The Bluebells arrive here on the back of a 7-1 Findlay Cup thumping of Harp in the Lochee derby last Saturday, so confidence will be high. They started that match in blistering fashion and were two goals up inside the opening couple of minutes.

Among the goals were ex Port players Jackie Devine and Kenny Cameron, two players whose performances here in the past have brought cheer to the local support. Two other combatants today, Jackie Thomson and John Ward, have also turned out in the colours of both clubs.

United have not disguised their ambition to play Super League football and the Thomson Park committee has put their faith in manager Eddie Wolecki and his backroom team to deliver the goods. There is little doubt that Eddie, who was a coach at Arbroath under Dave Baikie, will see today's game as a measure of how his team building plans have progressed.

Ross Kiddie, signed from Forfar West End at the start of this season, has rewarded Wolecki's judgement with a barrowload of goals already. Another shrewd acquisition this term has been Iain Macleod who, along with Cameron, was prominent in Carnoustie's run to the final of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup in 2001.

Tayport will find the free scoring Lochee side a stiff test in advance of next week's OVD tie at Cumnock. Lochee, of course, played down at Cumnock earlier this season and performed creditably before going down 2-0 in a third round tie.

Dave Baikie has been mixing his pool in recent games and it's likely that he will continue with that policy this afternoon. Ross Gunnion and Grant Buist missed out last week through injury and Ralph Hunter also missed out, having just returned from holiday. Mark Craib made his first start since being injured in October and will be anxious to stake a claim for a regular spot.

Today's tie has to be played to a finish with extra time and penalties if required.

FOUR FIGURE ATTENDANCE ANTICIPATED AT CUMNOCK NEXT WEEK

Cumnock v Tayport in the quarter finals of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup next Saturday has been billed as the match of the day and, according to reports from the south west, an attendance of up to 1,500 is a possibility.

Cumnock's odds have been cut to 8/1 with William Hill's after a lot of cash had flooded on to the Ayrshire club to win the Cup, including a three figure bet placed at 10/1. Tayport are now out to 7/2 with Hill's with Linlithgow now favourites at 3/1.

Cumnock surprisingly went down 4-2 at Shettleston last week in the West of Scotland Cup, but the feeling is they had an eye on the big one next week.

Apart from an opening day league cup defeat by local rivals Auchinleck, Cumnock have lost only once at Townhead Park in seven months and a glance at the statistics elsewhere in the programme confirms that they have done consistently well in the OVD Cup over the last ten years although they have never progressed beyond the quarter finals during this period.

This is the fourth meeting of the sides in the Scottish Cup. Tayport won 2-0 at Tayport in a third round tie in 1991/92, 4-1 for Tayport at Cumnock in the fourth round in 1992/93 and it was 2-1 for Tayport in the fourth round at Townhead Park in 1997/98.

Kick-off next week is at 2.30pm. Brief highlights of the four quarter finals will be screened on Scotsport on Sunday afternoon.

A quick look at the other quarter finals.

Arthurlie v Bo'ness. Another big attendance at Dunterlie for the visit of dark horses Bo'ness whose window signings have given their chances a boost. The Barrhead side cruised home at Bonnyrigg and will be daunting opponents on their own midden.

Linlithgow see their name on the cup again and memories of last May will see the attendance against **Beith** boosted in anticipation of another march to the final. However although Beith cannot be underestimated anything other than a home win would be a major upset.

Maryhill v Kilbirnie is almost too close to call but 'Hill manager Neil Watt is a clever operator and he could just steal a march over his counterpart George Walker whose side was far from impressive in seeing off the challenge of Rob Roy in the last round.





This season's run extended to a score of matches courtesy of last Saturday's win against Rosyth Recreation in the Fife and Tayside Redwood Leisure Cup.


'Port were ahead inside a minute, through the irrepressible John Ward, with Davie Evans doubling the lead around the quarter-hour mark.

This latest dismissal. like so many of the others, was borne out of sheer frustration. It is not, however, because opponents have been ordered off that Tayport are winning games so convincingly. 
LEGENDS

TAYPORT IN THE FIFE CUP PART 4



1973/74 saw Tayport Amateurs' interest in the Fife Cup extend beyond Christmas for the first time and on 19th January 1974 one of the best attendances for a number of years was attracted

to the visit of one of Fife's top amateur sides, Star Hearts, to the East Common in round 3. The improved form was maintained when Tayport forced a 0-0 draw. Making his last appearance for the first team was the veteran wing half Maurice Flynn, who was listed as substitute. Tayport's team was Phil Callandar; Ian Mathers, Graham McLaren, Ronnie Fleming, Frank Leslie; Lindsay Ancell, Jim Scott: Stewart Ritchie, Ian Howe, Raymond White, Doug Henderson; Abby Oswald, Maurice Flynn.

Two weeks later Tayport travelled to Star of Markinch for the replay but made their exit from the Cup, going down 2-1. Only change was Brian Burchell for Flynn. White scored the goal.

The following season, the club's impact on the competition was sustained with a six game run, only coming to an end in the 4th round on 15 March 1975, beaten 1-0 at home by Star Hearts who eight weeks later would lift the Scottish Amateur Cup.

The first round 'Port were held 1-1 at home by the quaintly named Boglily Bluebell from the Kirkcaldy League but triumphed 3-1 in the replay, Gordon Hughes hitting two goals and Ian Howe the other. Stuart Davie, a current regular at Canniepairt, made a scoring debut in the 2nd round, a 5-0 home win over Kirkcaldy YMCA. Also making cup debuts were the late George Taylor and current Dundee Contract Services gaffer Peter Wilson.

The 3rd round draw paired Tayport with local rivals Cupar Hearts at Duffus Park where Keith Ritchie became another scoring debutant in a 2-2 draw. In a tense affair on East Common, a Spider McLaren goal gave Tayport a 1-0 win.

Then came the defeat by Star Hearts to dash the cup hopes for another season. Still, there was another visit to Belgium to look forward to in 4 weeks time. The team that went down to Star was: Phil Callandar; George Taylor, Peter Wilson, Ian Mathers, Frank Feechan; Doug Henderson, Jim Scott, Dave Henderson (Ian Rae); Frank Leslie, Ian Howe, Gordon Hughes; Abby Oswald.

Next issue - 1975/76 and the final breakthrough

MEDIA WATCH

After all the hoo-hah emanating from south of the Forth last season on reconstruction and the general reticence to join the Super League, it's refreshing to note the change of heart from the Lothians - if last Friday's Edinburgh Evening News is anything to go by. The main article on the Junior page was an interview with Sauchie boss Willie Irvine prior to his side's win at Whitburn which took them to the top of the table. The article contained comments such as 'much coveted spot among next season's elite Junior clubs' and quoted Willie as saying "A place in the Super League is a great prize because it has proved to be great for the game, and we, like most clubs, want to be there".

In Friday's Evening Telegraph, the Blether with Brown page's leading article was on Tayport FC - amateurs and juniors - supported by a photograph from the 1981/82 season.

Saturday's *Courier* continues to give good coverage to the Super League. Carnoustie boss Tom Van Der Ham reckoned the Gowfers' game v Edinburgh was a must win affair, so he'd be disappointed after a 1-1 draw. Not so Jock Finlayson. Jock reckoned that, "with Tayport otherwise engaged, it was a good chance to close the gap on them". Jock got his wishes with a 2-1 win at Glenrothes.

Monday's Courier (Fife edition) covered the Fife District League clubs and led with "It's all going sour for Kelty", pointing out that in losing their last three successive games they had crashed out of the three major cups - Scottish, Fife/Tayside and, on Saturday, the Fife and Lothians Cup after losing to Armadale on penalties. Rosyth's chances at Tayport hadn't been helped by the resignation of their manager on Friday night but secretary Charlie Crawford remarked "The gulf in quality was there for all to see".

In Monday's Sun reporter Scott Campbell covered the Bathgate Bonnyrigg 0-0 Super League draw with both managers commenting on the fact that a draw was of little use to either side. 

This Ticket MUST be shown at the Entrance for which it is available and is not transferable. Rules and Instructions.

I.—Players must at all times keep themselves in fit and proper condition, and must turn up to play and train at the times notified.

2.—Players are always subject to the special instructions of the Trainer. From the date of training, players whose time is wholly engaged by the Club, must attend at the Ground for training at 10 a.m. each day, and in the afternoons when specially required, unless excused by the Trainer.

3.—Players engaged in business during the day must attend training on Tuesday and Thursday evenings (or oftener if required), as early as possible, unless excused by the Trainer.

Players must not attend Dance Halls after Monday evening, except with special permission of the Trainer.

4.—The Club Doctor is Dr. A. R. Wood, "Ravenswood," Garstang Road, Preston, who can be seen at the above address from 8-30 a.m. to 9-30 a.m.; 2 p.m. to 3 p.m.; and 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. In cases of illness or accident, players must consult the Club Doctor exclusively.

5.—Players getting minor injuries

Trainer immediately, and, if necessary, may be required to attend the Ground for treatment on Sunday or Monday.

6.—Training shall mean all work desired by the Trainer, also all instructional work on the field of play or elsewhere as desired by the Coach appointed. It is a special instruction to all players to faithfully carry out all ball practice, &c., required by the Coach.

7.—Players will be provided with the necessary outfits for playing and training such outfits to be the property of the Club, and not to be taken away, except with the consent, in writing, of the Trainer). Match jerseys must not be used for training purposes. Players must see that their boots are in proper condition, and if requiring attention, Immediately report same to Trainers.

8.—Players will not be allowed to bring friends into the Home Dressing Room either during practice or on match days under any circumstances whatever. The Trainer has strict instructions and is held responsible for carrying out this Rule.

9.—On match days all players must report to the Trainer in charge forty-five minutes before time of kick-off, and be at the

Changes of address should be immediately notified to the Secretary.

13.—Players must not attend any Greyhound Racing Track on the evening prior to any match day.

14.—Smoking is strictly prohibited during training hours, and on the outward journeys for away matches.

18.—RECREATION ROOM. The attention of all Players is called to the care of this room, and offenders will be dealt with accordingly for any damage that may be caused.

19.—The Player agrees that he will not without the written permission of the Club grant interviews to nor write articles for or disseminate any information (acquired in the course of his employment by the Club) to newspapers or other publications nor take part in television or radio programmes.

20.—As the Trainers are held responsible for the carrying out of these Rules, they must report any breach of same.

21.—Any infringement of the foregoing bye-laws and breaches of discipline will be met by suspension of all wages for a period according to the gravity of the case.

22.—These rules and instructions are subject to any alterations the Directors may from time to time deem necessary, and due notice of any such alterations will be announced upon the Players' Notice Roard.


