As well as the fact that it's a semi-final tie, today's game holds extra interest in that opponents North End have more than a sprinkling of players and management with a Tayport FC connection. It's a situation which is sure to give the tie extra spice.

38 years old Dave Reilly, a legendary figure here at Canniepairt through his record number of goals for the club, is still weighing in with his quota of crucial strikes. If Dave is merely legendary then his strike partner at North End, Stevie Ross, could be a candidate for future canonisation as the memory of his two goals in the OVD final (and one in the final the following year) drift away with the mists of time! When will Tayside see the like again?

Still on that OVD win, cup winning skipper Sean Wilkie is back at The Canniepairt and he demonstrated in the recent Laing League Cup final that his passion for winning is as keen as ever. If ever a player wanted to put one over his former club, it was Sean that night.

Wing-back Barry Gardiner, sporting a new image following a make-over as he travelled the world, is as lively as ever and the Dokens' coaching staff takes on a distinctly 'Port hue in the shape of Paul Reilly and record breaking 'keeper Fraser Mann.

Tayport already have some silverware in the bag and a Concept Trophy Final to look forward to next Saturday but, for North End, the season can only be prolonged by a win here in the Findlay Cup this afternoon. A defeat will leave them trophyless with one league fixture remaining to complete an injury restricted season. The most recent of those injuries was a broken arm sustained by towering defender Chris Martin, who, ironically, had been brought in from the amateurs late in the season to provide injury cover. There will be a new face in the North End line-up, that of midfielder Bobby Hughes, a player with whom Tayport were credited with an interest at one time, and who was signed from Newburgh just before the deadline.

Work commitments permitting and recovery from an injury sustained on Monday, Tayport could have Scott Flynn in to face his former teammates for the first time since moving from North End Park in March. Incidentally, apart from keepers Frazer Fitzpatrick and Duncan Bruce, Scott is the only player still waiting to find an opponents' net this season. Frazer was doing his best to end that spell on Monday evening when he appeared from the gloom to add weight to the team's scoring efforts in the closing minutes of the league game with Forfar West End. All to no avail of course.

This afternoon's game is to be played to a finish with extra time and penalties if required.

SUPERLEAGUE ... May 16

This week's Pyramid News editorial

Ayrshire clubs met this week and resisted the temptation to vote with their feet against the decision of WEST REGION's steering group not ot give them local autonomy for their new District league and cups. This could help to calm a growing crisis in the EAST... where WHITBURN have declared their intention not to accept the promotion they have earned. Neither revolt will affect the setting up of new regions..... all it may do is bugger up the East Superleague numbers game and lead to resolutions to expell or discipline offending clubs. That could quickly lead to some leaving the junior system. This is sad, because in both cases, the proof of the pudding is in the eating it's just like getting your youngsters to eat their lettuce. But... like stubborn children.. these cliubs do not want to know that this diet is likely to be good for them. They prefer to stick their heads in the proverbial sand and pretend that chips and gravy is best The problems arising from these situations are numerical and philosophical.

NUMBERS GAME.....

As things stand, with PENICUIK returning to the East district Div 2, the numbers are - Super 12, Tay Prem 10, Tay 1st 10, Fife 12, East 1st 10, East 2nd 11. If this is an isolated case, their may be room for a compromise for one year which gave an extra place to FIFE, provided FOUR East clubs go up. Then Fife, East 1st and East 2nd would all be 11 clubs, 20 league games. Tayside already has a plethora of competions to fill their small gap. In the West, the threat of three Ayrshire clubs not taking up places in Supe premier division (the second level) has been averted. It would have been covered by simply adding more Central sides. If, however, the problem in EAST widens to a serious degree, then it may not be possible to simply make up the numbers from other East, Fife and Tayside clubs. That would mean a tiny minority are defying the vast bulk of junior football and THAT problem must be addressed.

BETTER RULES NEEDED....

This problem stems <u>directly</u> from the opposition of certain clubs to the changes approved at last year's AGM.... and the fact that a silly rule is allowing them to hold everyone else to ransom.

Ayrshire's problem can easily be satisfied by keeping their <u>bank account</u> and committee meetings.... which nobody has the power to prevent.... whilst they work in the new region to get things improved... over a period of time. They have formed a committee and invited local MP Brian Donohoe to get involved. Meanwhile, EAST's problem can be satisfied even more simply.... <u>just try</u> the new set-up for a year. If it doesn't work... we'll all be under pressure to hold our hands up and look at other options... within the rules... at AGM 2003.

TAYSIDE refused to attend the last regional meeting because they are 100% behind the new system and want it to take effect as per AGM ruling. Even so, a proposal from Bonnybridge that the new constitution be thrown out was defeated by a 17-16 majority. There was also a narrow majority for retaining £3 and £1 entry (as stupid as that), instead of £4 and £2 for Superleague. This shows that the dissenters CANNOT POSSIBLY WIN A VOTE in the new region. The vast majority in East, Fife and Tayside support change... as they do in the WEST.... and in the NORTH. In this situation, it is no good pussy footing around the problem.

At the end of the day, there are only TWO roads that can be gone down. One is where ALL clubs accept the AGM decision..... join the new regions and accept (and contribute to) new systems being laid down for their benefit as well as everybody else's and talk about any changes that may ne needed. Two is where "wreckers" take a hike found their own "Brigadoon league" (maybe the Welfare FA will take them) and let the rest get on with the REAL PROBLEM of improving the game. The first step should be to get rid of any possibility of opt-out without serious sanction demotion to the lowest league... exile from the major cups. In the case of entire regions on strike...... they must be expelled. There are 165 clubs in the juniors. We are in danger of losing only a half dozen who are any good and they won't be much good outside. Secretary, Allen Bryce, has said "the region lost an AGM vote and have to get on with things"... The sensible Junior majority needs to BACK HIM UP. Most of these clubs will then back down...



REVIEW



The English quickly got into gear and raced into a three-goal lead, with goals from Mick Cantwell, Rob Busst and Les Wardle after only twenty minutes played.


With some of the Scots in the crowd sensing a mauling at the hands of the "Auld Enemy" the

"Boys in Blue" managed to keep the English forwards at bay to go in at half time without conceding any more goals.



THE SUPER LEAGUE

Speculation still abounds after reports that Whitburn have decided to exert their option of not stepping up to the Superleague. Linlithgow Rose are reported to be making a statement after the OVD Cup final tomorrow.
