

Games between Arbroath Sporting Club and Tayport are generally closely fought affairs and, despite the clubs' respective league placings, this afternoon's contest is unlikely to be any different.

Arbroath are in the midst of probably their their poorest season for over a decade and surprise has been expressed at their lowly league position. Light appeared at the end of the tunnel last Saturday, however, when SC recorded their first league win of the campaign, a 2-1 home success over Dundee Violet.

It's a result which will give Arthur Walker's side great heart for the fight to climb clear of a play-off spot. [The bottom two clubs in this season's Premier Division play off against the two sides finishing third and fourth in Division One to see which clubs take their place at Tayside's top table next season.]

It will not have escaped Tayport's notice, either, that Arbroath, despite holding up the table, have only failed to score twice in league games and, although losing all their games on the road, have never been what you might say, thumped. Tayport's home league record is not the best. Only nine goals scored in five contests and three wins out of five is not the fare to which the 'Port support are accustomed.

Arbroath are without the experienced Gavin Norrie through injury while Tayport will likely be without Scott Peters, Allan Ramsay and Steven Stewart. Steven missed out last week after failing a late fitness test and is unlikely to be sufficiently recovered to make the starting line-up today.

Ronnie Kenneth and Colin McGlashan seem set for the striking roles although there could be a place for Davie Evans, if it's decided to play three up front. Derek Wemyss is available again after his two game suspension ruled him out of the Pollok ties.

Bomber Harris has moved to Dundee Violet whilst work commitments mean that Andy Lawson has also left the club.

This afternoon's referee is Jeff Banks from Perth and he will be assisted by Chic Nicoll and John Hayman from Montrose.

Tayport roared into the fifth round of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup, by virtue of a brave replay win against Glasgow cracks, Pollok, who had so often proved to be the Canniepairt side's cup nemesis. Barry McNaughton notched the critical opener, but it was the scorer of the second goal who, perhaps, stole the show.

After being out of action for five long months, Ronnie Kenneth made a heroic return to the line-up on Saturday, having lost none of his incredibly prolific goalscoring form. Partnering Kenneth up front was the club's latest signing, Colin McGlashan, who made his junior debut, following nearly 20 years in the senior ranks.

It was Brian Craik, though, who was first to threaten. Allan Ramsay's excellent pass found Gareth Dailly, wide on the left. Craik was unfortunate not to be able to make true contact with the winger's cross.

There were, however, few chances in the first half, with much of the contest being confined to the midfield area, and several combatants receiving cautions. Pollok's best chances were a Drew McWilliams strike, which flew over the top, and an opening for dangerman Phil Cannie, who was thwarted by the alert Frazer Fitzpatrick.

ly wide, after Joe Bryers had been fouled on the edge of the box, by Barry McNaughton.

Ironically, Tayport took the lead moments later, when Pollok defender Alan Dickson was short with a header back to his goalkeeper, and McNaughton quickly latched onto the mistake, before supplying the supreme finish, which induced vastly contrasting emotions within the two rival elements of the 600-strong crowd.

This blow only served to increase Kenneth's determination, though, and the fairy-tale comeback was completed in the 71st minute. Gareth Dailly's long throw was flicked on by Brian Craik, and Kenneth's outstretched boot guided the ball into the far corner of the net, to send his team into the last 16 of the competition, and the 'Port support into a state of near-euphoria.

Saturday's match was Ronnie Kenneth's first, since scoring against Bankfoot in the curtain-raiser to the new season, way back in August. Now with two goals to his credit in this campaign, the irrepressible forward has

a tally of 60, in less than 50 games, in Tayport colours.

Pollok, for their part, were never allowed to find their rhythm, due to the tenacious spirit of the Tayport players, typified by the willingness of several key men, such as Grant Paterson, Scott Peters and Allan Ramsay, to play through the pain barrier, in pursuit of a previously elusive victory against their Newlandsfield counterparts.
