



OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP SECOND ROUND TAYPORT v SCONE THISTLE

If one is to compare the respective pedigrees of today's teams, Scone are rated at very long odds. But as we know, cup football is a one off and, although there is virtually the length of two divisions separating the sides, Scone demonstrated in the last round that the form book can be ripped up when it comes to the OVD Cup.

Scone can claim to be Perthshire's oldest football club. Founded in 1882, the club was a member of the North Perthshire League until the outbreak of the First World War. At the end of hostilities, the Jaggy Nettles took Junior status. In between times the club played at Juvenile level.

Considering Tayport's record in the OVD Cup, they have a squad of players with relatively little experience in the competition. Main exceptions, of course, are Grant Paterson and Allan Ramsay. Billy Spence, too, knows what it's like to get to the final, having been a member of the Kelty team which went down 1-0 to Kilwinning Rangers in 1999. It's probably the case that Grant Paterson, today embarking on a 12th successive OVD campaign with Tayport, has played in more ties than any other of the 1,980 players being listed for today's games.

Tayport's pool contains no fewer than eight players making their Scottish Cup debuts for the club but, despite the influx of new talent this season, the team showed at Formartine last week that they have gelled quickly. Some more of the same will do today. Apart from long term absentee, Ronnie Kenneth, another striker, Brian Grant, looks to be the only injury doubt.

Despite their win at Bankfoot in the last round, Scone, with basically a young squad, will travel more in hope than expectation. There is little, doubt, however, that it's a promising squad which Eddie O'Connor has put together. The key to the tie looks to be the first goal. If our visitors can grab that goal, then who knows.



FOOTBALLER FELLED OPPONENT

Tempers frayed and fists flew during a "bad-tempered" amateur football match.

With Lawside Academy FPs Dundee, trailing 4-3 to Tayport Amateurs, a member of the Dundee side struck out and felled an opponent with a punch.

At Cupar Sheriff Court today, Charles McIntosh (33), 9a Scotscraig Court, Dundee, admitted that on September 29 on a football pitch at Tayport Common he assaulted Ian White, 69 St Michael's Drive, Cupar, and struck him on the face with a fist.

Sheriff J. S. Mowat fined McIntosh £12, Accused acknowledged four previous convictions. Violence on the park and subsequent court cases are nothing new as this clipping from the Evening Telegraph in 1973 shows.

The match in question was a Midlands Alliance League game which 'Port won 4-3.

TODAY'S VISITORS SCONE THISTLE

Scone Thistle visit the Canniepairt for the first time on Scottish Cup business and, on paper, will be clear outsiders but as we are all aware, the Cup is all about shocks. That's how Scone reached the second round - by shocking Premier Division Bankfoot in the first round. It was Scone's first success in eight ties stretching back to 1996.

The players hoping to make history by becoming the first Tayside team to score a Scottish Cup goal on the Canniepairt are

DAVID MARTIN - goalkeeper signed from Fair City Amateurs to replace youngster David Rice who was transferred to Ross County last month. David was with Scone several seasons ago and hasn't taken long to get his eye in again. he was man of the match last Saturday in Thistle's 1-0 win over Arbroath Vics, denying the visitirs time after time.

CRAIG WILLIAMSON - Experienced Junior defender previously with Kinnoull and Jeanfield from where he was signed this season

NEIL GARDINER - Graduated through youth sides and now in fourth season with Thistle. Capped at Under 18 youth level.

CHRIS MANN - Moved to Memorial Park two seasons ago from Coupar Angus as a midfielder but has made a Central defensive berth his own.

BRIAN MARTIN - Defence or midfield. Had many seasons with Bankfoot before moving to Scone last season. Club Captain.

GRAHAM BARNETT - Left sided defender or midfielder. Now in second season. Signed from Glencarse U/18s

JODY ALEXANDER - Also in second season, moved from Jeanfield Swifts. Plays in midfield.

ALASTAIR LACKIE - Midfield or up front, Ali signed from Scone Amateurs several seasons ago. Pacy player who netted the winner v Arbroath Vics last week.

DAVID SIMPSON - midfielder signed this season from Aberdeen Lads

NEIL MACDONALD - In first season at Scone. Pacy left sided midfield player equally at home up front. Member of Perth High School's U/18

Scottish Cup winning side last season.

CRAIG INNES - Another first season Junior, Craig plays up front and has already made his mark with several goals. Another member of Perth HS's Cup winning side.

ALAN CAMPBELL - Defender fixed up from Thistle's U/18 side, Alan can also play midfield. Showing great promise.

MARK ROBERTSON - Yet another youngster in his firts season at Scone. Midfield or forward, has netted several spectacular goals this season from free kicks.

CRAIG EAGLETON - 17 years old defender who is currently training with St Johnstone

BRYAN SCOTT - Second season after signing from the Scone Thistle U/18s. Two footed striker who scores regularly and leads the line well.

CHRIS HAMILTON - midfield but can aslo provide cover at the back when called upon. Signed at the start of last season. Pitches in with his share of goals.

NEIL McDOUGALL - Into third season at Scone. A regular goalscorer last season but suffered a pelvic injury from which he has now recovered but has still to reach match fitness.

TOM PURDIE jnr. - Striker in his second season after signing from the U/18s.

JIM FENTON - Veteran forward and player/coach.who can also perform with distinction in a sweeper role. Formerly with Bankfoot, Jeanfield, Kinnoull and Perth Celtic (that gives his age away)

Manager is the well known and vastly experienced EDDIE O'CONNOR. Played for Bankfoot and Newburgh where he was latterly player/assistant manager. Could still turn out in an on-the-field defensive position in an emergency. Has given Thistle a marked Scone identity having attracted a large number of local players to the club and has committed himself to a youth policy for the club.

Eddie is assisted by coach TOM PURDIE snr. and bag man ALAN GRAY who doubles up as goalkeeping coach.

In five cup encounters with Tayport the Jaggy Nettles have still to record a win, having lost an average of five goals per game. A record guaranteed to fire up the visitors.
