such, should never be lost to somebody's attic, but should remain as a premier cup competition as long as junior football is played in these parts.

The grand old competition was instituted in 1911. The uniquely shaped cup was presented to the Perthshire Junior FA by Messrs. J. & T. Currie, Wine & Spirit Merchants, Perth on 21 January 1911 and, until reorganisation in 1969, was exclusively played for by clubs from that Association.

The last 33 years has seen it contested by all clubs in membership of the Tayside FA. Not surprisingly, therefore, cup wins over its 91 year existence have been monopolised by Perthshire clubs, although Tayport FC is catching up fast. The roll of honour shows Blairgowrie as winners on 10 occasions, all between 1950 and 1975. Jeanfield Swifts come next with 9 wins, 7 of which were from 1940 to 1950. The competition wasn't suspended during the war in common with many others and four of the Swifts' successes came during the war (nae sojers in Jeanfield?) Swifts' other successes were in 1967 and 1988.

Third in the roll of honour comes Tayport who, with 6 wins, are level with the now defunct Alyth United.

Jeanfield's first visit to Canniepairt was in our first season, a 3-0 first leg win (they were two leg affairs at that time) Lamont, Thoms and Somerville scoring for 'Port. The second leg at Simpson Park was 1-1.

The clubs were destined to meet again in each of the following two seasons, Tayport winning 2-0 in 1992 and 3-1 in 1993. In each of these three seasons Tayport went on to lift the cup. There was a seven year gap until our next meeting in this competition which was last season's semi-final on the Canniepairt. The outcome was the same with a 5-1 win for Tayport setting us up for winning the final against Broughty Athletic.

Jeanfield have had their moments against us in the past and, with the shrewd Dutchman Tom van der Ham pulling the managerial strings this afternoon, they will be out to taste success against us in this competition for the first time in five ties.

TODAY'S VISITORS

JEANFIELD SWIFTS

Jeanfield will always have a place in Tayport's history. They were our opponents when we collected the first of the many trophies which have come our way, a 2-1 win after extra time, at McDiarmid Park in 1991 to lift the Perthshire Advertiser Cup (anybody remember the scorers that night?).

When Tayport joined the Junior ranks in 1990/91, Jeanfield were one of the top sides in the association, missing out on the Tayside title that season by only 2 points. However, apart from a few resuscitations along the way, the direction since has generally been downwards. Relegated in 1995, Swifts bounced back immediately as champions in '96 before going down again in '98.

It was around this period that the future looked bleak indeed with a closure imminent but a period of grace from the TJFA gave Swifts the opportunity to regroup. This they did with some success, returning to the top division as champions again in 2000 only to be relegated in 2001.

Manager Tom Van der Ham, on moving back to Perth from Stirling Albion earlier this season, found himself with a sizeable rebuilding job after Swifts' relegation from the Premier Division last season. They have struggled a bit this term, missing out on automatic promotion. Even a play-off spot now looks beyond them. However cup football is no respector of reputations, as a 2-1 win for Swifts over Bankfoot in the North End Challenge Cup last week. And we all know what Bankies did to us down here earlier this season.

Swifts win against Bankfoot was achieved without the services of regulars Brian Green, Gary Miller and Mike Boyle but they were always in control and could even afford the luxury of a missed penalty from Dean Mitchell.

It was back to the drawing board, however on Wednesday past when Swifts went down 3-1 at home to Blairgowrie in the Rosebank Cup

Van der Ham will see this afternoon's game as a further opportunity to measure his team's improvement. Swifts' tidy ground adjacent to a very smart social club brings to mind the 'slumbering giant' cliche.

Two Tayport players anxious to do especially well this afternoon are Ross Gunnion and Colin 'Dibble' McGlashan, both of whom stay in Perth. Both were on the bench against Forfar on Wednesday as boss Baikie continued to shuffle his pack in an attempt to find a balance between being match fit and being overplayed. Both are likely to start today.

SUPER LEAGUE SET-UP

People have been quizzing the committee what exactly is happening with the neleague set-up next season. Here we'll try to clarify some points regularly asked

Will Tayside JFA still exist? No, Tayside, Fife and the East, in its present form, will disappear and be replaced by the new EAST REGION JFA.

What will happen to the Tayside clubs which don't make the top four? They will form two new 'Tayside District Leagues' each of 10 clubs.

What about Fife? One new league of their 12 remaining clubs. And East? Two new leagues, each of ten clubs. All will be under the umbrella of the new East Region.

How will Tayside determine what clubs are in the two district divisions? At the moment there are 24 clubs, the top four of the Premier Division will join the Super League. The next six top places form the core of the new Premier Division. The top two clubs in this season's Division One also automatically join next season's Premier Division. The two bottom placed Premier clubs this season will play off against the two clubs which finish in 3rd and 4th spot in this season's Division One. The winners take their place in next season's Premier, the losers are in next season's Division One.

Next season, what happens with relegation? The bottom three teams will drop out of the Super League and return to their respective District Leagues and be replaced by the champions of the Tayside, East and Fife District Leagues.

But what if say, two Tayside teams finish in the bottom three? They will both slip back into the Tayside District League. Which could then have an uneven number of teams? Yes, but the District League will just have to accommodate this situation.


Will Super League teams still play in local Tayside cups? As far as we know the cup make-up will be unchanged.

When will league games be played? Don't know yet but the season looks like starting earlier.

Any Sponsors lined up? Don't know. The silence has been deafening

There's been talk of breakaways by clubs unhappy with the changes. What's the story here? There's no chance of that happening. The changes won't have any real effect for local sides apart from those moveing to the Superleague. In fact it could benefit the local game with other clubs having a chance of a league challenge.

WHERE TIME SEEMS TO HAVE STOOD STILL



Think of the South of Scotland League and you think of the Tennent's Scottish Cup preliminary round with the occasional South of Scotland League club, like St Cuthbert Wanderers or Annan Athletic getting into the third round, a spot on Sportscene and an interview with Chick Young as they dream of getting through to a tie with Rangers or Celtic.

Creetown FC is currently near the top of the 15 club South of Scotland League and, although they've slipped in the last couple of weeks, they were looking good for the title. However, despite their status, Creetown's Castlecary Park (photo) is a far cry from what one might expect from a club playing in Senior football.

You will notice from the photo that, such is the benign nature of life in the south west, they don't even need to take down the nets between matches.

Pleasant enough area for a pre-season tour but not much in the way of night life, though.



THE BAIKER'S BIT

It's been a long time since I've felt so disappointed as I did at the end of our cup-tie at Thornton last weekend. Football throws up injustices from time to time and I believed I witnessed one last Saturday. By half-time the game should have been over as a contest.

In my opinion we produced our best team performance of the season - with one exception - goals. Or should I say, the lack of them, although we went in 1-0 up. Really, Thornton couldn't have



grumbled had it been 5-0 at that stage. Thornton quite literally couldn't get out of their own half of the park.

I expected Thornton to improve in the second which, in turn would make life more difficult for us. They did, but to no great extent and we were still in control of the game. I really felt that the only way they would cause us a problem was with a set-piece and with a little bit of help they were awarded, in my opinion, three decisions that were completely wrong and to Thornton's credit, they converted all three.

I'm rarely critical of officials. I know they have a difficult remit, but the official on the day got it wrong. The last one happened at our dugout-less 'technical area'. The assistant referee agreed with us that there was no hand ball. It happened five yards from him and he had a clear view. The referee's view was restricted but the assistant refused to correct the referee and they score the winning goal from that set-piece with one minute remaining. I don't see that as 'assisting'!

It left us absorutely gutted. One of the old Thornton punters quipped 'you've only yourselves to blame, the game should have been over after half an hour'. And he's right of course.

As it should have been on Wednesday night against Forfar West End, but at least we didn't have the friendly intervention we had at Thornton. Despite the missed chances we did enough to say that we thoroughly deserved our win.

Today we have Jeanfield Swifts as our visitors and I'd like to welcome them to Tayport. This afternoon we have an opportunity to earn a place in the quater-finals of this cup. I believe that if we apply ourselves in the correct manner, we can achieve victory.

REVIEW

Ironically, however, within two minutes team-mate Bobby Brown notched the next goal but it was 'Port who benefited from the experienced defender's uncharacteristic blunder, when Brown lashed a loose ball into his own net from a couple of yards out.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

TWENTY YEAR AGO - APRIL 1982

You could buy a new Lada from the Bridgend Garage in Freuchie for £2893, less a minimum trade in price of £800 for your old car as long as it was roadworthy. The Stingrays were playing the Guardbridge Social Club and it would cost you £3.40 for a high tea at the Star Hotel in St Andrews.

The local news reported that Tayport Boy Scouts raised £350 from their jumble sale. Eck Beat won £6 in Tayport FC's Golden Goals lottery.

'Welcome to Tayport' signs were to be erected at both entrances to the town by the Community Council and the District Council had set aside £800 to pay for repairs to the paddling pool on the Common.

There was consternation in the town over the changes to the bus timetables. Community Councillor Ian Mathers was incensed that the bus company had not turned up at a meeting and was quoted as being adamant that the Community Council would fight to establish a satisfactory timetable.
