Tayport and Kirrie have been keen adversaries since Tayport took their first tentative steps in the Junior game. The closely fought games that season have been repeated many times since although Tayport have generally had the upper hand since Kirrie returned to the top Division five years ago.

Today's game will be, as usual, keenly contested. Kirrie, with their seven or so new signings showing signs of finding their feet, are putting some form together. Both clubs move into a month which will be dominated by cup ties and will be keen to close the first part of the league season with a win. Tayport, in fact, are likely to have cup ties in each of the next four weeks.

'Port will be anxious to keep well in touch at the top of the table while Kirrie, after an indifferent start to the season will be looking to recapture the form which has seen them in the top four during the last three seasons.

One player who will be anxious to put on a showing is Jake Thomson who moved from Canniepairt to Westview during the close season.



Since winning the Division One title in 1997, Kirrie have established themselves as one of the most consistent and respected sides in the Premier Division and there's little doubt they will provide a very stiff test this

afternoon. Indeed they have been one of the few sides to have left the Canniepairt with a victory under their belt in recent seasons, winning 3-2 on their way to lifting the Tayside/North North End Centenary Cup in 1999.


Injuries and other unavailabilities meant that Thistle were unable to field their strongest team during the early part of the season and this reflected in their results and consequently they failed to qualify for the knock-out stages of the League Cup. League form has been mixed with wins over Bankfoot (a) and Broughty (h) and defeats from Carnoustie (a) and North End(h).

Reports from the Kirrie camp, however, indicate that the pool is back to full strength for the first time this season and that the several new faces drafted in during the close season, including Jake Thomson from Tayport (pictured) are settling in fine. The amateur ranks were raided for defenders David Robertson and Craig Logan as well as strikers Alastair Scott and Graeme Lundberg. Logan, in particular has a good first touch and is rated an excellent find. Lundberg previously had Junior experience with Downfield. Another new face, familiar to local support is Eddie Winks who has played here with Lochee United and Forfar Albion.



As ever, however, Kirrie will rely very much on their seasoned campaigners such as left back Jon Durie, sweeper Sandy Carr, midfielder Ian McKenna and up front the ever dangerous Hamish Soutar.

Kirrie meet a Glentanar side which has improved greatly since we put nine past them three seasons ago. **North End** meet the quaintly titled Wilson's XI at North End Park. Wilson's came out of the amateur grade only last season, winning promotion at the first time of asking but are finding things tough this season in the top division.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

25 YEARS AGO

OCTOBER 1976

Tayport were in league action on the East Common for the last season before moving to the Canniepairt which in October 1976 was still under development from waste ground to football pitch.

On the 23rd of that month it was a Midlands league game v Grove which Tayport won 7-3. Team was Richard Callandar; George Taylor, Lindsay Ancell, Graham McLaren, Ron Fleming; Bobby McMahon, Stuart Davie, Dave Henderson; Abby Oswald, Graeme Dandie and Gordon Hughes. Stewart Ritchie and Matt Lawson were substitutes. Henderson, Davie, Hughes (2), Ritchie, Dandie and Fleming were the marksmen.

Dandie a prolific scorer, who hailed from Guardbridge, had only a relatively short spell with the club but the rest of that squad gave the club many years service during the 70s and 80s. It was a season in which the club, under the management of Bobby Waddell, reached the 6th round of the Scottish Cup before being eliminated at Cambusbarron.

On 23rd October 1976 the Alliance (Reserve) XI were winning 3-2 at Newport in a Lunan Trophy tie. Representing 'Port were Derek White (or 'the Cat' as he described himself in the Bell Rock last week); Ernie Sherrit, Alan Davie, Frank Feechan; Ian Rae, Bruce Ritchie, Gordon Gray, Doug Henderson; George Ritchie, Ian Howe and Frankie Dewar. Subs. were Andy 'Bunt' Robertson (surely not? must have been short - very short - that week!) and Gavin Anderson. An own goal, Gray and Dewar netted for Tayport.

More than a sprinkling there, of players who gave the club lengthy service including recent Kirrie Thistle secretary Alan Davie. Ian Rae, a teaching colleague of Alan's at that time, has featured regularly on Radio Tay during the past few weeks doing a trailer for 'Caring For Kids'.

FORMARTINE WILL BE FORMIDABLE OPPONENTS

Formartine United may not be the most familiar name to Port supporters but they are quickly making a name for themselves in the North Region, and are arguably the top side in that Region at present. Like Tayport, Formartine were founded in 1947, elevating to Junior status in 1960 when they played at Station Park, Udney, just north of Aberdeen. Shortly after joining the Juniors, they moved along the road to North Lodge Park, Pitmedden, a ground in which they have invested heavily in recent years.

The arrival of ex-Cove Rangers and Inverurie Locos boss Dave Cormie as manager three seasons ago sparked off the escalation in the club's fortunes which had a high last season with an appearance in the last eight of the Scottish Junior Cup.

Redoubtable opponents at home, where they hit six or more goals on four occasions and only lost one league game last season, Formartine have been banging them in again this time round with 28 goals in seven league starts.



