



TODAY'S GAME REDWOOD LEISURE CUP 3rd ROUND TAYPORT v ROSYTH RECREATION

Rosyth will be visiting the Canniepairt this afternoon for the first time and will be anxious to put in a good performance. It's unlikely, however, that they will adopt a cavalier approach with their tactics more likely to be based on a sound defensive strategy.

Let's have a look at the Rosyth Squad. Keeping goal will be EWAN STENHOUSE, a young keeper signed from amateur football earlier this season. In defence Rec. can call on MARTIN RENNIE, player/coach ,signed from Bo'ness at the start of the season, MARK GIBSON, a full-back previously with Crossgates, GRANT BROUGH, who was previously with Cowdenbeath FC but returned to Rosyth from the East of Scotland League, central defenders GARETH HALL, signed last year from Haddington and SCOTT STENHOUSE, brother of keeper Ewan, and a one club man.

In midfield, BRETT HAGGETT has been two seasons at New Recreation Park after signing from Steelend Vics, KIERAN GRATTAN, signed four years ago from Glenrothes, ex-senior JAMES WATT, signed from Oakley but who previously saw service with Hibs, Rangers and Montrose. GARY WATT, a newcomer this season from Gala Fairydean, scored Rec's only goal when they went out of the OVD Cup at the first hurdle, beaten 3-1 at home by Blackburn United. Also in contention for a midfield berth is CRAIG SCOTT who was signed from Crossgates. A certain starter is the experienced JAMES MEADE.

Strikers will be selected from ex-Broxburn player MICHAEL BROWN who netted the only goal when Dalkeith progressed in the Fife & Lothians Cup earlier this season. ALAN AITKEN, ex-Hearts and Stirling Albion, who was signed this season from Sauchie, CALUM DOUGLAS, signed from Lochgelly, MARK TANNER, ex-Newburgh and Kelty and wide left player JAMES WHITELAW, the club's most recent signing, fixed up from the amateurs at the turn of the year.

Tayport will still be without Ross Gunnion and Derek Wemyss and it's unlikely Grant Buist will have recovered sufficiently from last week's injury. Mark Craib will be available and Ralph Hunter, who has been sunning himself in Spain this week, should be back in time, if only to claim a place on the bench. Brian Craik warmed the bench for 90 minutes last week and he could be on from the start today as could Gareth Dailly, another 90 minute benchwarmer.

Maryhill, Lithgae and Kilbirnie Complete The Last Eight

The last eight is complete after last Saturday's ties and there was no real surprise as Maryhill, Linlithgow and Kilbirnie made it through to join 'Port, Cumnock, Arthurlie, Bo'ness and Beith. The games were all close, however, with The Rob Roy v Kilbirnie game going to penalties after a goalless 120 minutes. Brian Miller who had missed a penalty in regulation



time made amends by slotting home Kilbirnie's decisive kick in the shoot-out.

943 was the attendance for the Maryhill v Petershill Glasgow derby. Peasies could have won it had they not missed a twice taken penalty v Maryhill's sub keeper. Shortly after the penalty, Allan Grant grabbed the winner with a spectacular overhead kick - the first goal and only goal Petershill have conceded in the competition.

At Cambuslang, the Bellshill v Linlithgow tie only went ahead after three pitch inspections, the last less than an hour before kick-off. It wasn't a pretty game by all accounts. Bellshill's chances slipped away after full back John Potter was sent off in the 56th minute for what was described as his umpteenth foul against winger Mark Corcoran. It was a foul on ex-Tayport player Corcoran which was ultimately to lead to Bellshill's downfall. Mclaughlin delivered the perfect free kick for Mark Whyte to head the only goal of the game in 65 minutes.

The quarter finals go ahead on 15th March with a 2.30pm kick-off

SUPER LEAGUE BACK ON THE AGENDA

After the fragmented programme of recent weeks, there are five Whyte & Mackay Super League games on this afternoon's card. Bathgate after two successive defeats, cannot afford a third at home to Bonnyrigg or their title chances will be all but extinguished. Hill of Beath are at inconsistent Glenrothes and will favourites to collect the points from a home side which went down to Oakley in the Redwood Leisure Cup last week.

The most attractive fixture in Dundee today is the meeting of OVD holders Linlithgow Rose and North End at North End Park. The Dokens splashed out the cash during the winter transfer window and this is the type of game on which their investment will be measured..

Edinburgh United have battled away bravely this season with little reward but got a surprise win over Bathgate in their last outing and if they can repeat that form, a win at Carnoustie is not beyond them. The crunch game, though, is at Glenesk. A point is no real good to either Violet or Oakley. A win for either will be a lifeline to Super League survival while a defeat will pretty much guarantee a drop back into a district league. Both clubs had great wins last week, so the stage is set for a cracker.

TODAY'S VISITORS ROSYTH RECREATION FC

Although the history books show there was a Junior team of this name in existence over fifty years ago, the current Rosyth Recreation are relatively new to the Junior scene, being formed in 1992. Although it was a new club, they were effectively born out of the demise of Jubilee Athletic who had played at Inverkeithing the previous season. For their debut in the Fife League, Rosyth moved to a new ground at New Recreation Park, behind what was the HMS Caledonia Naval Base Social Club.

Backed by the Caley, it was a high profile debut in the Juniors thanks to substantial funding and well known managers such as Jim Leishman, the pairing of Dick Campbell and Bert Paton before they moved to Dunfermline Athletic and Tom Hendrie, most recently with St Mirren, all being involved with the club in its early days.

That first season, the club had a best-ever league finish (5th) and reached the final of the Laidlaw Shield, only to lose to Dundonald Bluebell. But the following season, 1993/94, was to be their zenith. The league form wasn't too good (9th) but Rosyth reached three of the four Fife Region cup finals and here, they must have set something of a record - losing all three to Hill of Beath. How they must have hated the sight of big Jock Finlayson and his team!

Unfortunately, the subsequent withdrawal of funding and then the Social Club going into liquidation saw the team's fortunes similarily plummet. There's been no cup success and league finishes in the past eight years have been no better than seventh top.

The club is more or less treading water at present but there are rumours that plans are on the table to move the club forward from next season and that former Tayport player Billy Spence (pictured) could have a role to play in the new scheme of things.

It's not that the Rec. regulars haven't seen some quality players wear the Rec. colours over the years with current Scottish Internationalist Stevie Crawford, St Mirren's Billy Abercrombie and Ross County's Steve Ferguson amongst the club's former players.



MEDIA WATCH

The Evening Telegraph devotes a full page to the Juniors on Friday and Monday but not only that, but the Central Fife edition is a completely different page from that which we get in this neck of woods. Last week's Fife edition led with the Oakley v Glens Redwood tie and the Fife & Lothians Heineken tie between Thornton and Hill of Beath. The Kelty Hearts v Violet tie got a good mention and, reading between the lines, Hearts were super confident of a win, perhaps too confident as it turned out, with Violet returning a 3-0 win.

In the Dundee edition, Broughty again featured prominently, with the preview of their Premier League clash with Forfar West End being illustrated with a pic of Broughty striker Kris Ward.

In Friday's and Monday's Edinburgh Evening News, the Bellshill v Linlithgow Rose OVD 5th round tie surprisingly failed to get top billing considering that the Rosey Posey are the cup holders. However, it's probably a case of giving all the clubs a fair crack of the media exposure and sharing out the limelight.

The report of the Bellshill v Linlithgow tie found an upbeat Rose manager Jim Sinnet in confident mood "That's two years I've been with Linlithgow now and I've yet to lose a Scottish Cup tie"

Like the News, Monday's Courier gave league games top billing, relegating the Regional Cup-tie reports to the bottom of the column.

Junior reporter and Scotland team boss Jim O'Donnell was under fire again, this time for claiming in his column in the Glasgow Evening Times that Petershill's Gary McGrotty could be likened to a polaris, alluding to the regularity with which he dives apparently.

The Ayrshire Post didn't have many games to cover last weekend so led with a story on the betting for the OVD Cup, reporting that the odds on Cumnock to win the cup had been pushed out by William Hill's from 8/1 to 10/1 after drawing Tayport (3/1) in what they descibe as the tie of the round. Coral's, however, still have Cumnock at 8/1 with 'Port at 5/2. They also reported a wager of £800 at 17/10 for Petershill to beat Maryhill last Saturday.

MATCH REVIEW

Indescisive would probably be the best way to describe the Montrose Roselea defending in last weekend's NCR Trophy tie on the Canniepairt.

Other than a free kick which flashed past the post, the visitors did not threaten a home defence which had familiar faces returning to the full-back roles. Grant Paterson, following injury, and Grant Buist, following tempoary retirement, both

came back into the side, although Buist's official comeback was unfortunately curtailed by injury.

After the interval, three further goals took the tally to seven. Another own goal, a Scott Peters effort and a strike from Davie Evans, his second, completed the rout. The highlight, though, was perhaps the late miss from Evans which denied the striker his hat-trick. If ever there was a good time to spurn such an opportunity, this was it.







TAYPORT IN THE FIFE CUP PART 3

There's a gap in the records so we'll have to trawl the archives of the Fife Herald to see what we did in the Fife Cup in 1971/72 but whatever it was, it wasn't memorable so we're on to 1972/73 - and



that wasn't particularly memorable either. The team was going through something of a transition and the club needed only eight games in 1973 to complete their programme, finishing the season with one game at the beginning of April.

The Fife Cup 2nd round tie (a bye in the first round) was the last game of 1972 and, in typical fashion that season, it was a first game exit -Abbotshall 3 Tayport 2 in Kirkcaldy on 23rd December. Only the White brothers and Jim Mathers survived from the team of '71 as the following ran out at Beveridge Park. Derek White; Ian Mathers, Abby Oswald; Frank Leslie, Jim Mathers, Lindsay Ancell; Ian Howe, Walter Williamson, Andy Johnstone, Ian White and Eddie Gilmour. Walter Kemp and Stuart Grant were substitutes. Williamson and Ancell scored the two goals. Apart from the fact that two Walters turned out for the club probably for the first time, it was not an auspicious occasion.

However, it was to be Tayport's nadir as far as the Fife Cup was concerned. A first ever trip to Belgium in spring of 1973 refreshed the club and paved the way for a change of fortune.

In the first round of the 1973/74 tournament Tayport were drawn against National Steel Foundry from Leven in round 1. After holding a 3-0 half-time lead Tayport almost let it slip but scraped through by 4-3. Into the side by this time were newcomers Spider McLaren (Mr Clubsport). Ronnie Fleming (of Brown Construction) and back in the side were the likes of keeper Phil Callandar, Jim Scott, Stewart Ritchie and Doug Henderson.

Round 2 was another home tie and a crushing 5-0 home win over Eastbank AAC. Two own goals, Raymond White(2) and Doug Henderson were the scorers. A substitute that day was Gordon Hughes who was to make his mark with the club over the next few years. Making his one and only first team appearance for the club that afternoon was the colourful goalkeeper and Partick Thistle fan, student Alex Houston.

Next Week - past New Year for the first time and a meeting with the then mighty Star Hearts.
