On Tayside today's opponents BANKFOOT, by virtue of their 2-0 win over Forfar West End, takes them into a promotion place. BROUGHTY ATHLETIC's comprehensive win over Arbroath SC puts the Whitton Park level on points with the Bankies. Both placings are at the expense of North End who slip down to sixth.

TODAY'S GAME

NCR TAYSIDE LEAGUE PREMIER DIVISION TAYPORT v BANKFOOT ATHLETIC

The loss of their manager prior to embarking on one of the most important league campaigns for years might have suggested a long, hard winter at some clubs. But not at Bankfoot. Manager Robin Brown moved to Newburgh and Bankies appointed his assistant, Scott Brown, in his stead. Scott has seen his players, Division One champions last season, quickly adjust to Premier League football, to such a degree that they currently hold down a Superleague placing.

There aren't many observers who would bank on them being there come June, but that's not to say there isn't confidence within the Athletic camp to say they will be.

Inconsistency seems to be one aspect of Bankfoot game for which the manager has yet to find a satisfactory remedy. Winning at Violet and losing at home to Scone Thistle is a prime example of this inconsistency.

As we know, this is the fourth meeting already between the clubs this season. We met in the Herschell Trophy at Glenesk when Ronnie Kenneth, the country's top goalscorer last season, set us on the way to a 3-0 win before collapsing with an injured knee which has sidelined him since. It proved to be the most difficult of the three games to date, the others ending up in a 4-0 win at Coronation Park and a 7-1 win here on the Canniepairt, both League Cup sectional games.

As already noted, inconsistency has dogged Bankfoot this season but, having tested the water against us three times already, our visitors today will be well prepared and briefed for this afternoon's league encounter. For Tayport, this is arguably the most important of the four games to date. In fact Dave Baikie will probably not be arguing as to its importance. He will be impressing on his charges that it is the most important. Three league points are crucial if the title challenge is to be maintained at its present level.

Bankfoot report a number of injury problems. Tayport will possibly find starting places for some those on the bench last week and Brian Grant, out last week, should be back in action today. Billy Spence, though, has been forced to call it a day due to a recurring injury. For Ross Gunnion, who has featured in all but one of Tayport's 16 games since joining us from Bankfoot during the close season, can hardly have imagined that he'd be lining up against his former teammates four times in as many months.

REVIEW

Despite Tayport's remarkable pedigree, there was not, strangely, a great deal of Scottish Cup experience in last Saturday's starting XI. Several players were making their cup debuts in 'Port colours, while most of the rest had only taken part in last year's ill-fated Cambuslang Rangers tie.

Ironically, club captain Grant Paterson, who knows the competition inside out, spent the majority of the game against Scone Thistle on the bench, to allow youngster Andy Lawson to make his first start of the season. Allan Ramsay, next in line medal-wise, therefore, took the skipper's arm-

band for the 2-0 win.

That Dave Baikie's new-look side have not yet sampled OVD Cup success does not, however, imply any lack of football experience, and Roselea were never likely to cause an upset in this fixture.

John Ward fired Tayport ahead on 26 minutes, but the victory was not secured until the final minute, when Scott Peters (pictured) was well-placed to net the clincher.



Hopefully this second round tie

will prove to be the merely the first leg of the type of lengthy run to the latter stages of the national competition, which was so common during the manager's initial spell at the Canniepairt.





The writing is well and truly on the wall for Stuart Gauley following his non-appearance in Cambuslang Rangers' shock 2-0 OVD Scottish Cup defeat by minnows Blackburn.

Gauley's no-show came as he attempted to obtain a transfer to Ayrshire giants Cumnock, who expressed an interest in him only last week.

His actions are a gamble of monumental proportions for the Somervell Park striker, who is risking the wrath of the famous club as well as drawing flak from team-mates and supporters alike. The player knows there will be one or two dissenting voices within the previously strife- free dressing room were he to be welcomed back into the fold at this juncture by Rangers' boss Andy Cunningham.

Yet, even though the former Arthurlie player considers there to be no way back now, he plans to contact his Cambuslang boss this evening, a courtesy he did not afford him ahead of his OVD absence.

Said Gauley: "Some of the lads were obviously drowning their sorrows after the game and delighted in winding me up with telephone calls in the early hours of Sunday morning, but I knew beforehand the ones that would be unhappy over what I did. "I'll speak to Andy and establish the lie of the land, but if they don't want me at training, alternative arrangements will need to be made to keep my fitness levels up. "I hope I'm not made a scapegoat for the weekend defeat because the last thing I wanted was for Cambuslang to lose, but I had no intention of being cup-tied and I only acted as I did to bring things to a head.

"When Andy initially told me of Cumnock's inquiry I was not in the slightest bit interested but, after thinking more about a possible move, I phoned 'Nults' (Steven McNulty), who only recently moved there, but was previously a team-mate of mine at Clyde and Arthurlie - and he did a very good job of selling Cumnock to me. "They are a very ambitious club who are more or less guaranteed a place in the new Super League set-up while our chances are no better than 50/50, and I just feel there will be more opportunities to win the top prizes at Cumnock.

"I asked Andy for permission to speak to Cumnock boss Tom Spence on more than one occasion but was refused each time. He knew I was unhappy over the matter when we spoke last Thursday night. "I was then faced with a horrible situation where, if I turned up on Saturday and then refused to play, it would possibly have caused a scene in the dressing room, so I decided it would be in the best interests of both the club and myself to avoid any confrontation."

A seething Cunningham had not totally closed the door on a possible reconciliation when he spoke earlier today, preferring to direct his anger at his team's failings to overcome their Second Division opponents. He fumed: "It has been a long weekend and it goes without saying I'm extremely unhappy that Stuart never made contact before the game. "However, where we go from here depends entirely upon him. Nothing will be discussed regarding his future until we hear his reasons for not appearing on Saturday. "After beating Larkhall and Renfrew away from home we had every right to think the team we had on the park was more than capable of taking care of Blackburn, but we just never performed and it was by far the worst display since I came here. "It was nothing short of embarrassing, and I'm glad we don't have a fixture this week because there is a lot of hard talking and work to be done."

Cumnock boss Spence defended his own team's involvement in the Gauley affair today and spoke of another imminent arrival at Townhead Park from the Central Region. He said: "Yes, we made an approach to Cambuslang about Gauley, but once Andy said he was not for sale that was the end of it at the time. "I don't condone what happened at the weekend and it was certainly not at the behest of anyone at Cumnock. "However, I won't deny being interested if Gauley was to become available at the right price."





.....BUT INTERNET ATTACK ON SJFA PRESIDENT'S TEAM ISN'T PARTICULARLY FUNNY

The following report appeared on the Scottish Juniors' website last Saturday night. The sad thing is the contributor is a mainstay of this particular site but, [I hope] he had been over-imbibing in 'the really nice social club' before sitting down to type his electronic diarrhoea. A pretty scathing attack on the Dokens, nevertheless. I can't imagine North End's John Reilly, the current SJFA President, was particularly amused although I'm sure the players, on reading it at training on during the week, laughed it off, putting it down to the actions of a crank.

From the Internet Saturday 10th November 2001..unabridged

"A crowd of around 400 - but with around 250 Lok fans making up most of the numbers - witnessed a scrappy OVD tie at North End Park between hosts Dundee North End and Pollok.

North End had very few ideas to their game apart from deep crosses across the Lok back 3 while Pollok in return had to rely on Alex Eadie's height in the first half.

North End, I must say, were the most disgraceful Junior side I have ever witnessed. Within five minutes, four crunching tackles had been inflicted on Lok players with the referee doing nothing to clamp down on it. Every time a Pollok player made a tackle, the home players would collapse to the ground in agony, rolling around like some of Scotland's professional cheats might do. One such incident lead to Alan Dickson being booked for an innocuous 50/50 challenge, the result of which was his own substitution for picking up an injury in the process.

North End's thin-haired No 8 was an absolute disgrace and perhaps made 10 fouls throughout, including an elbow, as well as a second half dive in the penalty area. He body-checked, kicked, went in late. No yellow for him though. North End's captain, No 4, was equally as bad and should have walked for his part in an exchange of blows with Fabiani, considering he had been booked earlier for scything down a Pollok player in the 1st half.

Kevin O'Neil picked up the second caution of the game from the ref for a poor challenge, but one that was no worse whatsoever than those committed by the home side. As the dreary half wore on, more North End players feigned injury, and in return dished out some serious challenges in mock-retribution.

Half time was welcome, and in the second half North End looked bolstered by amazingly still having 11 men, and also by the poorness of Pollok.

Lok had two efforts on goal first half with North End lacking creativity away from their crosses that confounded the Lok defence.

The Lok back three continued to be all at sea in the second half, but it was Lok who went ahead on the hour. Sub John Hendry drilled a free kick wide which the shocking ref decreed had taken a deflection... even though Lok were running back for a goal kick. The corner was swung in and Roland Fabiani tucked the ball into the net at the back post. Soon after the restart, Hendry and a North End player fell over each other chasing a long ball from the North End left-back. Mr Ref booked both of them, but for what, I don't know. It seemed like they got in each others way.

Pedantic North End got back on terms from the spot in 67 minutes through Stevie Ross after one of their players fell over Mark Sherry, and at this stage they deserved to be level. Parity didn't last though and with twelve minutes left, John Hendry got on the end of a cross and bundled the ball over the line to send Lok in the the lead once more.

Deep into stoppage time, John Hendry won a challenge on the stand side, but no! Referee has his book in his hands and sends him off. At the time I couldn't believe it, and, having seen the incident twice on video since, I'm even more lost for words. Despite the set-back, North End cheaply gave away possession just inside their own half - after about 5 mins of stoppages - and Phil Cannie ran 30 yards, rounded Mann and rolled the ball into the net.

3-1 flattered Lok maybe, but North End offered very little apart from their long ball tactic. The referee was a downright cheat and there's video evidence to back it up. I've never seen such a dirty, cynical, timewasting team in my life, and quite how the crimecount was DNE -2 yellow, Lok - 4 yellow, 1 red is astonishing. We are anything but a dirty team.

The referee was a disgrace to the pastime and was clearly intimidated by the home side. I don't know the procedure for appointing refs in such a tie, but it stinks. I can't be a bad loser because we won, but we won in spite of the ref. I'm sure if Pollok were to protest the refereeing of this tie, video evidence of this shocking CHEATING display could be acquired. But no, that's against SJFA regulations no doubt. And that's more of a bloody disgrace.

North End Park itself is a nice park. Really nice social club. But I wish the team happy 5th place in Tayside this season. They deserve nothing more. Certainly not a superleague slot".

The school team is going extremely well, with only one defeat to date this season. With Tayport also going well, some of what he has seen over recent years at the Canniepairt must be rubbing off!


