Violet's expected challenge for a Super League place has got off to a less than auspicious start, with the Glenesk side currently occupying a relegation berth. There's little doubt, however, that this is a false position with Violet showing, in sharing the spoils in a six goal thriller against us at Glenesk in October, that they can play a bit.

Today's game, therefore, should provide entertaining fare for those supporters choosing the bracing Canniepairt air in preference to a trek round the shops or engaging in some pre-Christmas socialising.

A keen edge will be added to proceedings by the presence of three former 'Port personnel now with the Pansies. Coaches Andy Sommerville and Dave Tosney along with defender Kenny Jones were all major factors in Tayport's success in the three year period from spring 1998.

In addition, Tayport and Violet survive as the Association's sole OVD Cup representatives, by coincidence also the only two Tayside clubs to have won the competition in its 116 year history.

John Holt, Dundee United's Community Coach, is Violet's 'Technical Adviser' as secretary Lyall Murdoch puts it, and he has gathered quite a number of ex Seniors to his squad. Chris Devine, for example was at Dundee United and Arbroath, striker Paul McIlreavy was at Dundee United, then had a spell in USA before returning to play with Forfar Athletic and latterly Montrose. Transfer listed Gavin Tinley was at East Fife while big Jonathan McKeith was at Brechin City. Other new faces are defender Richard Thomson and, from Downfield, a familiar face in Michael Clark.

Tayport, already with a small pool, have Andy Lawson unavailable. Brian Harris is transfer listed, Allan Ramsay is likely to miss out through injury. Derek Wemyss, though, should be back from holiday in time to play. Steven Stewart plays his first league match since returning to the Canniepairt.

With points vital, it's a crucial game for both clubs.

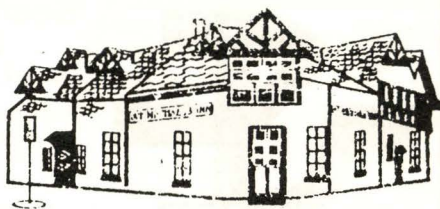

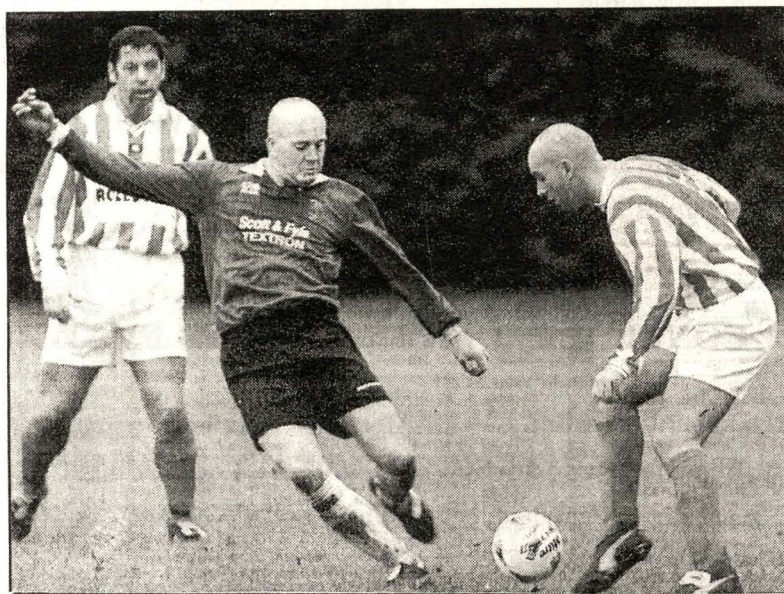

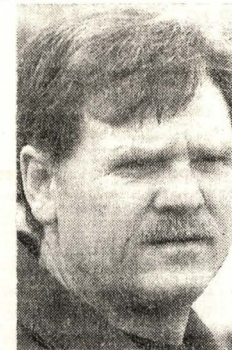

REVIEW

Last Saturday saw Tayport secure their place in the draw for the fourth round of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup, and, ultimately, a glamour tie away to old rivals, Pollok.

The win against Formartine United was encouraging, especially given the North Region outfit's current status.

There was little to separate the teams in the opening half-hour, but a couple of headed goals, in the lead-up to half-time, paved the way for a comfortable victory.

Non-stop midfielder Allan Ramsay opened the scoring, with provider Brian Craik himself netting the second, five minutes later. In the second half, after Formartine had been reduced to ten men, Gareth Dailly sealed the 3-0 triumph with a classy finish.

Derek Wemyss, however, will remember the match for less auspicious reasons. In the final minute of the contest, he was ordered off, thus chalking up his second red card of the tie; a situation which is sure to have further consequences.

The defender had, at least, played his part in an important clean sheet, which was nearly spoiled by United substitute Colin Milne, who did find the Tayport net. Only lengthy protests prompted the referee, who seemed determined to award a goal, to consult his assistant and eventually penalise Milne's unfair challenge on Frazer Fitzpatrick.

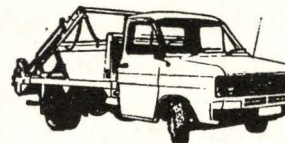
Hopefully such controversies will play no part today, as 'Port return to league duty against the potentially dangerous Dundee Violet.

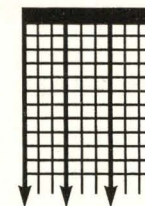

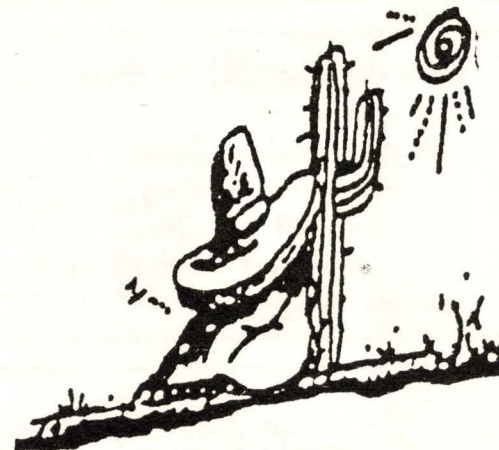

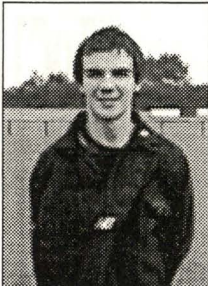

Tayport and Pollok have clashed on four previous occasions in the OVD Cup during the 12 years we have been involved in the Juniors. And each encounter has been a classic.

In 1990-91 season Pollok attracted a huge crowd to the Canniepairt, as the local fans got an early taste of the big game atmosphere. It was a 5th round tie and the experience of the Glasgow side proved to be the decisive factor that day as they recorded a 4-1 win.

Next came the 1997 Final at Fir Park with holders Tayport's hopes of retaining the cup dashed by a 3-1 win for Pollok.

Less than a year later the two sides were paired in a quarter final tie on the Canniepairt. Another bumper attendance saw Tayport throw away a two goal lead before settling for a 3-3 draw. A crowd of over 2,000 attended the replay at Newlandsfield. The 120 minutes was not a classic but a penalty shoot out ensured the tie would be decided in nailbiting fashion. Grant Miller, a cup hero for Carnoustie last season, was the sinner that afternoon, blasting his shot from the spot high and wide to send Pollok into the last 4.

The club has played at Newlandsfield on several occasions, including friendlies and Tennent's seven a side competitions with Grant Paterson, Steven Stewart and Alan Ramsay having played there on many occasions. With a social club and a big pub adjacent to the ground and a Safeways restaurant 50 yards away, Newlandsfield has always been a popular venue for the 'Port support.

A cracking 4th Round draw which will have the sponsors and the SJFA rubbing their hands and hoping for good weather on January 12th. Bumper crowds can be expected at Pollok, Glenrothes, Bo'ness, Fauldhouse, Whitburn, Bonnyrigg, Bellshill and, with Violet having Dundee to themselves, Glenesk will have its biggest attendance of the season to date.

Holders Renfrew seem destined to reach the later stages of the competition again. They've got a relatively easy tie at Lochgelly Albert. Derby encounters at Bo'ness and Fauldhouse will see two East Region sides eliminated. Linlithgow, one of the competition favourites, will be on a potentially sticky wicket at Fauldhouse where the locals are, at the time of writing, unbeaten in the league and racing away with the East Division Two title.

Cup favourites Glenafton are at the Warout Stadium to meet Glenrothes. The Ayrshire club will be subjected to a severe examination of their cup winning potential. Glenrothes were 0-2 behind at Troon with ten minutes of their last round tie left before salvaging a replay which they eventually won on penalties last Saturday. Whilst another Fife side with designs on the cup, Hill o' Beath will see their odds plummet if they can emerge from Bellshill unscathed.

Culter's replay defeat of Central champions Benburb in Glasgow will have raised a few eyebrows and Bathgate will be advised to give the men from the North the utmost respect. Auchinleck got the draw they probably least wanted at the start of January and will be most wary of their trip up North to meet Banks o' Dee.

Irvine Meadow shelled out a good few shekels to sign ex-Dundee United plus about a dozen other Senior clubs, Paul Kinnaird, but the striker provided a quick pay back with both the goals which eliminated Lugar in the last round. Another club hoping that a recent signing will deliver the goods for them is Cumnock. 'Nock paid big bucks for Craig Porter from Linlithgow and he was on the mark v Glentanar in the last round and will be looking for a winning return to the Lothians when Cumnock travel to Bonnyrigg Rose.

Violet will have observed that Petershill are having trouble in the goalscoring department, averaging only a goal a game in the league and will see this as the Glasgow side's achilles heel when the teams meet at Glenesk. It's 14 years since Violet last reached the 5th round and they look to have a better than even chance of at least emulating that 1988 run.

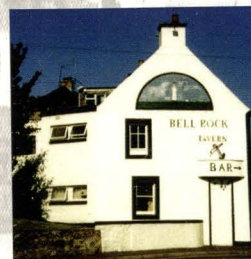

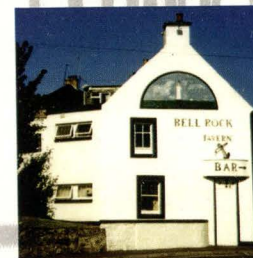
