## TODAY'S GAME

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP 3rd ROUND REPLAY  
TAYPORT v FORMARTINE UNITED

It was October 1998 when Tayport last won a Scottish Cup-tie on the Canniepairt. Single goal defeats from Camelon and Cambuslang Rangers has been the story of Tayport's home ties since then. Not the sort of record that we have become used to here and one which Dave Baikie will be determined to improve upon.

He could have asked for easier opponents than Formartine United who showed last Saturday that they are no mugs, their side featuring number of players who are not short on the experience required to contest a Scottish Junior cup-tie. A tidy finish put Tayport on the back foot early on in last week's tie and when Derek Wemyss was sent off straight after half-time, Formartine might have been forgiven for thinking that the tie was in the bag.

It was, however, the cue for Tayport to take the game by the scruff of the neck. Players like Paterson, Peters and Ramsay rolled up their sleeves and inspired the side to recover the situation with a worthy equaliser which earned the chance to bring United down to Fife.

Indeed, had it not been for a superb stop by the impressive young keeper Ryszard Gorski, when he denied Brian Grant, Tayport might have finished the tie at the first time of asking. Formartine will have seen it differently, however, and will be confident of getting a result.

Steven Stewart will play his first game back at the Canniepairt after a season and half away, first at East Stirling and then latterly at Montrose. Steven's transfer was completed just in time to allow him to be included in the squad for Oakley. He came on as substitute against the Fife champions but started last week and looks certain to retain a starting jersey this week.

One player who won't be starting is Brian 'Bomber' Harris who has been transferlisted.

Today's game has to be played to a finish, with extra time and penalty kicks if required. Should this be the outcome, then, with the shortest day of the year almost upon us, we are bound to struggle for light, perhaps putting into question the decision not to have the kick-off earlier.

## TODAY'S VISITORS FORMARTINE UNITED

Formartine are currently the top team in the North Region, a status established over the last couple of seasons. Although they missed out on the championship, there was a good reason - they became bogged down in the OVD Scottish Cup. On their way to the quarter finals, United went down 0-2 away to eventual winners Renfrew but, it took six weeks to dispose of Maybole in round 4 thanks to a draw and then several postponements.

Despite the success of last season, Manager Dave Cormie, freely acknowledged as the North's top boss, moved to strengthen his squad in the close season by signing defender Iain Alexander from Highland League Champions Cove Rangers, Niall Corser from Spartans and striker Colin Milne (pictured) from Elgin City. More recently Cormie plundered the Seniors again to fix up defender Clark Killoh from Fraserburgh.

Milne netted the Formartine goal last week, and wasn't exactly the flavour of the day with the travelling Port support after being involved in the incident which saw Derek Wemyss sent off, but the jousts between him and the sponsor's man of the match John Ward, was a feature of the game.

There are more Formartine players than Tayport players in today's line-ups who featured when the sides last met here in 1997, several of whom who had come through the club's youth scheme.

Formartine this afternoon defend an unbeaten away record which stretches back to August. Indeed their only defeat in a 15 game run since then was by Tayport in the Concept Trophy last month. In the league Formartine are unbeaten and look well placed to lift their first ever North Championship

Complacency, in one word, describes our performance that day. But make no mistake, I'll take a reversal like it if we can learn from it and go on another 17 game - or more - unbeaten run. We followed that with two good away victories at Broughty Athletic and Oakley United. I felt that our workrate was better and we deserved to win both games. Broughty are a good young side whose effort is very rarely in question. But I felt we more than matched that and, especially in the first half, created numerous chances to have put the game beyond doubt. The 2-1 win didn't really reflect our supremacy.

Conditions at Oakley had a major bearing on the lack of football played. I felt that although we were the better side throughout and deserved our 1-0 win, I was personally disappointed with the lack of scoring opportunities which we created. But we've gone to the Fife champions with a fairly young side and won comfortably. The game also saw a return to the club's ranks for Steve Stewart. I'm delighted to have Steve back with us and I'm confident, given time to settle back in, He'll do a great job once again for Tayport.

Last weekend's 1-1 draw at Formartine was very much as I had expected. You don't give a team like Formartine a 3-0 defeat on their own patch and go back a couple of weeks later expecting the same performance. Of course, their attitude and knowledge must improve and they, rightly so, were up for it. I felt we weren't strong enough and didn't work hard enough in the first period with too many players looking for others to do their job. But, in fairness, we improved in that department in the second period and I felt we were probably unlucky not to win this tie.

So we meet again with it all still to do. I say to my players, if last week's performance is to be repeated, then we have problems. But, if the second half of both our previous encounters are repeated, then there's no doubt in my mind that we can and will, be in the hat come tonight.

## REVIEW

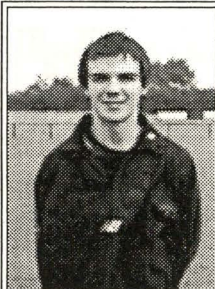

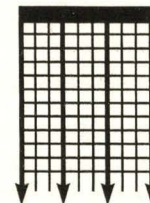

## FROM THE ARCHIVES

**10 YEARS AGO**

**NOVEMBER 1991**

10 years ago Tayport played their first match against a North Region (East) club when they met LEWIS UNITED in a second round OVD Scottish Junior Cup-tie at the Chris Anderson Stadium in Aberdeen. Since then Tayport have played another 15 different *Printagraph* Premier and *Camstruction* Div 1 (east) clubs in Scottish and Zamoyski/North End Centenary/Concept ties.

The game was played on 30th November 1991 with Tayport winning 5-0 with goals from Dave Reilly (2), Kevin Thoms, Grant Cushnie, and Jackie Devine.

The attendance was "approximately 40 (37 from Tayport!)", according to the records which added "lights were on in the second half and this helped Tayport sparkle"

Tayport's line-up was - Fraser Mann; Paul Reilly, Grant Paterson, Mark Spalding, Andy Sommerville, Sean Wilkie, Jimmy Hunter, Grant Cushnie, Kevin Thoms, Dave Reilly, Jackie Devine. Substitutes were Gary Lamont and Billy Coventry. All household names here at The Canniepairt.

Mann, Dave & Paul Reilly and Wilkie are now at North End. Andy Sommerville is manager at Violet where Mark Spalding was pressed into action again the other week, despite having announced his retiral. Devine is at Carnoustie Panmure, Cushnie is a key player with amateur hotshots Riverside, Coventry is on Elmwood's transfer list. Jimmy Hunter, Gary Lamont and Kevin Thoms have retired, the last named to Scotsraig Golf Club. However, still wearing the No 3 jersey with Tayport is the evergreen Grant Paterson who turned in his usual immaculate performance at Formartine last week.

## **Dailly is the local hero**

Tayport emerged from their trip north with a most creditable draw, in the third round of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup, despite conceding an early opener to a confident Formartine outfit, then playing almost the entire second half with only 10 men, following the dismissal of Derek Wemyss.

Out to avenge their Concept Trophy defeat of a month ago, the locals were delighted to take a ninth minute lead, when Tayport did not adequately clear a long ball, enabling Formartine striker Colin Milne to turn sharply and rifle his shot beyond Frazer Fitzpatrick.

From then on, the visitors dominated. Steven Stewart, in his first start since rejoining the club, played up-front alongside Brian Grant and created a fine chance for his strike partner, on the half-hour mark, only for home 'keeper Ryszard Gorski to produce a solid block.

Moments later, Grant was again denied by the goalkeeper, while Scott Peters blasted an effort into the side-netting, as Tayport's pressure resulted in a series of corners. Ultimately, though, 'Port would trail at the interval.

Fifteen seconds into the second half, Derek Wemyss was deemed to have been the last defender, when he fouled Colin Milne and the referee, who had made controversial decisions in the first half, not surprisingly, elected to show a red card.

Fortunately, neither the numerical disadvantage, nor the rain-soaked pitch, could prevent the Canniepairt side from producing a positive, spirited performance, of which the travelling support could be justifiably proud.

Strong running from the likes of Ross Gunnion and Steven Stewart ensured that there would be opportunities for Tayport to draw level. Gareth Dailly, for example, tested Gorski, after fine play from Brian Grant, who also forced the 'keeper to push away a dangerous cross which narrowly eluded Steven Stewart.

Barry McNaughton was another threat to the Formartine defence, and when he found Brian Grant with a fine crossfield pass, the striker curled an effort towards the top corner, only for Gorski to acrobatically tip the ball over the bar.

Tayport's desire was rewarded in the 70th minute, when a throw-in

found its way to Gareth Dailly, who attained hero status amongst the 'Port support by netting the much-sought-after equaliser with a low drive.

In the ascendancy, Tayport could well have gone on to win the game. Steven Stewart saw a header saved by the goalkeeper, but their best opening came in the final minute of the contest. Scott Peters headed away a last-gasp Formartine corner, this led the charge upfield, releasing substitute Brian Craik, who found space inside the opposing area, only to shoot tamely at an inform custodian.

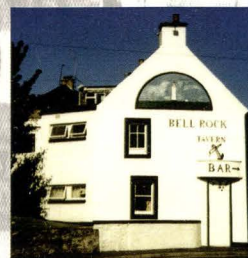

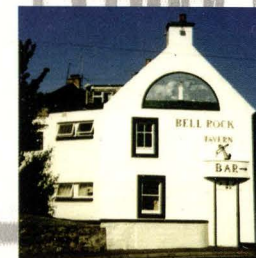
