So there we are. Eddie's watched a lot of football in his time – usually from very close quarters! His thoughts are evenly split – twelve home wins, twelve away wins and seven draws. This does not include, of course, today's match on the Canniepairt.

The third round draw has thrown up some intriguing pairings – none more so than a repeat of last year's final when Linlithgow Rose (the winners) meet Auchinleck Talbot. Neither team are setting the heather on fire in their respective Super leagues although the Scottish Cup will be a totally different ball game. Other inter Regional Super League contests sees Pollok entertain Bonnyrigg Rose Athletic whilst Johnstone Burgh and Maryhill travel to meet ourselves and Arniston respectively. There are also inter Regional "Super" clashes where three North Super League teams, Hermes, Banks O' Dee and Longside travel to meet Irvine Meadow, Carnoustie and Dundee North End respectively. In summary a minimum of seven Super League teams will find their interest in the country's major semi-professional competition ending at this stage.

Another interesting tie will be found at **Fauldhouse** where the homesters entertain near neighbours, both geographically and by league position, **Whitburn**. The recent league clash saw the 2000 OVD Cup winners, Whitburn, win by the only goal of the match.

Overall there are seven North Region teams, twenty-seven East Region teams and thirty West Region teams competing for a place in the last 32 of this season's competition.

TODAY'S GAME OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP TAYPORT v JOHNSTONE BURGH

This is the first competitive meeting of these two sides although we did play each other in a friendly match at Keanie Park at the start of last season. That game finished goalless but we'll be looking for some goals this afternoon.

Whilst, for Tayport, this will be only their second OVD game of the season, it will be the fifth outing in the competition for Burgh. Their last trip to Fife was a 1-1 draw at Lochore Welfare in round one. A 4-2 replay win gave Johnstone a home tie v Lugar Boswell Thistle in round two. There were no goals in the first game at Johnstone but a 1-0 win in Ayrshire was sufficient to take them through to this afternoon's game.

Johnstone, the reigning Central League champions, arrive here unbeaten in their last four games, with keeper Alan Donohoe not having lost a goal during this run.

Despite this impressive statistic, Manager Colin Lindsay must be concerned about his side's scoring rate, with only two goals scored in five games since accounting for Lochore Welfare.

There's little doubt that the Burgh will be relying on this defensive stability to pave their way to the next round. Tayport will not lack confidence for the challenge, however, having come off the back of a deserved win over OVD Cup holders Linlithgow Rose.

With injury concerns having eased up considerably in recent weeks, Dave Baikie has several options in naming his side. Despite more than a few impressive performances last week, he has last season's top scorer Davie Evans, Ralph Hunter, Ross Gunnion, Robbie Holden and Dougie Scott are all waiting in the wings and the Tayport boss may well decide on a change or two.

This is Tayport's 80th Scottish Cup game, their 34th against Central, or former Central league opposition, more than twice as many as against teams from the other regions. Incidentally we have met a side from the (former) Central Region in each of the last 9 seasons.

Referee this afternoon is Mr J.Nicolson from Aberdeen and he is assisted by Mr Mather, also from Aberdeen, and Mr Fleming from Portlethen.

SJFA observer at today's game is Mr Angus Adam who is a former assistant match secretary for the Tayside JFA who ran the now defunct Stobswell Juniors for many years.

TODAY'S VISITORS JOHNSTONE BURGH

JOHNSTONE BURGH became the pride of Renfrewshire six months ago when they collected the Central Premier League Championship for the first time, in its last season before reorganistation and with it, a place in the West Super League. It has been an exciting few years for the Burgh fans, having seen their team come within a whisker of lifting the Scottish Junior Cup in 2000 when they went down 4-3 to Whitburn on penalty kicks in the final after a 2-2 draw.

Older fans had already savoured the taste of Scottish Junior Cup success, with Burgh winning the cup on both their previous appearances in the final in 1964 and 1968.

In goal this afternoon will be ALAN DONOHOE who was previously with Renfrew and Arthurlie. The experienced keeper played a major role in helping bring last season's title to Keanie Park and has been in good form again this season. NEIL McKINNON who signed this season from Renfrew was a member of the Renfrew side which beat Carnoustie in the 2001 OVD final.

BRIAN SMITH, a defender, joined the club in the close season from Maryhill. Defensive lynchpin is 25 years old JASWINDER JUTTLA who had a spells with Glasgow Rangers and Morton but is now in his fourth season with Burgh. Centre half JAMIE BRUCE joined this season from Dumbarton FC.


Another of the new signings is 30 years old NEIL MURRAY, who joined up from Largs Thistle. Also likely to feature in midfield is teenager JOHN McSHANE who was signed this season from Hamilton Accies. JAMES CANNING, another of Manager Colin Lindsay's sixteen new faces this season, was signed from U 21 football.

CHRIS WOZENCROFT came from Auchinleck Talbot as a central defender. A double deal with Cambuslang Rangers in the summer saw defenders GARY ROBERSON and STEWART MAXWELL move to Keanie Park.

Striker IAN ANDERSON scored the goal which knocked out Lugar Boswell Thistle in the last round after weighing in with two in the previous round's replay against Lochore. Netting the goal in the first game in Fife was team captain JOHN McLAY who signed from Clyde six seasons ago.

Teenage striker GAVIN REDMOND, who moved this season from Morton, was amongst the goals early in the season when he netted in three successive games. SCOTT McHARG, the former Clyde and Maryhill player, is also an OVD marksman, having netted v Lochore.

Johnstone can also call upon MOSES APILIGA, signed from Kilbirnie but who had Senior experience with Partick, ex-Auchinleck veteran BILLY THOMSON who has five OVD winner's medals but didn't have the best of luck in his games v Tayport in the competition, experienced right back TERRY FARRELL, fixed up from Arthurlie this year, JAMES DEVENAY, a midfield player from Dalry Thistle and first season juniors CHRIS McCUE and JOHN LYON.

Q.Is it true that an ex-Johnstone Burgh player once scored against Barcelona in the Nou Camp Stadium? - Ex-terror



He also netted one in the second leg at Tannadice which United won 2-0.

Q. Are Assistant Referees' supposed to point out offences to the match referee? - Ef t Pee

A. According to the rules, they are supposed to indicate to the referee "misconduct or any other incident which has occurred out of the view of the referee." Also, "when offences have been committed whenever the assistants are closer to the action than the referee (this includes, in particular circumstances, offences committed in the penalty area)"

Q. Which was the last Tayside junior team to go to the wall? - Interested, Dundee?

A. St Josephs and prior to that it was Balbeggie. Add Stobswell in 1990 and it means that three Tayside teams have disappeared in the last twelve years or so.





R is for RODGER


Jimmy Rodger was probably Tayport's most gifted footballer during a fairly barren spell for the club in the 1960s. Jim made his name as an amateur footballer with Wormit Amateurs, one of the crack amateur sides of the era, and was selected to play for amateur Scotland. He also played Junior for Broughty Athletic before joining Tayport towards the end of his career. Jimmy was a cultured left winger who was noted for the pin point accuracy of his crosses and many a Tayport Amateurs centre forward of that period would have had a much less rewarding career, had it not been for the supply of accurate passes and crosses from Jolly Jim. Jim, who now stays but a hefty keeper's clearance from the Canniepairt, formerly had a bookie's business in Tayport and was also a partner in the Tayport Arms.

S is for SCORING

Over the years every club has had its ups and downs and Tayport is no exception. In their days in the Midlands Amateurs, surely the worst beating was 15-3 in an Alliance League match against NCR at their factory grounds in the late sixties. To be fair, the Tayport lads reckoned that it was just a case of NCR taking their chances, whilst Tayport didn't take theirs. Twenty years later, the club's Fife XI chalked up some high scores whilst playing in the East Fife Amateur league, the highest of which was a 17-1 home win over Crail Amateurs. In the Junior days the highest score was a 14-0 win over St Josephs in a league game in 1998. A year earlier the worst defeat was inflicted on us by Carnoustie, 6-3 in the opening league game of the season at Westfield Park.

T is for TRANSPORT.

Many modes of transport have been used to get Tayport to their opponents ground. Trains, boats, planes and even a hovercraft (that's another story). However apart from private cars, buses have been the main means of getting to and from matches in recent times. In the eighties, the club even had its own 29 seater bus for several years. However, before the Tay Road Bridge was opened in 1966, Tayport travelled to their fixtures mainly by train. It is claimed that the players had the trip to play in Arbroath down to a fine art whereby one ticket was sufficient for the entire team. Some players even travelled by bicycle. No big deal, you might think, but it was in the case of Tony Gillespie, a somewhat extrovert art student who played for the amateurs in the early eighties. Tony was late arriving in Dundee to play in a league game v Timex at Harrison Road, arriving just in time for the kick-off. Asked why he had cut things so fine, Tony replied that there had been a head wind - it transpired that he had cycled all the way from Edinburgh for the game. Off with the clips, on with the boots, Tony scored Tayport's goal in a 1-0 win, before getting back on the bike and pedalling away back to Edinburgh. Aye, they were made of sturdy stuff in those days.
