TAYPORT v MONTROSE ROSELEA

A glance at the stats. page in the centre of this programme gives an indication as to the potential of today's NCR North/Tayside tie to produce an upset. In the first competitive game of the season, Tayport were held to a 1-1 draw by Montrose in the Herschell Charity Trophy at Broomfield Park. Penalties gave Tayport the Trophy but it was a keenly fought contest.

Montrose have made a reasonable start to life in the Whyte and Mackay Tayside Premier Division and if they maintain their current form, a top half of the table finish is more than likely.

Manager Mike Simpson is one of the longest serving managers in Junior football and he was a proud man when Roselea collected their first league title for 50 years last Spring.

Simpson has freshened up his squad since our early season meeting. Out are David Mackay and striker Chris Simpson who has cruciate ligament damage. Into the squad come 'keeper Ronnie Massie, striker Peter Davidson who has been working away from home, young midfielder James McKellar from Montrose FC, striker Callum Watson and defender Paul Ross, both from amateur football.

Eric Watson is top scorer with ten goals and he netted both goals in his side's excellent 2-0 League Cup quarter final win at Thomson Park against Lochee United recently. Watson's strike partner Colin Page has nine to his name, including their opening day strike v 'Port.

Roselea's improved form will be put to the test by a Tayport side who have been on song in recent games and it's only fair to say that the visitors record at Canniepairt can only improve. Currently it's - four visits, four defeats, no goals for, twenty one against.

This is, however, probably the best equipped Roselea side to visit Tayport, a fact Dave Baikie will have this drummed into his players. There will be changes, though. Some, if not all of last week's subs. look likely to get starting places, including Grant Buist, who signed just before the window closed for the season.

Montrose went down narrowly to their league leaders Broughty last Saturday by the only goal of the game, so will be anxious to get back amongst the goals this afternoon in a game that has to be played to a finish.

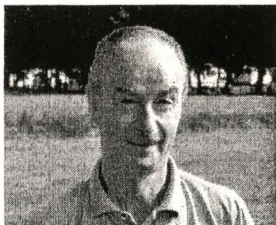

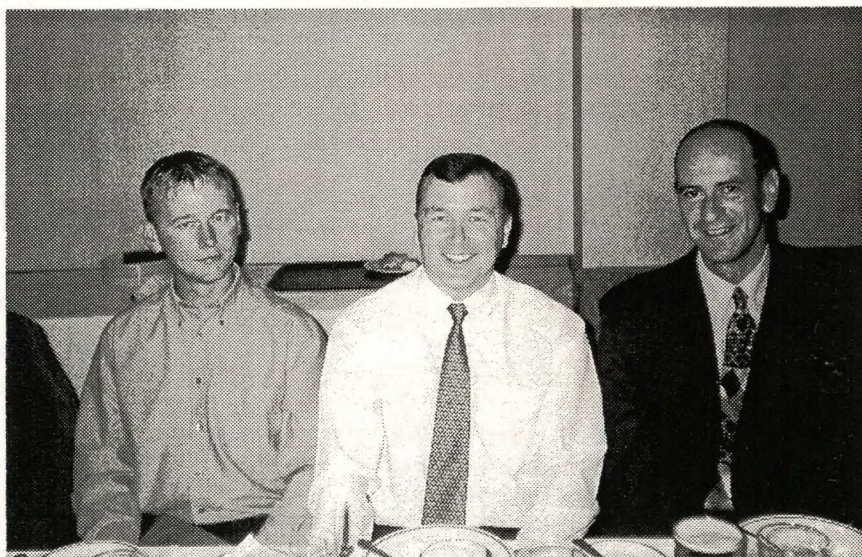

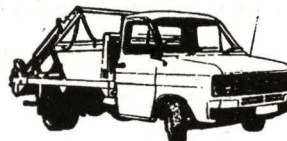

Good afternoon to our fans and a warm welcome to our visitors, Montrose Roselea, for this NCR cup-tie.

They say it doesn't really matter how you win a cup-tie, the important thing is you make it through to the next round. I suppose that really summed up last Saturday for me.



Our 2-0 Scottish Cup victory over Irvine Meadow left me with very mixed emotions. There was the obvious pleasure of moving to another stage in the competition and on the other hand major disappointment of our performance on the day. Some managers may look back at a victory and dismiss the performance. I can't, because then I would be accepting sloppiness, bad passing, poor decision making, less than acceptable workrate, complacency, all of which were evident last week. I'm afraid these ingredients don't win you 'majors' and on another day and with the same standard of performance against a better side, we'd be out of the competition. We got away with it this time. The positive thing is our players are in agreement with me and shared the same emotions as I did after the match, and for me that's very important.

We all know we are capable of producing better than we did and are willing to work to achieve that. I've continually preached down the years of how vitally important quality training sessions are to the success of a club. If you don't produce success in these sessions, you won't produce it on matchdays. I call it preparation. Without it you are on a loser, both as a team and as an individual.

This afternoon we have Montrose Roselea as our opposition. You only need to go back to the opening day of the season and the outcome of that encounter to know that we've a game on our hands today. But I feel if our workrate, discipline and attitude is what we want it to be, we can achieve success and a place in the next round of this NCR cup-tie

How the *Irvine Herald* saw last week's game

Fantastic display but it's cup heartache for Meadow

OVD Scottish Junior Cup 5th round

Tayport.....2 Irvine Meadow.....0

MEADOW'S cup dream ended at Tayport but Robert Reilly's youngsters can be rightly proud of their display against the competition favourites.

Playing some neat, passing football the Irvine outfit took the game to their opponents for most of the 90 minutes, but they lacked the killer touch and all their efforts came to nothing.

In the first half especially Meadow gave their more illustrious opponents a bit of a runaround and some of their passing moves were a treat to watch.

Top scorer Chris Robertson almost gave them a fourth minute lead with a 20-yard drive which was held by home keeper Fitzpatrick then, as play swung to the other end, stand-in goalie Andy Black dealt comfortably with a Brian Craik effort.

An error by John Ward gave Robertson another glimpse of goal but once more Fitzpatrick came to the rescue, but for all their possession Meadow couldn't apply the finishing touch and, completely against the run of play, they went behind in 34 minutes when the unmarked Ward rose to head home a Steven Stewart free kick.

To their credit Meadow refused to buckle under this hammer blow and, even though they were playing into the teeth of a gale after the break, they continued to take the game to the opponents.

But lack of penetration still proved to be their downfall and they were dealt another blow in 61 minutes when Brian Kerr reacted angrily when Ross Gunnion tackled him from behind, aimed a kick at his opponent and was rightly red-carded.

The ten men almost got back on level terms three minutes later when Craig Potter's right wing cross was headed just wide by Robertson then, 16 minutes from time, the visitors were left reeling when keeper Fitzpatrick clearly held Jamie Allison back as the youngster went for the ball but the ref waved away their penalty claims.

For all their possession Meadow couldn't find a way past Fitzpatrick and, as they pushed up in a bid to salvage the tie, they were caught out in the final minute when Dave Evans' 18-yard drive wrapped it up for Tayport and put a rather unflattering aspect on the scoreline.



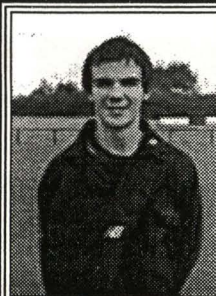

For the third successive game, Dave Evans came off the bench to net a late goal, with Saturday's counter easily being the most significant of the three, securing Tayport's place in the quarter finals of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup.

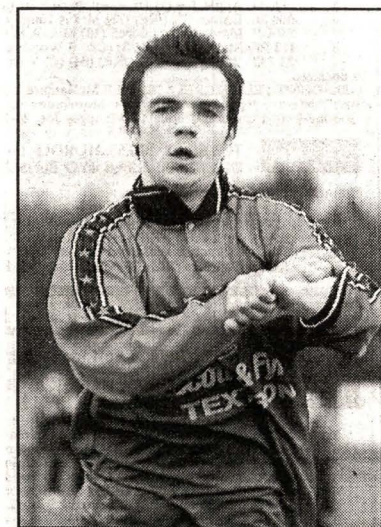
Irvine Meadow, synonymous with the halcyon days of junior football, showed themselves to be a competent outfit, on their first visit to the Canniepairt. Indeed Meadow made the better start to the match creating several shooting opportunities and looking comfortable in possession.

Tayport, on the other hand, were not playing to their normal standards. Fortunately this did not prevent the East Super League leaders from taking the lead, courtesy of a crashing John Ward header, just past the half hour.

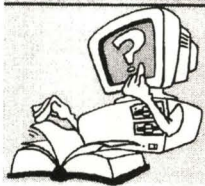
Ward also had a role to play defensively and, alongside unsung colleagues, Roberto Morris, Ross Gunnion and Dougie Scott, contained the Irvine attacks. Consequently frustration got the better of visiting forward Brian Kerr, who was ordered off with a third of the counter remaining.

The tie was not won, however, until Evans' late intervention. Fellow substitute Gareth Dailly was the provider from the left, and the young striker finished with aplomb.

This victory takes Tayport into their eighth quarter final in the 'Scottish' and the seventh in nine seasons under the guidance of the Midas-like Dave Baikie.

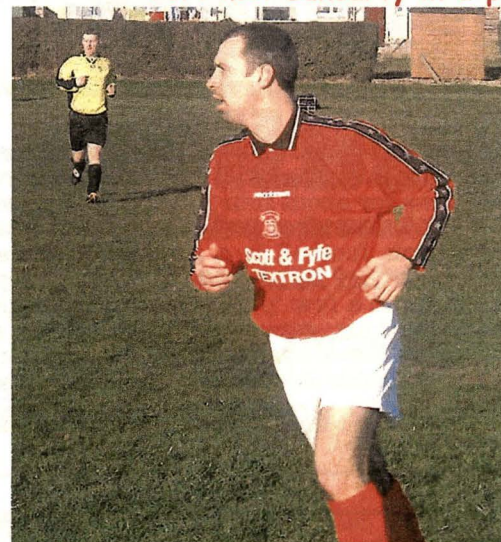

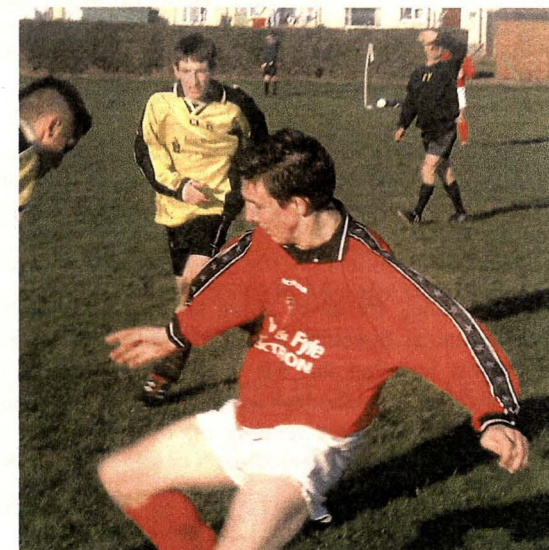

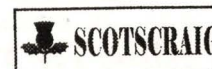

MEDIA WATCH

The *Edinburgh Evening News* and Saturday's *Sun* both had the Bo'ness v Fauldhouse OVD tie as their main feature. *The Sun's* article was exclusively about recent Bo'ness signing from Berwick Rangers, striker Ian Ferguson, who had featured in two Scottish Cup semi-finals with Heart of Midlothian. Perhaps surprisingly, the *News* never mentioned Ferguson, preferring to take comments from both managers. Fauldhouse's manager Jim Harkins said he was very confident and that his team had beaten better teams than Bo'ness. Oh, dear!

Friday's *Evening Telegraph's* main feature was on 'Port v Meadow and the page was illustrated by a photo of Broughty manager Andy Heggie and his new signing from Montrose FC, Ross Lindsay.

The *News of the World* on Sunday (the edition sold in Tayport anyway) had a column on 'East Juniors' and another on 'West Juniors' but neither made mention of the Tayport v Meadow match. It would have been disappointing to buy it and discover the game wasn't mentioned, so just as well reading was confined to the shop.

Monday's *Sun's* main feature was the Rob Roy 2 v 2 Kilbirnie OVD tie describing how the game had turned on two Kilbirnie ordering offs for stamping and head butting when they were 2-0 up. Manager George Walker stating that the headbutter would be heavily fined and that "his feet won't touch the ground".

The *Daily Record's* Gordon Parks was the only reporter to point out that the quarter finals would be clashing with Rangers v Celtic on TV and how Arthurlie boss Frank Lynch was in a fury over this. Away from the OVD cup there was a quote from North End's manager Gary Strachan who reckoned that new signing from Glenrothes was the final piece in his jigsaw - although he believed that the league was now beyond his team.

Monday's *Evening Telegraph* supported the article on Tayport's win over Irvine with two photographs, one of John Ward heading the opener and Davie Evans inexplicably checking his non-existent watch as he raced towards the Tele photographer. When asked about this on Monday, the player could give no explanation for his celebration.

The *Edinburgh Evening News* illustrated Monday's Junior page with a fine photo of two celebrating Bo'ness players and reported on a solid 2-0 Bo'ness win before a bumper crowd of 1,150. Fauldhouse manager merely said his side "were shocking. We lost two draedful goals and it makes it all the more annoying when we told them what would happen" The *News* also reported on a big crowd at Bonnyrigg, "the biggest for years" and the reporter reckoned that, had it not been for 'Rigg keeper Steve Ellison, Arthurlie's winning margin would have been even greater.

TAYPORT IN THE FIFE CUP

PART 2



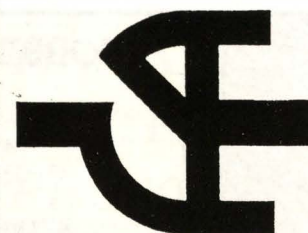
In 1969 Tayport once again entered the Fife Amateur Cup and, after receiving a first round bye, drew a corker in the second round - Cupar Hearts on East Common. Tayport, realising that they would need to strengthen their side for the first division had brought in a couple of seasoned ex-Juniors into the side that season, veteran inside forward Jim Henderson who had played in Lothians Junior football and Rab Gray, a left winger, who had been with St Andrews United.

Both had been prominent as Tayport dumped their rivals by 3-1, Henderson scoring one of the goals. There had been rumours circulating to the effect that Gray would be a protest because he was of professional status and it looked like the rumours had some substance when the recorded letter from the SFA duly arrived. Tayport went to Glasgow to fight their corner but, although they had documentation which stated that Gray had been of amateur status, he had also signed a pro form, a fact of which Tayport were unaware, so the club was duly binned from the cup.

The team was Derek White; Jim Mathers, Eddie Stewart; Ronnie Laing, Ian Bell, Richard Redpath; Doug Henderson, Jim Henderson, George Ritchie, Ian White and Rab Gray. Jimmy Foulis was sub (only one in those days). Ritchie and Laing had the other goals.

Mixed fortunes the following season, 1970/71 as Tayport continued their quest for the Fife Cup. A great start with a 6-1 win at Springfield in round 1 with goals from Jim Scott (2), George Bryson (2), Ronnie Laing and Richard Redpath.

There was a spate of bad weather because the team's next game four weeks later was the 2nd round at home to Leven Hibs. A black day with what would be the club's heaviest ever Fife Cup defeat, 1-6. Regular keeper Derek White was unavailable and John Porter came in from the Alliance XI in the following team - Porter; Frank Leslie, Eddie Stewart; Jim Scott, Jim Mathers, Ian White; Abby Oswald, Ronnie Laing, Richard Redpath, Doug Henderson, Eddie Gilmour. Sub was Ian Paterson. Laing was the goalscorer.

.....WHO'S GOING DOWN and WHO'S COMING UP?

The locals are one of the top clubs in the Scotscup League but couldn't cope with the Dundee side who, according to a local commentator, based on Saturday's performance, could hold their own in the Highland League. Kenny Cameron, now plying his trade at Thomson Park, hit a hat-trick for United who now play the winners of our tie this afternoon.

Culter, riding high in the North Premier Division, were beaten 2-1 at home by Scone Thistle. Quite a blow to the pride of the North Region, one would imagine, who must now look to Glentanar, at home to East Craigie, Turriff United, at home to Downfield and Wilson's XI, at home to Forfar West End, to salvage some of that pride when their postponed ties take place this Saturday.

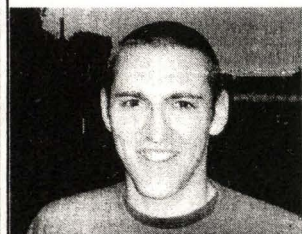
